





- c511. **Cased Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Swimming 4x100 Meter Medley Relay.** Silver, 66mm, by G. Marcks. Victory seated over stadium. Rev. Castor and Pollux, patrons of competitive sport and friendship. Toned EF, in presentation case and paper slipcover. **(\$8,500)**
- 512. **Silver Medal Winner's Pin Presented by the IOC.** Silvered, 13x15mm. Unc. Numbered, in black plastic wallet. **(\$225)**
- 513. **Official Bronze Winner's Miniature Lapel Pin.** Bronze, 12x12mm. Spiral, logo of Munich Games. Presented to bronze medal winners together with the winner's medal. EF. **(\$250)**

c541. **Dorothy Hamill Doll, Gold Medal Winner in Figure Skating.** Bendable rubber, 32cm (12.6") tall, made by Ideal Toy Corp. Dorothy is shown with her "gold" medal, wearing skates and standing on ice rink, 14x23cm (5.5"x9.1"), with turntable that lets her do real spins. With 4-page brochure. EF. (\$175)

c542. **Large Mascot Schneemandel** 19cm (7.5") tall. Smiling felt-covered snowman welcoming visitors with open arms. EF, in pictorial original box. (\$200)

543. **Commemorative Skier Plate.** Blue and white porcelain, 18.2cm (7.2"), designed by Sven Vestergaard, made by Royal Copenhagen. Downhill skier in Alpine mountains between legend. EF. (\$100)



**MONTREAL, 21st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1976**

Designed by Michel Dallaire. *The flame was carried from Olympia, Greece to Athens where it was transferred by satellite to Ottawa; 245 runners carried it to Montreal.* Abt. EF, a few sm. paint chips. (\$6,750)

c547. **Second Place Silver Team Dressage Award for the Horse.** Logo button in center surrounded by red rosette, 16.8cm (7"). With 2 long red ribbons and white ribbon with gold award legend in French and English. The equestrian won also gold in Individual Dressage in Montreal. Very decorative award for the proud horse! EF (\$3,000)

548. **Pattern Participation Medal.** Copper-nickel, 80mm (by P.-Y. Pelletier). Montreal logo over "Montreal 1976", surrounded by "XXIe OLYMPIADE CANADA". Rev. "Copyright 72 COJO 1976". EF. Unique. (\$500)



549. **Cased Participation Medal.** Copper, 45mm, by G. Huel/P.-Y. Pelletier. Montreal Olympic stadium over French legend in two lines. Rev. Montreal Olympic emblem, a stylized "M" above Olympic rings. EF, in black leather case. (\$350)
