304. **Los Angeles 1984. Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 60mm, by Dugald Stermer. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Unawarded. With tricolor ribbon. EF. **(\$6,000)**
305. **Horse Race Winner's Badge.** Circular blue-white-red center with white leather round showing Olympic rings over "1984". With long white-red-blue ribbon. Very rare. EF. **(\$750)**
306. **Los Angeles 1984. Official Blessing Artist Herald Trumpet Used in the Opening Ceremony of the XXIIIrd Olympiad.** The Opening Ceremony was held at Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum Stadium on July 28, 1984. One of 126 serially numbered trumpets with banner, 40.6x76.2cm (16"x30"). As made. In large original black carrying case. EF. **(\$3,000)**

307. **Los Angeles 1984. Official Torch with Pouch.** aluminum with tan leather handle, length 56.5cm (22.4"). Bowl portrays Olympic rings, motto and L.A. Memorial Coliseum Stadium. *Flame lit in Olympia, Greece on May 7, 1984, and it arrived in New York the following day. It took 82 days to carry the flame through 33 states, 9,375 miles, to Los Angeles.* EF, in original black leather pouch, with stand. **(\$3,000)**
309. **Los Angeles 1984. Security Lamp Used During the Torch Relay.** Goldplated brass, with glass window, 23.5cm (9.3") tall, made by Koehler Company. "FLAME SAFETY LAMP" on top. *Used in the transcontinental torch relay.* With patina, VF-EF. **(\$2,800)**
310. **Los Angeles 1984. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by D. Sterner. Olympic torch head within legend. Rev. Los Angeles Olympic emblem over Olympic rings and laurel branches. EF. **(\$200)**
311. **Los Angeles 1984. Bahamas NOC Pin.** Blue and yellow, 12x22mm. And **Pair of Papua New Guinea Pins.** White, gold and red, 32x18mm. All EF. (3 pcs.) **(\$120)**
312. **Los Angeles 1984. Indonesia Team Pin.** Multicolor enamel, 26mm. EF. **(\$80)**

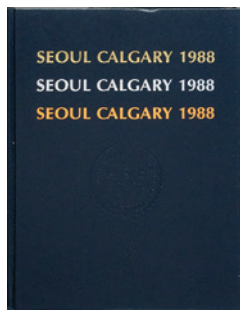

320. **Calgary 1988 Winter. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 69mm, made by Jostens, Toronto. Joint Indian heads left, headdress consisting of winter sports equipment: skis, bobsled, luge, hockey stick etc. Rev. Calgary logo surrounded by Games legend in French and English. With long ribbon, housed in blue velvet presentation case, gray velvet inside. EF. **(\$9,000)**
321. **Calgary 1988 Winter. Gold Winner's Medal Awarded for Demonstration Events.** Goldplated copper, 62mm. Calgary logo. Rev. Depiction of demonstration sports. EF. **(\$2,600)**
322. **Calgary 1988 Winter. XIV Hockey Tournament at the Leningrad Skaya Pravda Stadium, 1988. Second Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 60mm. Hockey stick and puck. Rev. View of Leningrad. EF. **(\$140)**
323. **Calgary 1988 Winter. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 64mm, designed by Cornelius Martens, struck by Jostens, Inc. Calgary Olympic emblem. Rev. View of Olympic stadium and Calgary. Partially discolored on back, EF/VF-EF. **(\$140)**
324. **Calgary 1988 Winter. Pair of NOC and Press Badges.** Gilt, 30x45mm. With green NOC ribbon, and yellow-black-yellow Press ribbon. Both EF. (2 pcs.) **(\$100)**

330. **Seoul 1988. Official Visitors Medal.** Bronze, 8-sided 65mm. Ancient warrior on horseback over Olympic Rings and legend. Rev. Signatures of IOC President and Seoul OC President, view of stadium below. EF. **(\$80)**
331. **331. Seoul 1988. Steffi Graf Medal in Silver Commemorating her Tennis Gold Medal.** Silver, 35mm. Bust of smiling gold medal winner in Seoul, "Graf Pro Olympia" legend. Rev. Logo surrounded by "Tennis is Olympic again!" (translated). EF. **(\$60)**
332. **Seoul 1988. Mascot Hodori.** Orange and white plush, 26cm (10.2") tall. Hodori waving, with gold-colored Olympic Rings chain and black hat. EF. **(\$120)**

- ALBERTVILLE, 16TH OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1992**
333. **Albertville 1992 Winter. Official Torch.** Steel, 42cm (16.5") up to 8cm (3.2") wide, designed by famous French designer Philippe Starck. The torch, when turned over, has the shape of a flame. The flame was lit in Olympia on November 27, 1991, when the relay through Greece started. It left Greece on December 8 on the Concorde to visit about 70 countries and islands worldwide, to arrive in Paris on December 14. 5,500 torchbearers carried the flame 5,536 km (3,440 miles) around France to Albertville where the cauldron was lit at the opening ceremony on February 8, 1992, by Michel Platini and Francoise-Cyrille Grange, a Savoyard girl. One of only 130 torches. Numbered. EF. **(\$55,000)**
334. **Magique, Mascot of the Albertville Winter Olympic Games.** Multicolor plush, 28cm (11"). Smiling Magique dressed in blue suit with red-blue-white stripe with outstretched arms. EF. **(\$100)**
- BARCELONA, 25th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1992**
335. **Barcelona 1992. Official Torch.** Chrome-plated aluminum, 65cm (23.6"), designed by André Rich. "XXV Olympiad Barcelona 1992" legend and goldplated Barcelona emblem. Leather part at bottom Fine, as usual, otherwise EF. **(\$2,400)**
- LILLEHAMMER, 17th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1994**
336. **Lillehammer 1994 Winter. Official Torch.** Birchwood handle, 153cm (60") long, designed by A. Marandon and P.J. Kahrs. The upper part is cast aluminum with 5 wicks for lighting the torch with paraffin. One of only 300 torches, rarely seen, and the largest of all Olympic torches. Unusual, EF. **(\$15,000)**
337. **Lillehammer 1994 Winter. Participation Medal.** Copper, 66x76mm, designed by Morten Kleppan. Lillehammer logo and rings, pictograms of sporting events in background. Rev. Sporting pictograms and ice crystals. In wooden box with silver logo on top. Medal dark toning, EF. **(\$200)**
338. **Lillehammer 1994 Winter. Trio of 3 Russian NOC Identity Cards "E".** 10.5x12.7cm (4.1"x5") each. With chains. Plus **Lake Placid 1980 Winter.** Identity Card "G" of Roman Kiselev. All EF. (4 pcs.) **(\$100)**
339. **Lillehammer 1994 Winter. Group of Cross-Country Full Tickets, Birkebeiner Ski Stadium.** 15km Free Technique Women, February 13, 3 tickets. 10km, men and women, February 17; and 4x5km relay women, February 21 (2 tickets). All EF. (6 tickets) **(\$120)**
