



432. **Participation Medal.** Cast bronze, 55mm, by E. Greco. Nude female torchbearer l. superimposed over Olympic rings. Rev. Flight of eagles soaring over stadium of Rome. EF, dark original patina. (\$375)

c433. **IOC Badge.** Goldplated, 45x50mm. Double gold laurel wreath, "C.I.O" on white enameled bar. EF. Very rare. (\$2,500)

434. **Official's Badge.** Bronze, 37x47mm. "UFFIZIALE" on red bar. EF. (\$325)

435. **Service Badge.** Bronze, 37x47mm. "SERVIZIO" on cream enameled bar. EF. (\$325)

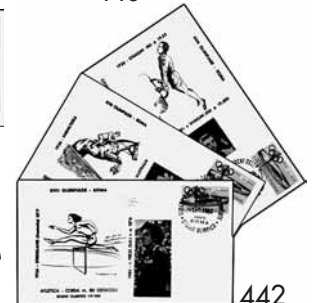

- c459. **The Olympic Cup Silver Plaque Awarded to the City of Tokyo (1965).** Silver, 50x72mm, by Huguenin. The Olympic Cup created by Pierre de Coubertin. Rev. Olympic rings above 8-line legend in French language "The Olympic Cup Created by Baron/Pierre de Coubertin/Renovator of the Modern Era Olympic Games, has been Awarded to the City of Tokyo" (transl.). *The Olympic Cup has been awarded since 1906; it is being kept at the Olympic Museum in Lausanne, and the names of the recipients are engraved on a plaque on the trophy. Tokyo was awarded the Cup for Organizing the 1964 Olympic Games. Lennartz, Berger-Höfer pages 428-430.* EF. Extremely rare. **(\$8,000)**

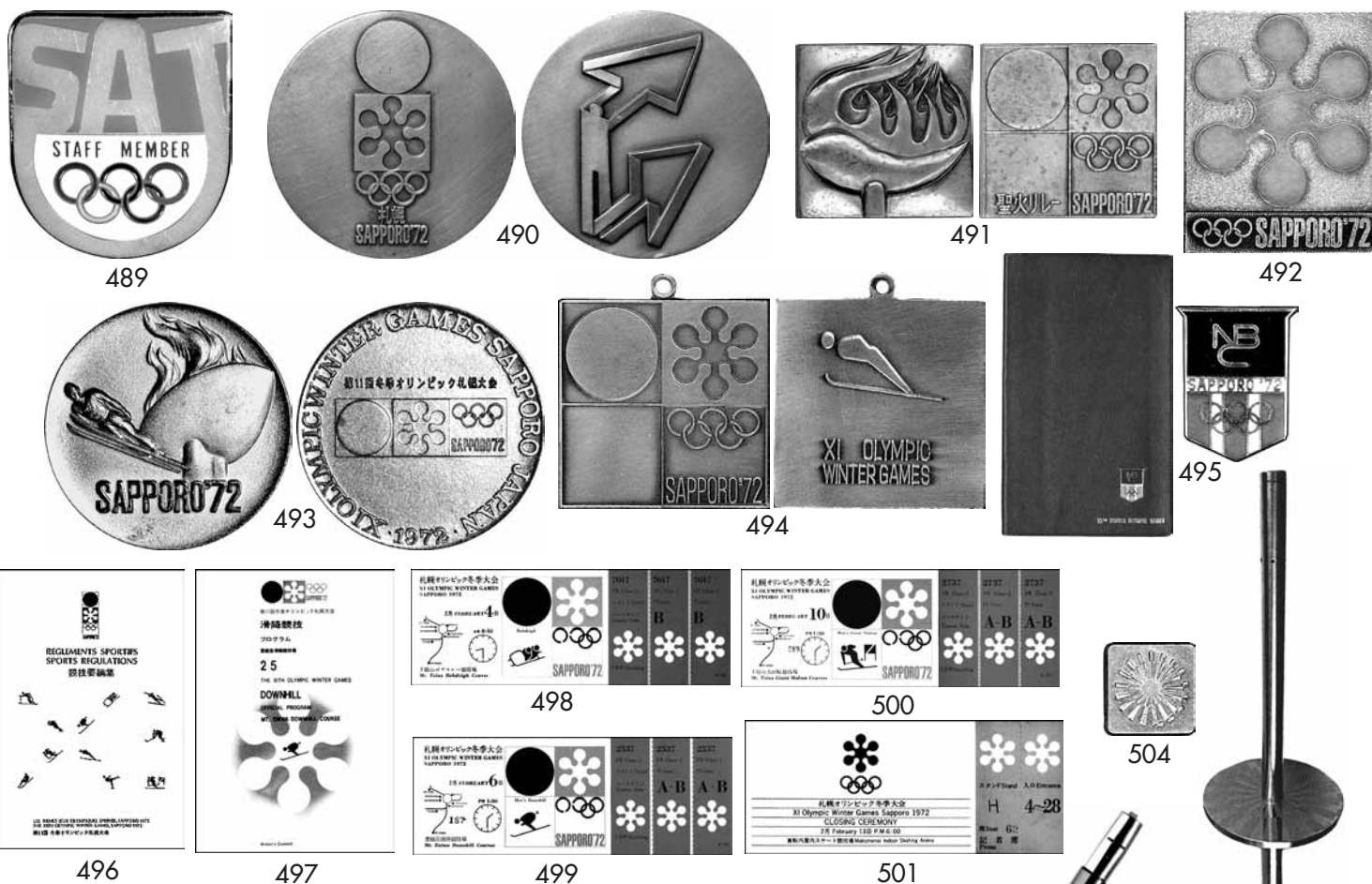

- c476. **Bob Beamon Olympic Long Jump Gold Medal Winner, Honorary Sculpture with Gold Medal.** Granite, 29cm (11.4") tall, base 20.5x13cm (8.2"x5.1"), made by Creation Studio Bertoni. Mexico 1968 gold winner's medal with athletic pictogram, inset in center, color Olympic rings affixed above, gold legend in 3 lines below "Robert Beamon (USA) / Olympic champion long jump / 1968.10.8 - 8.90m (world record)". On October 8, 1968, "Bob Beamon stunned the sports world when he bettered the world long jump record by 21 3/4" inches, with a leap of 29 feet 2-1/2 inches". (D. Wallechinsky). EF. **(\$4,500)**
477. **Official Silver Torch.** Silver color, part of shaft made of wood, 53cm (21") high. Circle of doves around top. Used in the torch relay in Mexico. EF. **(\$2,250)**

478. **Official Black Torch.** Black painted aluminum, part of shaft made of wood, 52.3cm (20.9"). Silver colored doves around top. The black torch was used in the torch run from Olympia to Athens, Greece. EF. **(\$2,250)**
479. **Participation Medal.** Copper, 50x50mm, by L. Wyman. Olympic sports pictograms divided by Mexico Olympic emblem. Rev. Spanish legend between two parallel lines. EF. **(\$275)**
480. **Greek Torchbearer's Pin from the Relay Olympia to Athens.** Silvered blue enamel, 25x40mm. EF. **(\$100)**
481. **BBC Radio Patch.** Black felt with silver and gold thread, 10.9cm (4.3"). "BBC Radio" above Olympic rings and "Mexico 1968". EF. Rare. **(\$175)**

483. **(Program) Athletics Official Daily Program, October 20, 1968.** Marathon Day - won by Mamo Wolde, Ethiopia. Finals in High Jump, 1500 Meters, 4x100 Meters Men and Women, etc. EF. **(\$75)**
484. **Closing Ceremony Program.** 4pp., multicolor covers, 22.5x22.5cm (8.9"x8.9"), in French, English, and Spanish. Munich spiral logo on back. Lt. creases, abt. EF. **(\$175)**

- c503. **Bronze Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 66mm, by G. Marcks. Victory seated over stadium. Rev. Castor and Pollux, patrons of competitive sport and friendship. With chain. Unawarded. EF. (\$3,000)
504. **Bronze Winner's Medal Lapel Pin.** Bronze, 12x12mm. Spiral logo. Presented to winners together with Bronze Winner's Medal. EF. (\$250)
- c505. **IOC Badge.** Goldplated, 25x35mm. Spiral over "IOC" in white enamel. EF, catch on rev. partially missing. (\$500)
506. **Official Torch.** Steel, 73cm (28.8"), made by Krupp. *The fire was lit in Olympia, Greece on July 28 and carried 5539 km in 29 days to Munich by 5976 runners.* EF, in original container. (\$2,500)
507. **Olympic Torch as Table Lighter.** Steel, 30cm (11.8") with Olympic rings and Munich 1972 Olympic Games legend. EF, in original pictorial box. (\$275)
