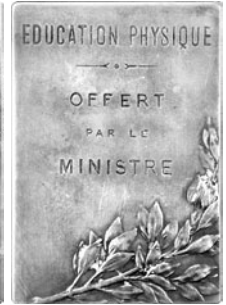

PARIS, 2nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1900

The 1900 Paris Olympic Games wer e held in conjunction with the World's Exposition. They played only a minor r ole. There were athletes who didn' t know that the events they participated in wer e Olympic Games events. Few items relate directly to the Games. For this reason we are also offering items commemorating the World Exposition.

- c234. **Cased Official Silver Plaque for the Olympic Games – Ex er cises Physiques et Sports..** Silvered bronze, 41x59mm, by F . Vernon. Fame scattering laurel branches o ver exposition. Rev. Victorious athlete on podium inscribed "Ex er cises Physiques et Sports". *This is the only plaque with the of ficial name of the Olympic Games during the World Exposition.* Housed in red case, lined in silk and v elvet, gold legend on top "Exposition Uni verselle. 1900". Case VF+, plaque toned EF. (\$2,000)
- 235. **Silver Winner's Plaque of the XXVIth F ederal Gymnastics Festival.** Silverplated bronze 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches o ver Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed "XXVIme Fêe Fédérale De Gymnastique" in 3 lines. Polished EF. (\$1,000)

- 240. **Bronze Award Medal of the Inter national Gymnastic Competition 1900.** Bronze, 48mm. Gymnastic equipment, laurel wreath above. Rev. "Concours International de Gymnastique 1900" over laurel and oak branch. Ball loop and ring at top. EF. (\$1,000)

241. **Official Canadian Participation at the Paris 1900 Exposition Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by P. Hebert. Bust l. of Canadian General Commissioner J.I. Tarte. Rev. Names of Canadian Fair officials over beaver and maple leaf branch. EF. (\$200)
- c242. **Morning Glory – Sculpture of the 1900 Paris World's Exposition.** Brown ceramic, 29cm (11.4”) high, by J. Ascoli. Art Nouveau-style bust of a young girl with flowing hair on an oval flower base inscribed “Liseron” (Morning Glory). “Exposition Universelle de Paris 1900” on back and maker's mark. *The World's Fair exhibited and sold works of art, and the awarded prizes consisting of art work were purchased here.* Lt. wear, abt. EF. (\$950)

ST. LOUIS, 3rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1904

The 1904 Olympic Games in St. Louis were also held in conjunction with a World's Fair. This, again, detracted a lot from the importance of the Games. Few items are available that relate directly to the Olympiad, and they usually command very high prices. For this reason we are also offering some memorabilia from the World's Fair which celebrated the Centennial of the Louisiana Purchase from Napoleon in 1803.

- c243. **Cased Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded in the All-Around Championship on July 4, 1904, to Adam Gunn, USA.** Silvered copper, 45mm, by Dieges & Clust, New York. Fortune on wheel extending wreath, logo of the Amateur Athletic Union of the U.S. Rev. Engraved “All Around Championship”, sport equipment below (tennis racket, baseball bat and baseball, rudders, bicycle wheel, etc.), laurel leaves at top. With red-white-blue ribbon, suspended from bar “1904 Universal Exposition, Olympic Games St. Louis”. *“The all-around was the early forerunner of the decathlon and consisted of 10 events held in one day... The event was held in July, as part of the gymnastics championships.” (Bill Mallon, the 1904 Olympic Games). According to IOC rules, all athletic events held during the course of the World's Fair were to be called “Olympic Games”.* Housed in red leather case, scuffed. Toned EF. (\$8,500)
- c244. **Silver Second Place Winner's Medal in the AAU 880 Yards Run.** Silvered copper, 45mm, by Dieges & Clust, New York. Fortune on wheel extending wreath, logo of the Amateur Athletic Union of the U.S. Rev. Engraved “880 Yds Run”, sport equipment below (tennis racket, baseball bat and baseball, rudders, bicycle wheel, etc.), laurel leaves at top. With red-white-blue ribbon, suspended from bar “1904 Universal Exposition, Olympic Games St. Louis”. *The AAU championships were held on June 4, 1904, and Charles Bacon won second place in the 880 Yards Run. According to IOC rules, all athletic events held during the course of the World's Fair were to be called “Olympic Games”.* EF. (\$7,500)
- c245. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 40x40mm, made by Dieges & Clust, New York. Nude athlete striding r., laurel branch in hand. Rev. Legend in eleven lines, shields of St. Louis, France and U.S.A. between ivory leaves. With loop and ring. Toned EF. Very rare. (\$18,750)
246. **Official Silver Souvenir Medal of the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair.** Silvered, 34mm. Conjoined busts l. of Napoleon and Jefferson. Rev. Map of U.S. with Louisiana Territory purchased in 1803. EF. (\$200)
- c247. **St. Louis 1904 Flag Pin.** Gilt aluminum, 18x16mm. EF. (\$100)
- c248. **Commemorative St. Louis 1904 Enameled Spoon.** Multicolor enamel, 5.4x12.5cm (2.1”x4.9”). Crescent with star in center and inscribed Arabic name “Abd Alnoor Dsubi”, surrounded by flowers, “St. Louis 1904” on handle. Beautiful style. EF. (\$250)

- 250a. **Nordic Games Gold Participant's Pin.** Goldplated copper, 19mm, by Sporrang. Skier between “Nordiska Spelen 1905”. *The Nordic Games were the first international winter sport competition, held in 1901, 1903, 1905, 1909, 1913, 1917, 1922 and 1926, all but 1903 (Oslo) in Stockholm. They were organized by Victor Balck, IOC member and Swedish NOC member, and were a predecessor to the Olympic Winter Games whose success in 1924 contributed to the discontinuation of the Nordic Games.* EF. 251. **Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath over phoenix emerging from flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. Greek legend in wreath. “1906” addition missing showing original “1896” date. (\$800)
252. **Official Victory and Olympic Stadium Medal.** Silver, 24mm. Winged Nike, Goddess of Victory. Rev. Aerial view of Olympic stadium. Toned EF. With loop and ring. (\$250)

254. **Commemorative Olympic Games in Athens 1906 Medal.** Bronze, 35mm. Engraved facing bust, "19.06" above. Rev. "Olympic Games Athens 1906" engraved in Greek in 4 lines. With loop and ring. Toned EF. (\$275)
255. **Olympic Trials 1906 in Rome Medal for the Athens 1906 Olympic Games.** Bronze, 26mm. Helmeted head r. Rev. Olympic Games in Athens 1906 trials. VF-EF, with lt. blue moirée ribbon. (\$325)
- c256. **Beautiful Trophy of Hermes Carrying the World Presented to a Greek Gold Medal Winner in Rope Climbing, Georjos Alliprantis.** Silver and silverplated sculpture, 64.2cm (25.3") high, made by WMF (Germany). Hermes wearing his winged hat and draped with a cloth, holding the world with Western and Eastern hemispheres on his head; wearing his winged sandals he is standing on a rock on top of an ornately decorated base. The globe is goldplated on the inside, topped by a winged figure of Nike, the Goddess of Victory, extending a wreath in her r. hand. The globe is inscribed in 7 lines in Greek language. With a color postcard of Georgios Aliprantis, gold medal winner in Rope Climbing on April 13, 1906. His brother Nikolaos placed 7th in the same event. See photo in Lennartz, Borgers and Höfer book, Olympic Victories, page 133, which shows Aliprantis with the sculpture on a table. EF. A beautiful and unique award. (\$25,000)

260. **Official Plaque of the Franco-British Exposition Held in Conjunction with the Olympic Games, 1908.** Bronze, 57x69mm, by Ch. Pillet. Britannia extending hand to Gallia across the British Channel. Rev. Seated Peace holding 2 flags over view of exposition grounds with Olympic Games stadium. This is the only medallic illustration of the Olympic stadium in 1908. EF. (\$450)
- c261. **Handpainted and Enamelled IOC Presentation Box (1985).** Multicolor enameled copper, 6cm (2.4"), made by Crummles, England. Hurdler, from cover of 1908 programs. EF. (\$225)
- c262. **Diploma of Merit Awarded to Otto Scheff, Austria, 100-Meter Swimming Freestyle.** 44x30cm (17.3"x11.8"), designed by Bernard Partridge. Victory with wreath between Hellas and Britannia, athlete seated on r., winner's medal below, athletes on sides. Signed by Lord Desborough, President of the British Olympic Council. Scheff inscribed it "To my friend Felix for remembrance/Otto Scheff" (translated from German). *The Merit diploma was presented to outstanding athletes who did not win a medal. Scheff won a bronze medal in 400-Meter Freestyle Swimming; he won gold for the same event in Athens 1906, also bronze in the 1-Mile Freestyle in 1906.* Folded twice, creases, but professionally mounted on linen, VF-EF. (\$2,500)
263. **Arena Stadium Ticket, July 21, 1908,** between 11 am and 6 pm. Red stock paper, 11.5x20.5cm (4.5"x8.1"). Logo of British Olympic Council at top. Lower l. corner crease, traces of mounting on back, o.w. EF. Very rare. (\$1,000)
