## PARIS, 2nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1900

The 1900 Paris Olympic Games wer e held in conjunction with the World's Exposition. They played only a minor $r$ ole. There were athletes who didn't know that the e vents they participated in were Olympic Games e vents. Few items relate directly to the Games. For this reason we are also offering items commemorating the World Exposition.

## ST. LOUIS, 3rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1904

The 1904 Olympic Games in St. Louis wer e also held in conjunction with a World's Fair. This, again, detracted a lot from the importance of the Games. Few items are available that relate directly to the Oly mpiad, and they usually command very high prices. For this reason we are also offering some memorabilia from the World's Fair which celebrated the Centennial of the Louisiana Purchase from Napoleon in 1803.

"The all-around was the early for erunner of the decathlon and consisted of 10 events held in one day... The event was held in July, as part of the gymnastics c hampionships." (Bill Mallon, the 1904 Olympic Games). According to IOC rules, all athletic e vents held during the cour se of the World's Fair were to be called "Olympic Games". Housed in red leather case, scuffed. c244. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal in the AAU 880 Yards Run. Silvered copper, 45 mm , by Die ges \& Clust, Ne w York. The AAU championships were held on June 4, 1904, and Charles Bacon won second place in the 880 Yards Run. They were organized by Victor Balck, IOC member and Swedish NOC member, and were a predecessor to the Olympic Winter Games whose success in 1924 contributed to the discontinuation of the Nor dic Games. Victory with wreath between Hellas and Britannia, athlete seated on r., winner's medal below, athletes on sides. Signed by Lord Desborough, President of the British Olympic Council. Scheff inscribed it "T o my friend Felix for remembrance/Otto Scheff" (translated from German). The Merit diploma was pr esented to outstanding athletes who did not win a medal. Sc heff won a bronze medal in 400-Meter Freestyle Swimming; he won gold for the same e vent in Athens 1906, also bronze in the 1-Mile F reestyle in 1906. Folded twice, creases, but professionally mounted on linen, VF-EF. $\mathbf{( \$ 2 , 5 0 0 )}$
