



Nr. 1, October 28, 1938 to Nr. 10, Oct. 10, 1939 missing Nrs. 6 and 7. Invitations to NOC's, acceptances, the poster, venues, tickets, organization, program, and confirmation of Organising Committee that Games would be held in spite of the outbreak of World War II in September 1939. Silver, 50mm, made by Stabilimenti Artistici, Firenze. Downhill skier. Rev. Italian legend between Olympic rings with fasces, encircled by legend. EF, in presentation case. Rare. (\$800)

**ST. MORITZ, 5th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1948**





Gray, brown and black, 35x49.5cm (13.8"x19.5"). 1920's Finnish world class runner Paavo Nurmi over "XV OLYMPIA HELSINKI 1952", award legend and signatures of Organizing Committee President and IOC President Edström, Helsinki city views and Olympic rings below. *Emil Zatopek (1922-2000) from Czechoslovakia was one of the best athletes ever. He won 3 gold medals in Helsinki: 5,000 M., 10,000 M. and Marathon. Between 1948 and 1954 he won 38 consecutive 10,000 Meter races, and ran 13 world records. This diploma will be the highlight of any collection.* EF, a few brown spots, in a wooden frame, 39x54cm (15.4"x21.3"), glazed. (\$9,750)

c391. Dana Zatopkova Javelin Gold Winner's Medal Diploma, July 24, 1952. Gray, brown and black, 35x49.5cm (13.8"x19.5"). Paavo Nurmi above "XV OLYMPIA HELSINKI 1952", award legend and Organizing Committee President and IOC President Edström's signatures, city of Helsinki below. *Dana Zatopkova was the wife of Emil Zatopek, and they are the only couple winning gold medals on the same day. He showed her his gold medal for 5000 Meters which he had just won, and she took it to her javelin event as a good luck token. "That evening Emil claimed that he deserved partial credit for his wife's gold medal because he had inspired her. Naturally, Dana was quite offended and replied, "What?? 



