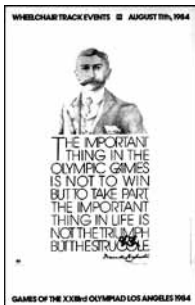

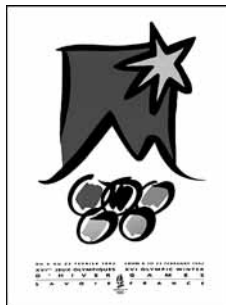

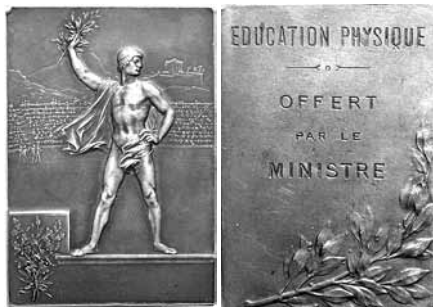
THIRD NATIONAL GREEK OLYMPIC GAMES, ATHENS, 1875

- 139. **Cased Participation Medal.** Copper, 41mm, by Barre. Head r. of King George I. Rev. Legend in crossed laurel branches. In original round case, scuffed, medal Unc. (\$1,400)
- 140. **German Gymnastic Society, London. First Prize Pole Jump Winner's Medal, 1894.** Silver, 50mm, signed OKA, struck by Waterlows Limited. Nude Hercules standing. Rev. 5-line engraved English legend in oak wreath. In 1861 the German Gymnastic Society was founded by E.G. Ravenstein. He was also instrumental in setting up the National Olympian Society, together with Wm. Penny Brookes of the Wenlock Olympian Society, and J. Hulley from Liverpool. EF, lt. rubbing in fields. (\$400)

ATHENS, 1st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1896

- c141. **Silver First Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 50mm, by J. Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch on globe. Rev. View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend. First place winners of the 43 events received a silver medal, second place winners a bronze medal. No gold medals were awarded in the first Olympic Games. EF, lt. rubbing. Very rare. (\$30,000)
- c142. **Cased Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath over phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Greek legend. Presented to very high officials. Unc., in original round black case. (\$2,250)
- c143. **Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath over phoenix emerging from flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. Greek legend in wreath. Goldplating missing on date "1896", "1906" panel over date removed. EF (\$1,500)
- 144. **Boxed Participation Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath, phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Greek legend in laurel wreath. EF, in original case. (\$2,250)
- 145. **(Autograph) James B. Connolly Handwritten Letter in Ink, Nov. 21, 1906.** 12.3x16.4cm (4.8"x6.5"). Connolly was the first Olympic champion on Opening Day, April 6, in Triple Jump. EF. (\$425)

PARIS, 2nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1900

The 1900 Paris Olympic Games were held in conjunction with the World's Exposition. They played only a minor role. There were athletes who didn't know that the events they participated in were Olympic Games events. Few items relate directly to the Games. For this reason we are also offering items commemorating the World's Exposition.

- 146. **Bronze Award Plaque by the Minister of Sports.** Bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Victorious athlete standing on podium. Rev. 4-line French award legend over laurel branch. Toned EF. **(\$900)**
- c147. **Official Olympic Shooting Event Gloria Victis Medal.** Silver, 45mm by Charles Marey. Winged female holding fallen soldier. Rev. French rooster on panel, 8-line French legend above. Besides the Vernier winner's plaque the "Gloria Victis" (Glory to the Defeated", transl.) medal was also a shooting award medal. Very rare in silver. EF. **(\$1,800)**
- 148. **Judge's Plaque.** Silvered bronze, 36x50mm, by Roty. Rose and laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Young winged boy (New Century) taking torch from sleeping woman. Toned EF. **(\$275)**
- c149. **Cased Gold World's Fair Award Medal.** Goldplated silver, 63mm, by Chaplain. Head of French Republic r. view of Paris in background. Rev. Made with torch carried by flying female flying over exposition grounds, name on panel below. Since no participation medals were issued in 1900, collectors often add this medal to their collection. EF, with 66x66mm paper insert for diploma to be mailed later, and silk and red velvet-lined leather case embossed in gold. **(\$750)**
- 150. **World's Fair Bronze Award Medal.** Bronze, 61mm, by Chaplain. Head of French Republic r. Rev. Male with torch carried by female. Since no participation medals were issued in 1900, collectors often add this medal to their collection. EF. **(\$300)**
- 151. **French Republic Silver Award Medal for Exposition Workers.** Silvered bronze, 29mm, by Chaplain. Winged female carrying torchbearer over Paris, city shield below. Rev. 6-line French legend, name on panel. Looped, with ring and tricolor ribbon. Toned EF. Scarce. **(\$450)**
- 152. **Large Silk Stevensgraph of the United States at the World's Exposition in Paris, 1900.** Black and cream, 25.5x29.5cm (10"x11.6"). U.S. Government building at river Seine, legend above. EF, 2 sm. tears not affecting picture. **(\$150)**

ST. LOUIS, 3rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1904

The 1904 Olympic Games in St. Louis were also held in conjunction with a World's Fair. This, again, detracted a lot from the importance of the Games. Few items are available that relate directly to the Olympiad, and they usually command very high prices. For this reason we are also offering some memorabilia from the World's Fair which celebrated the Centennial of the Louisiana Purchase from Napoleon in 1803.

- c153. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 40x40mm, made by Dieges & Clust, New York. Nude athlete striding r., laurel branch in hand. Rev. Legend in eleven lines, shields of St. Louis, France and U.S.A. between ivy leaves. Trace of removed loop at top, as struck by Dieges & Clust, and similar to most medals presented to athletes. Toned EF, spot obv. **(\$20,000)**
- 154. **Official Silver Souvenir Medal of the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair.** Silvered, 34mm. Conjoined busts l. of Napoleon and Jefferson. Rev. Map of U.S. with Louisiana Territory purchased in 1803. EF. **(\$200)**
- 155. **Official Bronze Souvenir Medal of the St. Louis World's Fair.** As preceding medal but bronze. EF, a few spots. **(\$135)**
- 156. **St. Louis 1904 Flag Pin.** Goldplated aluminum, 18x16mm. EF. **(\$110)**
- 157. **St. Louis 1904 Flag Pin.** Silvered aluminum, 17x11mm. EF. **(\$100)**
- c158. **1904 Olympic Event Pair of Wooden "Indian Clubs".** Half pound size, black and gold painted wood, 32cm (12.6") tall, made by Spalding. The official 1904 report by Sullivan/Spalding shows a photo of Indian Clubs used in the Olympic event. VF. (2 pcs.) **(\$800)**
- 159. **Sword of the Jefferson Guard, the Security Force at the St. Louis 1904 World's Exposition.** 66cm (26") long, made by Ames Sword Co., Chicopee, Massachusetts. "JEFFERSON GUARD" and decorative flower motif. Rev. "LOUISIANA PURCHASE EXPOSITION" etched on sides of steel blade. "J.G." (for Jefferson Guard) on brass and wood hilt. Sheath is made of brass with black leather wrapping. Numbered. The Jefferson Guard was a privately hired security force of several hundred men who patrolled the fair grounds including the Olympic Games site; they also served as unofficial guides. VF-EF. Very rare. **(\$1,500)**



160. **Commemorative Gold and Black Porcelain Bowl.** 16cm (6.34"), made by Victoria, Carlsbad. View of Palace of Varied Industries, St. Louis Exposition 1904 legend below in gold flower border. Scalloped gilt edge, lt. wear on black legend, o.w. EF. (\$125)
161. **Commemorative White Opalene Cup.** 12.5cm (4.9") high. Views of Cascade Gardens, Palace of Machinery, Louisiana Purchase Monument and St. Louis Union Station between ornate scroll work. Flower design on bottom. EF. (\$125)
162. **Opening Ceremony Program, April 30 to May 2, 1904.** Linen, 41x41.6cm (16.1"x16.4"). Three-Day opening program in center between President Roosevelt and World's Fair President Francis, Jefferson and Napoleon below. Lt. browning at top, EF. (\$100)
163. **Official Daily Program, June 13, 1904.** 17pp., 15.4x22.3cm (6.1"x8.8"). Includes ground plan with Athletic Field (Olympic Stadium), list of future Olympic Games events: College Baseball, Olympia College Championships, etc., and photo of J.E. Sullivan, Director of the Olympian Games. Punchholed, EF. (\$150)
164. **Official Daily Program, June 28, 1904.** 17pp., 15.3x22.5cm (6"x8.9"). Includes ground plan with Athletic Field (Olympic Stadium), list of future Olympic events as Lacrosse, Swimming, Basketball, Regatta, etc., photo of J.E. Sullivan, Director of Olympic Games. Punchholed, EF. (\$150)
165. **Official Daily Program, August 12, 1904.** 17pp., 15.1x22.6cm (5.9"x8.9"). Includes ground plan with Athletic Field (Olympic Stadium), Opening of Roque Tournament and Anthropological Athletic Events at Olympic Stadium list of future events (Tennis, Olympic Games Aug. 29 - Sep. 3, Swimming, Fencing, etc. Punchholed, EF. (\$150)
166. **Official Daily Program, September 9, 1904.** 17pp., 15.5x23.1cm (6.1"x9.1"). Includes ground plan with Athletic Field (Olympic Stadium), daily program of Philippine and Boer War exhibits, Future Events of Olympic Games: Fencing, Archery, Soccer, etc. Punchholed, EF. (\$150)
167. **Official Daily Program, September 17, 1904.** 17pp., 15.4x23.4cm (6.1"x9.2"). Includes ground plan with Athletic Field (Olympic Stadium), Future Events of Olympic Games: Golf, Glen Echo Links, Sep. 19-24. Association Football, etc. Punchholed. EF. (\$150)
168. **Louisiana Purchase Exposition Stockholder's Coupon Ticket Booklet.** Salmon color, 5.7x12.9cm (2.2"x5.1"). Contains 25 tickets for entry to the St. Louis Fair, any day besides Sunday, with photo and signature of stockholder. Numbered. EF. In paper slip cover. (\$225)

169. **(Sheet Music) St. Louis Tickle.** Rag Time Two-Step, by Barney & Seymore, printed by V. Kremer Co., Chicago. 4pp., 26.8x34.5cm (10.6"x13.6"). Green and black pictorial cover showing black musicians performing on lawn, view of St. Louis exhibition with airship in background. Creases, sm. tears, VF+. (\$125)

- c170. **Cased Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 50mm, by J. Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch on globe. Rev. View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend. *Similar to 1896 winner's medal - only the date on the reverse was changed to 1906.* Toned EF. (\$9,750)
- c171. **Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by J. Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch on globe. Rev. View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend. *Similar to 1896 winner's medal - only the date on the reverse was changed to 1906.* Toned EF. (\$6,500)
- c172. **Reception Committee Badge.** Cream, blue and gold celluloid, 32mm. Laureated head l. of Zeus surrounded by Greek legend. EF. Rare. (\$1,000)
173. **Olympic Trials in Rome Medal for the Athens 1906 Olympic Games, 1906.** Bronze, 26mm. Helemeted head r. Rev. Olympic Games in Athens 1906 and trials legend. VF-EF, with lt. blue moire ribbon. (\$400)
174. **Victory and Panathenian Olympic Stadium Medal.** Bronze, 23mm. Winged victory with laurel branch. Rev. Aerial view of the stadium. Looped, toned VF. (\$125)
175. **Photographic Album of Athens Around 1906.** 13pp. with 13 photographic prints pasted in, 25x17.7cm (9.8"x7"). Includes a photo of the Panathenian Olympic Stadium, construction workers in foreground, gate at entry finished. Corner crease, EF. (\$200)
