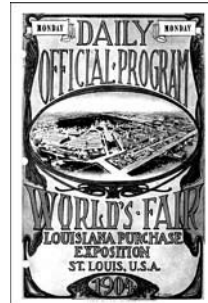

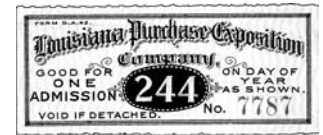

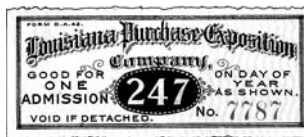
*The 1904 Olympic Games in St. Louis were also held in conjunction with a World's Fair. This, again, detracted a lot from the importance of the Games. Few items are available that relate directly to the Olympiad, and they usually command very high prices. For this reason we are also offering some memorabilia from the World's Fair which celebrated the Centennial of the Louisiana Purchase from Napoleon in 1803.*

134. **Grand Prize Award Medal of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition 1904.** Shield-shaped bronze, 63x74mm, by Weinberg. Louisiana cloaking Indian maiden. Rev. Eagle with outspread wings on panel with award legend. EF/abt. EF. **(\$275)**
135. **Cased Gold Award Medal of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition 1904.** Triangular bronze, 70x71mm, by Weinberg. Louisiana cloaking Indian maiden. Rev. Eagle with outspread wings on panel with award legend. EF, in presentation case (scuffed). **(\$275)**
- c136. **Indiana Day September 1, 1904 Badge.** Celluloid, 32mm. View of Indiana building. Rev. Bust facing of Indiana governor W.T. Durbin. 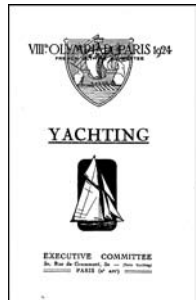

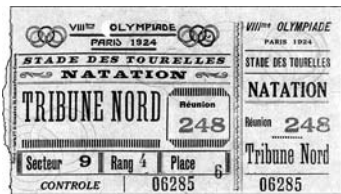
