SECOND NATIONAL GREEK OLYMPIC GAMES, ATHENS, 1870

114. **Cased Participation Medal.** Copper, 41mm, by Barre. Head r. of King George I. Rev. Legend in crossed laurel branches. Toned Unc., in original, blue velvet-lined case. Scarce. (\$1,250)

FIRST OLYMPIC CONGRESS IN PARIS, 1894

115. (First Olympic Congress Program) Racing Club of France. Congrès International de Paris. International Congress in Paris for the Restoration of the Olympic Games, June 16-23, 1894. 4pp., 22x28cm (8.7"x11"), printed in June 1894 by Pelluard Printing Co., Paris., in French language. Program for each day of the Congress at the Sorbonne, list of Honorary Members, President and Commissionaries including Pierre de Coubertin, and list of all Delegates with their Paris address. The Racing Club de France hosted a Night Festival at the Bois de Boulogne with athletic events on June 21. Right side creased and sm. tears, o.w. EF. Extremely rare program of the Congress that restored the Modern Olympic Games. (\$2,500)

ATHENS, 1st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1896

- c116. Cased Silver First Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 50mm, by J. Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch on globe. Rev. View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend. First place winners of the 43 events received a silver medal, second place winners a bronze medal. No gold medals were awarded in the first Olympic Games. Toned EF, in original blue velvet-lined presentation case. Very rare. (\$35,000)
- c117. **Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath over phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Greek legend. *Presented to very high officials.* VF-EF, gold plating partially worn. (\$1,750)
- 118. **Cased Participation Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath, phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Green legend in laurel wreath. Unc., in original round red case. (\$1,850)

- Participation Medal. As preceding bronze medal but VF, rbs., holed at top. (\$875)
- c120. Sheet Music. The Olympic Hymn, 1896. 8pp., 24.8x32.9cm (9.8"x13") in Greek language. Music by Spiros Samaros, text by Kosti Palamas. In 1895 the best of the Greek artists were asked to contribute to the success of the Olympic Games, and contests were held. This hymn was chosen as the official Olympic Hymn to be played at the opening of the 1896 Games. In 1958 the IOC declared this hymn as the official hymn of the Olympic Games ever played since 1960 at the opening of the Games. Beautiful blue and gold covers with attached label of merchant and editor Alexandre Cavadis, Athens. Old craft-style paper reinforcing the spine, minor tears, VF-EF. Very rare. (\$4,000)

PARIS, 2nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1900

The 1900 Paris Olympic Games were held in conjunction with the World's Exposition. They played only a minor role. There were athletes who didn't know that the events they participated in were Olympic Games events. Few items relate directly to the Games. For this reason we are also offering items commemorating the World's Exposition.

- c121. **Silver Winner's Plaque Awarded for Gymnastics.** Silvered bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed with the Olympic Games gymnastic event "XXVIME FETE FEDERALE DE GYMNASTIQUE". Abt. EF. (\$2,000)
- 122. Shooting Winner's Plaque. Silvered bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed with the Olympic Games shooting event "CONCOURS DE TIR/VII CONCOURS/NATIONAL". Polished on obverse, EF. (\$1,500)
- 123. **Bronze Award Plaque by the Minister of Sports.** Bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Victorious athlete standing on podium. Rev. 4-line French award legend over laurel branch. Toned EF. (\$900)
- c124. **Silver World's Fair Award Medal.** Silver, hallmarked on edge, 63mm, by Chaplain. Head of French Republic r. Rev. Male with torch carried by female. *Since no participation medals were issued in 1900, collectors often add this medal to their collection.* EF. Very scarce in silver. (\$600)
- 25. **World's Fair Award Medal.** Bronze, 61mm, by Chaplain. Head of French Republic r. Rev. Male with torch carried by female. *Since no participation medals were issued in 1900, collectors often add this medal to their collection.* EF. (\$275)

126. **Judge's Plaque.** Silvered bronze, 36x50mm, by Roty. Rose and laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Young winged boy (New Century) taking torch from sleeping woman. Toned EF. (\$275)

- 127. **Official Olympic Shooting Event Recognition Medal.** Bronze, 44mm, by Charles Marey. Winged female holding fallen soldier. Rev. French rooster on panel, 8-line French legend above. VF-EF. Rare. (\$375)
- 128. Large Stevensgraph Silk Picture of the United States at the World's Exposition in Paris, 1900. Black and cream, 25.5x29.5cm (10"x11.6"). U.S. Government building at river Seine, legend above. EF, 2 sm. tears not affecting picture. (\$150)
- 129. **French Republic Bronze Award Medal Diploma of the 1900 Paris World's Fair.** Black and white, 73.5x56.6cm (28.9"x22.3"), by Boignard and Didier, printed by Porcaboeuf, Paris. Cherub with torch besides seated worker, illustrations of Labor, Arts and Research; signed by the Commissary General and the French Minister of Commerce. Lennartz/Borgers/Hoefer p. 114 illus. *Pierre de Coubertin received this diploma as a Commemorative Diploma*. A few brown spots, lt. creases and tears, professionally restored and lined on linen. VF-EF. Beautiful diploma. (\$1,250)
- 130. (Magazine) La Vie Au Grand Air. Paris, Nr. 100, August 12, 1900. 36pp. illustrated, 27.8x34.7cm (11"x13.7"). Includes illustrated reports on the Olympic 6-Hour Walk Event, the Olympic Gymnastic Event July 29 and 30, and the arrival of the American cycling team (photo on cover). Lt. browning, sm. marginal tears, VF-EF. (\$150)

ST. LOUIS, 3rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1904

The 1904 Olympic Games in St. Louis were also held in conjunction with a World's Fair. This, again, detracted a lot from the importance of the Games. Few items are available that relate directly to the Olympiad, and they usually command very high prices. For this reason we are also offering some memorabilia from the World's Fair which celebrated the Centennial of the Louisiana Purchase from Napoleon in 1803.

Britannia extending hand to Gallia across the British Channel. Rev. Seated Peace holding 2 flags over view of exposition grounds with Olympic Games stadium. This is the only medallic illustration of the Olympic stadium in 1908. EF. (\$650)
