

French legend in 14 lines. *First participation and winner's medal of Winter Olympic games. The only time that the participation medal was the same as the winner's medal. There were only 258 participants in Chamonix.* EF, spot obv. Very rare. (\$16,500)

c278. Official Diploma Awarded to the Designer of the Ski Runs, M. Rondel. Brown and green design, 74x54cm (29.1"x21.3"), designed by Plumereau, printed by Imprimerie Debar, Reims-Paris. Skier overlooking skating rink in Chamonix, Alps at left, panel with legend at right. Name of participant, and signatures by French Olympic Committee Clary and IOC President Pierre de Coubertin. Border of fir cones. Center design only, the blank part was cut off. Pasted on stiff board. Browning, EF. Very rare diploma. (\$6,500)

279. Original Chamonix 1924 Olympic Figure Skating Film by Jean de Rovera. 10mm film, by Pathé Baby, France, in (Pathé) Baby Film case, 50mm. Jean de Rovera made for the first time a film of Olympic Games events. Chamonix wasn't declared the first Olympic Winter Games until the following year, at the time of the Chamonix Games they were considered part of the VIIIth Olympic Summer Games. EF. Rare. (\$450)

- c280. The Olympic Winner's Vase Presented to a Member of the Uruguayan Gold Medal Winning Soccer Team. Sèvres pâte-surpâte porcelain, 33.3cm (13.1") tall, designed by talented artist M.O. Guillonet and executed by Bracquemond at the world famous porcelain factory of Sèvres. Golden laurel branches are handpainted on French blue background, the white medallions depicting Soccer, Rowing, Rugby and Diving, on gray background with green border. Name of winner known, and will be given to buyer. Official report p. 804. The vases were made in several versions, with four events each, to accommodate all Olympic events. They were presented by the Paris City Council to gold medal winners. EF. Very rare and beautiful. Minimum Bid (\$16,000) Photo on inside front cover page.
- c281. **Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 55mm, by A. Rivaud. Legend surrounded by sports equipment. Rev. Winner helping fallen athlete back on his feet. Holed at top, lt. wear on high points, abt. EF. (\$6,000)
- 282. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. City view over French legend in three lines. Rev. Victory with laurel wreaths crowning victorious athletes. Toned EF. (\$450)

First time that this design appeared on winner's medals. It stayed on summer winners medals until 1968. EF, in original orange cardboard case with gold legend. Very rare with case. (\$5,750)
- 299. Participation Medal. Bronze, 55mm, by J.C. Wienecke. Nude male and female athlete on podium holding torch over Olympic flame. Rev. Nike over Marathon Tower, shield of Amsterdam between two hemispheres. EF. (\$475)
- 300. **Polish Team Pin.** Silvered, 22x25mm. Horseman 1. with palm branch above date and Polish legend. Toned EF. (**\$200**)
- 301. **Uruguay Olympic Soccer Champion in 1924 and 1928 Pin.** Silvered, 15mm. Color enameled flag and soccer ball surrounded by legend. Buttonhole closure. EF. (\$125)
