2. **St. Louis 1904. Cased Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal in the Olympic AAU Gymnastics Event for Horizontal Bars, Won on October 28 by George Eyser.** Bronze, 44mm. Female extending wreath, the AAU logo. Rev. Engraved "Horizontal Bars" in wreath of sports equipment. Suspended from bar with "1904/Universal Exposition/Olympic Games/St. Louis" and red-white-blue ribbon. According to noted IOC historian Bill Mallon, there were 2 Olympic Gymnastics events, July 1 and 2, ad October 28. In July, George Eyser won six medals including three gold. As a youth he had lost one of his legs, and at the 1904 Olympics he completed as a gymnast with a wooden leg (Bill Mallon, *The 1904 Olympics*). In dark red leather case, scuffed, lined in silk, made by Dieges & Clust, VF. Medal EF. (\$6,500)
