


BADGES OF THE OLYMPIC GAMES

The first badges were issued in cardboard for the first modern Olympic Games in Athens 1896. Paris 1900 and St. Louis 1904 issued no badges for the Olympic Games, but the Intermediary Games in 1906 and the badges from London 1908 continued the tradition until it ended with the Sarajevo 1984 Winter badges. They were replaced by laminated photo identity cards worn with a cord or chain around the neck. They made their introduction at the Moscow 1980 Games and again were used from Los Angeles 1984 onwards.
