The grueling race around Lake Mälar was raced by single cyclists. The 4 best single cyclists of each country were counted as a team and Sweden won first place. A few minor spots, o.w. EF. - c194. **Cased Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by Dupon. Nude victorious athlete with palm branch and laurel wreath, fame blowing horn. Rev. View of Antwerp. EF. In red leatherette case with gold legend, scuffed, lined in velvet and silk. (\$5,000)
- c195. **Swedish Team Pin.** Silver, 21x24mm. Blue and yellow enameled Swedish flag with "Antwerpen 1920". Hallmarked on back. EF. Rare. (\$700)

- Philadelphia Olympic Athletic Association Medal (1920). Bronze, 60mm uniface. Runner between U.S. American shield and laurel branch on right, surrounded by legend. Philadelphia was bidding for the 1920 Olympic Games. Toned EF. Rare. (\$200)
- 197. (Brochure) Gymnastics Programme Rules General Regulations and Committees. 51pp., 3 photographic plates, 12.3x20.5cm (4.8"x8"). Red covers. EF. (\$200)
- (U.S. Report) Report of the American Olympic Committee. Seventh Olympic Games, Antwerp, Belgium, 1920. 451pp., illustrated, 15.2x23cm (6"x9.1"). Olympic Trials, reports for each event for the American team, summary of all events, team and winners. Very rare report as no official report was published by the Organizing Committee. Paper covers with photographic prints. Abt. EF. (\$400)
- Gold First Place Winner's Medal in the German Championships in Berlin, 1922. Goldplated cast bronze, 68mm, by Schmarje. Nude herald with German standard. Rev. 3-line engraved legend to winner in boxing, welter weight, surrounded by oak wreath. Celebrated as national German Olympic Games as Germany was not invited to Antwerp. EF. (\$375)
- 200. Third Latvian National Olympic Games in Riga, 1923. Participant's Badge. Bronze, 25x25mm. Victory leading athlete in quadriga r. Toned EF. (\$175)

CHAMONIX, 1st OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1924

- c201. Cased Bronze Third Place Winners Medal. Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. First winner's and participation medal of Winter Olympic Games. The only time that the participation medal was the same as the winner's medal. There were only 258 participants in Chamonix. EF. Very rare in its original case. (\$22,500)
- Participant's Badge. Silvered, 41mm. "Concurrent" on blue enamel. Numbered on back, screw back removed. Toned EF. (\$2,750)

- Group of 12 Swiss Ice Hockey, Skating, Bobsled, and Skiing Pins (1920's). Silver, silverplated and bronze, 18x18mm to 34mm. Ice hockey club pins from Davos, St. Moritz Caux, Villars; Two silver pins: National Champion and Swiss Champion, etc. Plus 2 medals, 1910 and 1924. EF. (14 pcs.) (\$200)
- Commemorative Chamonix Mont-Blanc Ski Jumping Plaque (ca 1920's). Silver "990", 35x50mm (1.4"x2"), by Fatio & Geny, Geneva. Male and female ski jumpers (similar to a poster) over Montblanc and Chamonix. Rev. Laurel and oak branch. Toned EF. (\$150)
- Original Chamonix 1924 Olympic Bobsleigh Events Film. 205. 10mm film made by Pathé Baby, France, in (Pathé) Baby Film case, 50mm. Jean de Rovera made for the first time a film of Olympic Games events. Chamonix wasn't declared the first Olympic Winter Games until the following year, at the time of the Chamonix Games they were considered part of the VIIIth Olympic Summer Games. EF. Rare. (\$375)
- 206. Original Chamonix 1924 Olympic Skiing Events Film. 10mm film made by Pathé Baby, France, in (Pathé) Baby Film case, 50mm. Jean de Rovera made for the first time a film of Olympic Games events. Chamonix wasn't declared the first Olympic Winter Games until the following year, at the time of the Chamonix Games they were considered part of the VIIIth Olympic Summer Games. EF. Rare. (\$375)

- c207. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 55mm, by A. Rivaud. Legend surrounded by sports equipment. Rev. Winner helping fallen athlete back on his feet. Toned EF. (\$6,500)
- Boxed Participation Medal. Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. City view over French legend in three lines. Rev. Victory with laurel wreaths crowning victorious athletes. EF, in presentation box. (\$600)





- 209 **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. City view over French legend in three lines. Rev. Victory with laurel wreaths crowning victorious athletes. VF-EF, spotty. (\$300)
- 210. **Participant's Badge.** Partially enameled bronze, 34x42mm. Red enamel, rings in color. Numbered on back, with disk. Toned EF. (\$350)
- 211. "Swimming" Art Medal (1924). Bronze, 50mm, by Mascaux. Large fish swimming to right, swimmer below. Rev. Wreath of roses. Mascaux entered his sport medal series in the Olympic Art Exhibition and was awarded with an Olympic bronze medal. Official report p. 612 illustrated. EF. Very scarce. (\$450)
- 212. Moveable Soccer Player Sculpture with Soccer Ball. Silvered, 12.5cm (4.8") tall. Soccer player can be moved to kick the ball. On black wooden base. Abt. EF. (\$125)

- 215. **Eighth Olympic Congress in Prague Badge, 1925.** Bronze, 34x35mm. Bohemian lion over color enameled Olympic rings, surrounded by legend. Numbered. EF, traces of original closure on back. Replacement pin on back, o.w. EF. (\$150)
- 216. (Brochure) 24th IOC Session in Lisbon, 1926. Program, 4pp., 13x21.3cm (5.6"x8.4"), in French language. Session incl. study of Lawn Tennis Federation proposals, the upcoming Amsterdam Olympic Games, the African Games and the Central American Games. Bound in stiff covers, gilt, lt. foxing, contents EF. - 217. Second Place Silver Winner's Medal in the Second German (Olympic) Championships in Köln, 1926, Awarded for Weightlifting, Featherweight. Cast silvered bronze, 89mm, by Ernst Gorsemann. Two nude ringers in high relief. Rev. The cathedral in Köln, winner's legend engraved below. Gorsemann entered the medal in Amsterdam 1928 in the Olympic Art Competition. EF. (\$300)
- 218. (Brochure) Olympic Celebrations on the Occasions of the Executive Session of the IOC, and the 15th Anniversary of the Swiss NOC, Lausanne, 1927. 20pp., 16.1x23.1cm (6.3"x9"), in French. Many sport and cultural events, etc. Proceeds going to Swiss Olympic 1928 Fund. Stiff covers, lt. browning, VF-EF. (\$150)
