- 2. St. Louis 1904. Cased Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal in the Olympic AAU Gymnastics Event for Horizontal Bars, Won on October 28 by George Eyser. Bronze, 44mm. Female extending wreath, the AAU logo. Rev. Engraved "Horizontal Bars" in wreath of sports equipment. Suspended from bar with "1904/Universal Exposition/Olympic Games/St. Louis" and red-white-blue ribbon. According to noted IOC historian Bill Mallon, there were 2 Olympic Gymnastics events, July 1 and 2, ad October 28. In July, George Eyser won six medals including three gold. As a youth he had lost one of his legs, and at the 1904 Olympics he completed as a gymnast with a wooden leg (Bill Mallon, The 1904 Olympics).
