ST. MORITZ, 5th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1948

c249. Cased Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal. Bronze, 60mm, by Huguenin. Hand holding high-relief torch, Olympic rings and snowflakes in background. Rev. 4-line French legend between snowflakes. One of 52 bronze medals. Toned EF, in brown case with Olympic rings on top, lined in velvet and silk (sm. stains inside top). Rare. (\$5,000)



c250. Participation Medal for Military Ski Patrol. Bronze, 50mm, by Huguenin. Ski patrol ascending mountain. Rev. Olympic rings over event encircled by "Olympic Winter Games 1948 St. Moritz" in French legend. Military Ski Patrols were part of every winter Olympiad since Chamonix 1924. 8 teams participated with 4 men each. Official report p. 71. One of only 32 medals. EF. Very rare. (\$1750)

- 251. Participation Medal. Bronze, 40mm, by Wiederkehr. Olympic rings over French legend in five lines. Rev. Symbolic figure of Victory, mountain range in back. Toned EF. (\$1000)
- c252. Official's Badge. Goldplated, multicolor enamel, 32mm. St. Moritz sun surrounded by legend on red, color rings affixed in center.
- c253. Participant's Badge. Silvered bronze, multicolor enamel, 32mm. St. Moritz sun surrounded by legend on blue, color rings affixed in center. EF. (\$750)
- 254. **Official Visitor's Pin with Tassels.** Goldplated AE, 17x27mm. Sun over Olympic rings, with blue and yellow tassels. EF. (\$250)
- Official Gold Medal in 5 Franken Size. 33mm, 1948-B, struck at Bern Mint. Gold, 33mm, 27 grams, by Wiederkehr. Nude athlete kneeling, holding torch. Rev. Olympic rings over laurel branches. EF. (\$500)
- 256. 30th Anniversary of the Founding of the Polish Olympic Committee Medal, 1948. Bronze, 70mm, with turnable, 25mm goldplated medal in center, showing Polish eagle and Olympic rings. EF. In leather box with blindstamped Olympic rings. Rare. (\$225)
- 257. Commemorative Ski and Swiss Shield Pin. Multicolor bronze, 51x3mm. Ski partially silvered, with affixed color rings, wooden plaque with Swiss shield and Edelweiss suspended from ski. EF. (\$200)

 Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant athletes. Polished EF, tiny rb. (\$1,000)
- 264. Participation Medal. Bronze, 51mm, by B. MacKennal/J. Pinches. City view of London over legend in three lines, Olympic rings below. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing l. Abt. EF. (\$300)

- 265. American Olympic Yachting Trials at Sheepshead Bay, 1948.
 Star Class Second Place Sterling Silver Trophy. 16.1cm (6.3") tall, 15.1cm (5.9") wide, 200 grams (almost 7 ounces).
 8 lines award legend engraved on front. The crew won a silver medal in London. Lt. bumps, starting to tone. (\$375)
- 266. **Pair of Sugar Spoons.** Silverplated, 4.2x8cm (round) and 3.1x8cm (rectangle). Both have logo on handle with Big Ben and color enameled Olympic rings. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$175)

- 274. **Participation Medal.** Copper, 56mm, by V. Falireus. Oslo Olympic emblem, a silhouette of the Oslo City Hall with superimposed Olympic rings. Rev. Olympic motto surrounding large snowflake. Toned EF. (\$1,100)
- c275. **Official's Badge.** Silvered, multicolor enamel, 30x37mm. Logo with legend, "OFFICIAL" below. NOP-6. EF. (**\$800**)

- 277. **Official "Norge 1952" Tie Tack.** Brass, 77x16mm. Olympic rings enameled in color. EF. (\$150)
- 278. Participation Diploma of a German Ice Hockey Team Member. 27.5x37.5cm (10.8"x14.8"), designed by Knut Yran. Signed by Organising Committee President Ditlev-Simonsen and Secretary General. Oslo was the first Olympiad the German team was invited to after WWII. Foxed, VF+. (\$650)

- 286. First Pre-Olympic Trials Medal in Heilbronn, Germany, April 21-22, 1951. Bronze, 41mm, by A. Rettenmaier. Eagle with redwhite-blue shield. Rev. "Kätchen" of Heilbronn. Abt. EF. Scarce. (\$150)
- Korean Olympic Supporter Pin. Silvered, 20mm, multicolor enamel. EF. (\$100)
- c288. **Philippines Team Pin.** Goldplated, multicolor enamel, 20x14mm. EF. (\$100)
- 289. **Pair of Soviet Team Pins.** Red enameled AE, 37x26mm and 23x17mm. First participation of the Soviet Union in summer Olympic Games. 1912 marked the last participation of Russia. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$125)


