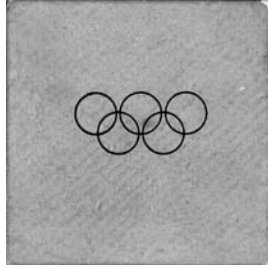

Mercury showing art object to female at l., young boy with cornucopia and ribbon with "Peace" and "Labor" at r. Signed in ink by the President of Ecuador 9.0. Corner creases, sm. tears, VF-EF. **(\$350)**

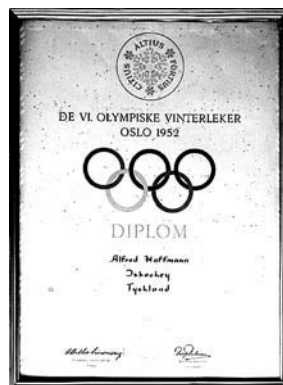
- 66. **St. Louis 1904. Official Diploma for a Member of the Jury.** Design in brown, 61.2x52.6cm (24.1"x20.7"), by W.H. Low, printed by Gilbo and Co., Brooklyn. Crowned female with globe and winged naked athlete with torch approaching America seated in center. Border with laurel wreath containing names of all American states 1803-1904. Lt. browning, creases, a few sm. tears, VF+. **(\$1,250)**
- c67. **St. Louis 1904. Rare Certificate of Attendance.** Multicolor, 31.8x24.1cm (12.5"x9.5"). Four females from different continents, Cascade Gardens in exposition ground in back. Creased, VF. Very rare. **(\$225)**
- c68. **Stockholm 1912. First Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Cycling, Road Race Around Lake Mälär.** Color lithography with gold décor, 28.6x45.5cm, designed by Olle Hjertzberg, Professor at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts and designer of the official poster. Printed by Centraltryckeriet, Stockholm. Crowned female holding staff and statue of Victory, Olympic stadium in background, panel with 7-line Swedish award legend below. Surrounded by flower and laurel leaf border. *The race around Lake Mälär was raced by single cyclists. The 4 best single cyclists of each country were counted as a team and Sweden won first place.* A few minor spots, o.w. EF. Matted, in frame. Beautiful Art Nouveau diploma. **(\$3,500)**
- c69. **Chamonix 1924 Winter. (Coubertin Signature) Official Diploma for a Participant in Speedskating.** Brown and green design, 74x54cm (29.1"x21.3"), designed by Plumereau, printed by Imprimerie Debar, Reims-Paris. Skier overlooking skating rink in Chamonix, Alps at left, panel with legend at right. Name of participant, and signatures by French Olympic Committee Clary and IOC President Pierre de Coubertin in ink. Border of fir cones. *The center design was set within a large blank stiff paper, and many times the blank border was cut down to only the design. It is a very rare diploma, and even rarer in its original size.* Creased, a few faint spots, professionally mounted on linen, VF-EF. Extremely rare. **Minimum Bid (\$8,500)**
- c70. **Paris 1924. Official Diploma for a Dutch Participant in Weightlifting.** Brown, and gray, 49.5x64cm (19.5"x25.2"), designed by Bernard Naudin. Winged goddess of Victory between allegorical figures. Signed by French Committee President, and IOC President Pierre de Coubertin. *Coubertin signed only the 1924 diplomas, for Chamonix and Paris.* A few creases and small water spots, VF-EF. A beautiful diploma. **(\$2,250)**

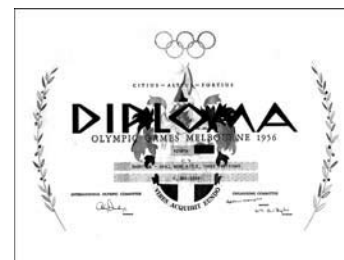

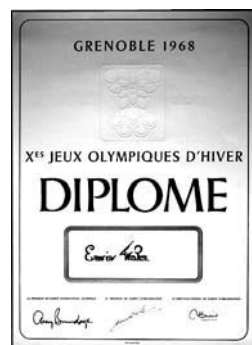

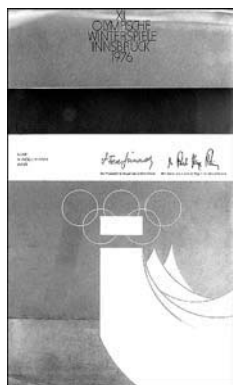

- c71. **Paris 1924. Official Diploma for the Uruguayan Attaché.** Multicolor lithograph, 48.5x61.7cm (19"x24"), designed by Bernard Naudin. Winged goddess of Victory between allegorical figures. Signed by French Committee President, and IOC President Pierre de Coubertin. *Coubertin signed only the 1924 diplomas, for Chamonix and Paris.* Creased, VF, professionally mounted on linen. (\$2,000)
72. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. Winner's Diploma.** 37.8x25.5cm (14"x10"). Participation medal with Fame between both sides of winner's medal. Signed in ink by Organising Committee President Dewey and IOC President Baillet-Latour. Unawarded. EF. (\$1,250)
- c73. **Berlin 1936. Diploma for an Austrian Torch Relay Participant, 1936.** Yellow and black, 23x34.8cm (9.1"x13.7"). Cauldron with flame emitting rays at top, legend below. Signed by Organising Committee President Lewald and Austrian NOC President, and stamp of Austrian NOC. Creased, spots, VF. In wooden frame, 30.4x38cm (12"x15"), under glass. (\$1,500)
- c74. **Berlin 1936. Official Diploma Presented to Olympic Choir Orchestra Willi Noack.** 46.8x35.1cm (18.4"x13.8"), designed by Professor Ernst Boehm, printed by Erasmusdruck, Berlin. Embossed Olympic stadium between Brandenburg Gate and Olympic bell, on gold background. Signed in ink by Organising Committee President Lewald and IOC President Baillet-Latour. EF. (\$1,750)
75. **Berlin 1936. Merit Diploma for an Italian Fencing Official, Fencing Gold Medal Winner in Antwerp 1920.** Red and black, 21x29.6cm (8.3"x11.7"). Facsimile signature of A. Hitler and blindstamped Nazi seal. Trace of mounting on back corners, lt. creases, VF-EF. (\$200)
76. **Oslo 1952 Winter. Participation Diploma of the German Ice Hockey Team Coach.** 27.5x37.5cm (10.8"x14.8"), designed by Knut Yran. Signed by Organising Committee President Ditlev-Simonsen and Secretary General. *Oslo was the first Olympiad the German team was invited to after WWII.* Foxed, VF+. (\$500)
- c77. **Oslo 1952 Winter. United States Olympic Association Certificate of Appreciation** to Gustavus T. Kirby for Supporting the American Team in Oslo, Feb. 14-25, 1952, and Helsinki, July 19-August 3, 1952. Blue and red, 28x21.5cm (11"x8.5"). EF, lt. crease. (\$175)

78. **Helsinki 1952. 5th Place Winner's Diploma.** 35.4x53cm (13.9"x20.9"), signed by IOC President Edstroem and Organising Committee President. A few marginal creases, o.w. EF. (\$475)

81. **Tokyo 1964. Third Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Water Polo, Soviet Union.** Red and gold, 38.6x38.6cm (15.2"x15.2"). Text in Japanese and English, signed in black ink by Organising Committee President Daigoro Y. and IOC President A. Brundage. Abt. EF. (\$750)
82. **Tokyo 1964. Diploma for a German Team Official.** 28x38.3cm (11"x15"). Red sun and gilt and black legend. EF. (\$275)
83. **Grenoble 1968 Winter. Second Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Four-Man Bobsleigh.** 32x44cm (12.6"x17.3"), signed by IOC President Avery Brundage, and Organising Committee President, and General Director. EF. (\$1,500)

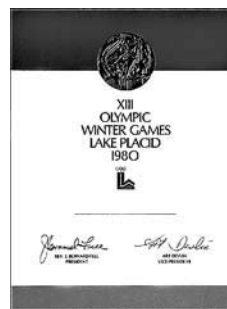

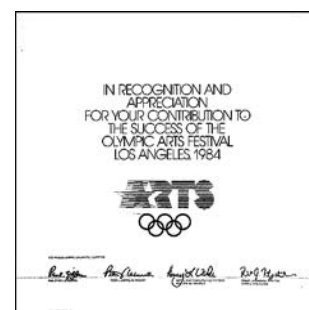

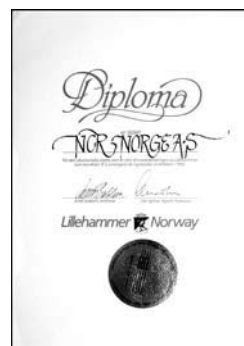
