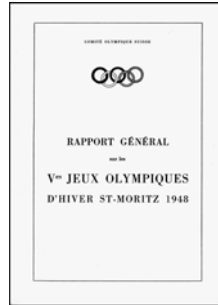

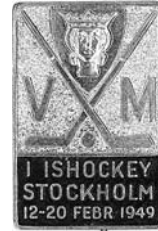

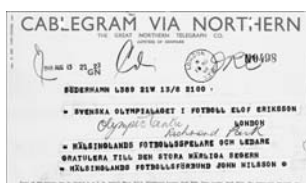

342. **Runners Bronze Art Plaque (abt. 1948).** 11.8x9cm (4.6"x3.5"), by Oskar Thiede. Two runners to the right. *Oskar Thiede won a Second Prize Medal and Diploma in the XIVth Olympiad Sport in Art Competition (no first prize was awarded) in Sculpture, Medals and Plaques section, with 8 sport plaques. 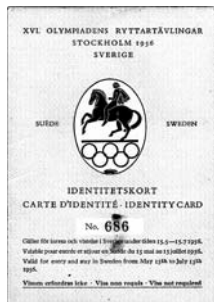

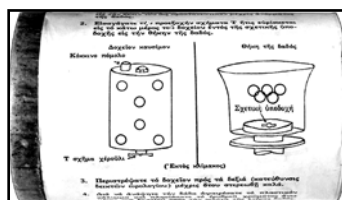

- 399. **Olympic Flame 1956 Torch Relay Torch Insert and Fuel Pack for Foot Runner.** Round cardboard container with instructions in Greek, 14cm (5.5"), diameter 8.5cm (3.5"), made in England by Waco Ltd. Contains the aluminum insert to the torch with fuel pack in original plastic, VF-EF. Top of container missing. Very rare, first time we offer the complete insert to the Melbourne torch. (\$1,250)
