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**TERMS OF SALE**  
**(Please read carefully before bidding.)**

The auction will be conducted in accordance with the terms set forth below. Bidding in the sale constitutes acceptance of all terms stated herein.

**(1) BIDDING.** The auction will be online on our auction platform [auctions.ioneil.com](http://auctions.ioneil.com). The auction will start to close at 8 pm Pacific Time on Saturday May 9, 2026. See insert or [www.ioneil.com/auction\\_info.pdf](http://www.ioneil.com/auction_info.pdf) for details on how lots will close. Lots still open after 8 pm may re-sort by time remaining online – use “Sort By” to refresh. We also accept bids by email, phone, mail and fax (by fax: please follow up by phone or email to confirm that bids were received). All bids by email will be acknowledged. E-mail bids which have not been acknowledged have not been received. Phone bids must be confirmed in writing upon request. Starting prices are shown in the online auction at [auctions.ioneil.com](http://auctions.ioneil.com). Bids will be increased per the increment table on our auction platform. If you enter a maximum bid (your highest), the bidding will be incremented as needed to win the lot, up to your maximum bid. Bids must be for an entire lot. Auctioneer reserves the right to extend bidding.

**Bids under starting bid will not be accepted.** Bids must be for an entire lot. Bids will be accepted by lot number only. Each lot constitutes a separate sale.

All customers wanting to place bids in the auction must register first. New customers unknown to us and wanting to participate in the online auction must register at the website at least 1 day before the auction.

**(2) MODIFICATION.** The catalog is incorporated in and deemed a part of these Terms of Sale. Auctioneer has the absolute right to modify the terms of sale at any time. Bidding after notification of modification constitutes acceptance of modification. Auctioneer has the absolute right to conduct the auction as auctioneer may decide, including the right to decline bids for any reason and from any person, to decline challenges to bids or bidding increments and to make the final determination of all disputes by any method auctioneer deems appropriate. No bidder shall have a claim or recourse against auctioneer for loss or damage due to modification, auctioneer mistake, departure from stated terms of sale, method of dispute resolution or result thereof.

**(3) GUARANTY.** By bidding in the sale, bidder accepts all terms stated herein and personally guarantees timely and complete payment and performance of all obligations stated herein. Auctioneer is not responsible for bidding errors. Successful bidders are unconditionally bound to perform all obligations hereunder regardless of mistake. Bidding by minors and undisclosed agents is prohibited. Bidding constitutes a representation and warranty that bidder is of legal age and acting on his or her own behalf with full power and authority to make the bid placed and to legally bind bidder to all terms of sale.

**(4) PRICE. Payment in full is due upon receipt of invoice.** A 20% Buyer's Fee will be added to the successful bid price of each lot. Handling, shipping, sales tax for California residents, insurance, and all other costs associated with shipping will be added to the invoice. A handling charge per lot may be added to bulky lots (books, large plates, sculptures, etc.) California sales tax will be added to the invoice of California residents unless a valid resale number is on file with the auctioneer; however, buyer is solely responsible for and agrees to pay all sales or other applicable tax due by virtue of the sale and shall indemnify and hold auctioneer harmless therefore, including penalties or interest assessed, regardless of whether or not taxes were included on the invoice or correctly calculated by the auctioneer.

**(5) PAYMENT.** Payment must be in U.S. funds payable by check drawn on a U.S. bank or by wire transfer to auctioneer's account, by credit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express) or Paypal. Wiring instructions should be requested from auctioneer before funds are wired. A 3.5% convenience charge (4% for overseas purchases) will be added to credit card or Paypal purchases except where prohibited by law. Bidders may be asked for satisfactory credit references or a deposit of funds prior to bidding.

**(6) DEFAULT.** If buyer fails to make payment in full within 30 days of the invoice date or to timely comply with any other term of sale, then, in addition to all other remedies available at law or in equity, auctioneer may, at auctioneer's option: (a) charge 1.5% monthly interest on unpaid amounts; (b) if payment is not received in a timely manner, auctioneer may resell the lot(s) and recover from buyer the difference between the proceeds and buyer's indebtedness in excess of the proceeds, which indebtedness shall include the successful bid price, Buyer's Fee and all other expenses incurred by auctioneer from the date of sale until resale on accounts of such lot(s), including attorney fees, transportation, handling, storage, insurance, collection and resale costs. Proceeds collected in excess of buyer's indebtedness shall belong to auctioneer; (c) pursue collection efforts and/or recover from buyer all costs incurred by auctioneer as a result of buyer's default from date of default, including attorney fees, transportation, handling, storage and insurance costs; and (d) sue for damages. Amounts charged hereunder are immediately due and payable. Buyer waives all requirements of notice, advertisement, bidding rights, rights to proceeds and all other rights with respect to the sale of a lot purchased by buyer except as prohibited by law. Auctioneer's rights and remedies stated in this section and elsewhere in this agreement are cumulative and the exercise of one shall not operate to the exclusion of another.

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**(9) CLAIMS.** The sole basis for a claim against auctioneer is the lack of authenticity of a purchased item. Buyer is solely responsible for determining authenticity without reliance on statements or acts of auctioneer. Authenticity claims must be made in writing and submitted to auctioneer no later than 5 days after delivery of such item. Authenticity claims are not permitted outside of warranty period except as may be permitted by auctioneer. Acceptance of a claim does not constitute an admission. If auctioneer disputes a claim, the final determination of authenticity shall be made by a qualified authenticator selected by buyer and auctioneer. Costs of authentication will be borne by buyer. If a claim is accepted or an item determined to be not authentic, buyer's exclusive remedy is a refund of the successful bid price and Buyer's Fee, payable upon delivery of the item to auctioneer in accordance with the conditions of return set forth below, except as may otherwise be agreed by auctioneer and buyer in writing.

**(10) RETURNS.** Auctioneer shall not be liable for any item returned without auctioneer's prior written approval. Items must be returned in their original container and in the same condition as sold to buyer in the manner and at the time specified by auctioneer in writing. Late remittance, removal from the original container or return in a condition other than as sold to buyer constitutes just cause for revocation of all return rights, based on warranty or otherwise, and buyer shall have no further rights or remedies under this agreement, at law or in equity. Refunds will not be made until items have been received and inspected to auctioneer's satisfaction. Refunds are conditioned upon buyer's execution prior to payment of any documents requested by auctioneer to effect the intent of this paragraph.

**(11) BIDDER'S RELEASE. THE TERM BIDDER AS USED IN THIS RELEASE REFERS TO BIDDERS AND BUYERS ALIKE. EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY PROVIDED HEREIN, BIDDING IN THE SALE CONSTITUTES AN UNCONDITIONAL RELEASE BY BIDDER OF AUCTIONEER AND AUCTIONEER'S AFFILIATES, SUBSIDIARIES, SUCCESSORS, MEMBERS, MANAGERS, EMPLOYEES AND AGENTS AND THEIR HEIRS, LEGAL REPRESENTATIVES AND ASSIGNS (COLLECTIVELY, "AUCTIONEER'S AFFILIATES"), FROM ALL CLAIMS, DEMANDS, SUITS, ACTIONS, OBLIGATIONS, LIABILITIES, LOSSES AND DAMAGES OF ANY KIND OR NATURE WHATSOEVER, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO SPECIAL, INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, INDIRECT OR SIMILAR DAMAGES (COLLECTIVELY "CLAIMS"), ARISING OUT OF OR RELATING TO, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, THE AUCTION, THESE TERMS OF SALE OR MODIFICATION THEREOF, THE BIDDING PROCESS, DENIAL OF BID, TITLE, CONDITION, QUALITY OR DESCRIPTION OF ANY LOT OR AUCTIONEER OR AUCTIONEER'S AFFILIATES' NEGLIGENCE, GROSS NEGLIGENCE, MISTAKE, MISREPRESENTATION, BREACH OF CONTRACT, BREACH OF WARRANTY OR ANY OTHER ACT OR OMISSION WHETHER SOUNDING IN CONTRACT, TORT, IN EQUITY OR OTHERWISE. BIDDER AGREES AND INTENDS THIS RELEASE TO BE EXTENDED TO AND BE EFFECTIVE AS TO ALL CLAIMS WITHOUT RESERVATION, WHETHER ARISING NOW OR IN THE FUTURE AND REGARDLESS OF WHETHER BIDDER LATER OBTAINS KNOWLEDGE WHICH WOULD HAVE MATERIALLY AFFECTED BIDDER'S DECISION TO GIVE THIS RELEASE, AND BIDDER KNOWINGLY AND VOLUNTARILY WAIVES ALL RIGHTS AND REMEDIES WHICH MAY OTHERWISE BE CONFERRED ON BIDDER BY LAW.**

**(12) CLAIMS.** Claims for reasons other than lack of authenticity may, in some instances, be considered by auctioneer, at auctioneer's sole discretion. Any such claim must be submitted to auctioneer in writing within 5 days after delivery of the item, which is the basis of the claim to buyer. Auctioneer may, at auctioneer's option, offer a remedy to buyer but in no event shall buyer have any entitlement or right to any remedy from auctioneer unless stated in a writing signed by auctioneer and buyer.

**(13) GOVERNING LAW; MISCELLANEOUS.** Actions to enforce or interpret or relating to these Terms of Sale shall be construed in accordance with California law, without regard to conflicts of law rules. Exclusive venue shall lie in Newport Beach, California. These Terms of Sale and all rights hereunder may not be assigned, transferred, or relied upon by third parties. The term "buyer" means the original buyer of goods from auctioneer, not any subsequent owner or person who may acquire an interest therein. If any term of this agreement or application thereof shall be deemed unenforceable, the remainder of this agreement and the application of such term to persons or circumstances other than those to which the term is unenforceable shall remain enforceable to the fullest extent. Time is of the essence in all particulars. Notice is given upon delivery by e-mail or telephone or 3 days after placement in the U.S. mail. As used herein, the term "person" includes an individual, sole proprietorship, partnership, joint venture, trust, corporation, limited liability company, association and any other entity. Captions shall not be used to construe the scope or intent of any term. The waiver of breach of any term shall not constitute a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other term. ### ATHENS 1870. SECOND GREEK OLYMPIC GAMES

1. **Athens 1870. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 37mm, by Albert Desiré Barre. Head right of King George. Rev. Greek legend in open wreath (translated): "Olympia/ in Athens/1870/Class B'space", above "Consecrator of Games Evangelis Zappas". *Since 1859 Greece tried to revive the ancient Olympic Games when in that year the first national Greek Olympic Games were held in Athens.* Abt. EF. **(\$2,000)**
2. **Athens 1870. Second National Greek Olympic Games Copper Winner's Medal.** Copper, 41mm, by Jacques-Jean Barre. Bust right of King George (1863-1913) surrounded by Greek legend. Rev. "Olympia in Athens 1870" surrounded by "Consecrator of Games Evangelis Zappas" (translated from Greek) and open olive wreath. Toned Unc, in round presentation case. Toned EF. **(\$1,400)**

### ATHENS, 1st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1896

3. **Athens 1896. Spyridon Louis Signature on a Postcard of the Monument of Philopappe,** 9.2x14.3cm. EF. **(\$100)**
4. **James B. Connelly Ink Signature on a 1940 First Day of Issue Envelope,** April 14, 1940, 9am, Washington D.C. Envelope 16.5x9.5cm. Signature between 50th Anniversary of the Pan-American Union and Four 3 Cent Stamps. Connelly was the first Olympic medal winner in Athens 1896. EF. **(\$100)**

### PARIS, 2nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1900

*The 1900 Paris Olympic Games were held in conjunction with the World's Exposition. They played only a minor role. There were athletes who didn't know that the events they participated in were Olympic Games events. Few items relate directly to the Games. For this reason, we are also offering items commemorating the World Exposition.*

5. **Paris 1900. Physical Education Plaque Offered by the Minister of Sports.** Silvered bronze, 41x59mm, by Frédéric de Vernon. Victorious athlete on podium holding laurel branch, Acropolis in background. Rev. 4-line legend over olive branch. Toned EF. **(\$400)**
6. **Paris 1900. Bronze Award Plaque Presented by the Minister of Education.** Bronze, 41x59mm, by Frédéric de Vernon. Victorious athlete on podium, Acropolis in distance. Rev. 5-line legend: "Offert/Par le Ministre/De/ l'Instruction/ Publique". Toned EF. **(\$300)**
- 6a. **Paris 1900. Physical Sports and Exercises Plaque.** Silverplated bronze, 41x59mm, by Frédéric de Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed in 2 lines. EF. **(\$700)**
7. **Paris 1900. Olympic Games Bronze Award Plaque Presented by the Minister of Sports.** 41x59mm, by Frédéric de Vernon. Victorious athlete on podium. Rev. 5-line legend. Toned EF, spot on obverse. **(\$260)**
8. **Paris 1900. Two Tickets for Renting a Chair** on the Left Side of the Seine for 10 Centimes During the Exposition. 3.5x6.5cm each. Punchholed, VF and VF+. (2 pcs.) **(\$60)**

- ST. LOUIS, 3rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1904**  
*The 1904 Olympic Games in St. Louis were also held in conjunction with a World's Fair. This, again, detracted a lot from the importance of the Games. Few items are available that relate directly to the Olympiad, and they usually command very high prices. For this reason, we are also offering some memorabilia from the World's Fair which celebrated the Centennial of the Louisiana Purchase from Napoleon in 1803.*
9. **St. Louis 1904. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for 880 Yard Race** to Milton A. Hellman at the Olympic Interscholastic Meet of the State of Missouri in St. Louis, May 14, 1904. Sterling silver, 32mm, by Mermod & Jacard. AAU logo above Meet information and Missouri State emblem, in open olive wreath. Rev. 3-line engraved award legend "880 Yd. Run/Won by/M.A. Hellman". Suspended from bar with "1904/Universal/Exhibition/Olympic Games/St. Louis". *One of 4 medals won by Hellman in Athletics in St. Louis 1904. All athletic events in St. Louis were Olympic events: Mallon, The 1904 Olympic Games, page 89.* EF. **(\$3,000)**
10. **St. Louis 1904. Turner's (Gymnastics) International Contest. 26th Prize for Apparatus & Field Work Won by L. Spann.** Bronze with partially green color and enameled center, 28mm. Legend at top bar "1904/Universal Exposition/Olympic Games/St. Louis". First time appearance of this kind of badge. Toned EF. **(\$500)**
11. **St. Louis 1904. Award Plaque for the French Committee of Overseas Expositions under the Patronage of the State.** Bronze, 61x73mm, by Bottée. French Republic seated in boat showing Progress the St. Louis exposition site. Rev. Legend beside tree. Toned EF. **(\$160)**

12. **St. Louis 1904. Official Silver Souvenir Medal.** Silvered bronze, 34mm. Conjoined busts left of Napoleon and Jefferson. Rev. Map of the United States with Louisiana Territory purchased in 1803 from Napoleon who needed funds for his war in Europe. EF. **(\$200)**
13. **St. Louis 1904. World's Fair Medal.** Bronze, 40mm, by Holy Bros. Louisiana Purchase 1803 between Napoleon and Jefferson. Rev. View of Announcement of the World's Fair. With ring at top. Toned EF. **(\$120)**
14. **St. Louis 1904. Adult's and Child's Ticket to the Exposition.** 7.5x3cm, and 7.5x4cm. Child's ticket with 2 punchholes. **Full Ticket for One Admission at Pay Gate** between July 15th and December 1st, 1904. Yellow, 15x5cm. Plus **2 Press Tickets**, No. 7589 and 7590. 19x5.5cm each, still in ticket booklet All EF. (6 pcs.) **(\$200)**

- ATHENS, INTERMEDIATE OLYMPIC GAMES, 1906**
15. **Athens 1906. Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 50mm, by Jules Clement Chaplain, struck at the Paris Mint. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch standing on globe. Rev. View of the Acropolis with the Parthenon on top, between Greek legend "International Olympic Games in Athens, 1906". *Same design as the 1896 winners medal, only the date changed. While in 1896 only a silver and bronze medal were awarded for the first two places, in 1906 the Committee awarded gold, silver and bronze medals.* Housed in its red round cardboard box, light wear, medal EF. **(\$8,500)**

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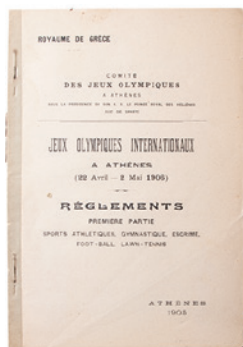
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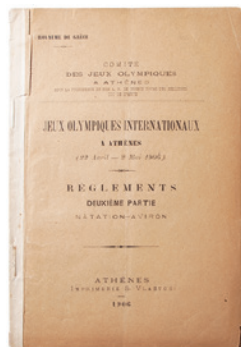
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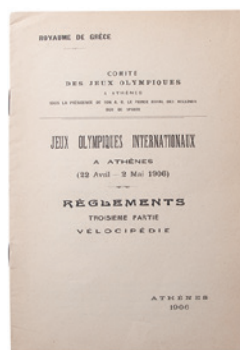
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- 15a. **Athens 1906. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 50mm, by Jules Clement Chaplain, struck at the Paris Mint. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch, standing on globe. Rev. View of the Acropolis with the Parthenon on top, between Greek legend "International Olympic Games in Athens, 1906". Same design as the 1896 winners medal, only the date changed. While in 1896 only a silver and bronze medal were awarded for the first two places, in 1906 the Committee awarded gold, silver and bronze medals. Lightly toned EF. **(\$6,000)**
16. **Athens 1906. Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 50mm, by Nikolaos Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath over phoenix emerging from flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. Greek legend in wreath. Presented to high dignitaries. Goldplating worn on highpoints, VF-EF. **(\$1,000)**
17. **Athens 1906. American Olympic Committee Member's Badge.** Gilt and green, 32x44mm, by Dieges & Clust, New York. Greek and U.S. shield over "MEMBER" and A.A.U. logo, "Olympic Games/Held at Athens Greece/1906" legend. Two prongs on rev. One of the earliest NOC badges. Rare. EF. **(\$1,000)**
18. **Athens 1906. Commemorative Winner's Plaque.** Bronze, 50x70mm, by Paul Felix Vannier. Winner over crowded Athens Olympic stadium, Acropolis at l. Rev. Fame flying over laurel tree, Greek temple at right EF. **(\$220)**
19. **Athens 1906. Commemorative Victory and Olympic Stadium Medal.** Bronze, 24mm, by N. Nisiotis. Winged Nike, Goddess of Victory. Rev. View of Olympic stadium, Parthenon at left. Toned abt. EF. **(\$160)**

20. **Athens 1906. Winner's Medal for Greco-Roman Wrestling: V. Weckman, Finland, Middleweight; S.M. Jensen, Denmark, Super Heavyweight and All-Around.** Silvered copper, 24mm, by N. Nisiotis. Winged Nike, Goddess of Victory. Rev. Two wrestlers, names of winners below. With loop and ring. Small spots obverse, toned abt. EF. **(\$140)**

31. **Stockholm 1912. Official Visitor's Badge.** Hallmarked silver, 22x26mm. Nude flagbearers, legend below. EF. (\$160)

32. **Stockholm 1912. Olympic Games Pin.** Silvered, 20mm, by Heimbigger. Five rings behind athlete, "Olympiske Lege" (=Olympic Games) legend. VF-EF. (\$50)

#### SOCHI, 22nd OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2014

369. **Sochi 2014 Winter. Official Torch.** Aluminum and polymer, partially red, 95cm (37.4") high, 14.5cm (5.7") wide, designed by Vladimir Pirozhkov and Andrei Vodyanik. The design of the torch reminds of the feather of the Firebird, a magical bird in Russian folklore. *The fire was lit on September 29, 2013 in Olympia; the torch relay started in Russia on October 7, reached the North Pole on October 20, was flown into space by a Soyuz rocket, reached Europe's highest mountain (Mount Elbrus) and the world's deepest lake (Lake Baikal). It ended at the opening ceremony on February 7, 2014, in Sochi.* EF. **(\$2,000)**

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**RIO de JANEIRO, 31st OLYMPIC GAMES, 2016**

370. **Rio De Janeiro 2016. Official Torch.** Recycled aluminum and resin, 69 cm (27”) high. The colorful layers reflect the Ground (like the Copacabana Promenade), the Sea (blue ocean ripples), the Mountains (green natural beauty surrounding Rio), and the Sky at the top with the yellow sun (the flame). **BEIJING, 24TH OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2022**

375. **Beijing 2022 Winter. Official Torch.** Red and silver colored, (fire and ice), 82cm (32.3”), designed by the Lenovo Team. The torch is named “Flying”, and the spiral design makes it look like a ribbon fluttering in the wind. The red and silver colors stand for fire and ice, and the red line represents the Great Wall and the skiing courses. The torch is fueled by emission-free hydrogen. Because of the Corona virus the relay was held only for 3 days with about 1,200 torch runners, in and around Beijing and in Zhangjiakou, Hebei Province. A beautiful torch.
