MOSCOW, 22nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1980

- 565. Cased Participation Medal. Tombac, 60mm, by A. Leonova. Moscow Olympic emblem over Olympic stadium. Rev. View of Red Square in Moscow. EF, cased. (\$250)
- c566. United States Olympic Team for Moscow 1980 Medal. Goldplated bronze, 75mm, by Tiffany & Co. Flaming torch between rings and "1980", United States Olympic Team" above. Rev. Five doves flying towards "Games of the XXII Olympiad". With fob and tricolor ribbon in American colors. *This medal, styled lik e a winner's medal,* was presented to American 1980 Moscow team member s by the United States Olympic Committee after President Carter decided to boycott the Moscow Olympic Games in protest of the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan. - 567. Torch Bearer Medal. Bronze, 50mm. Mosco w logo. Rev. Torch relay logo. EF. (\$125)

- Participation Medal. Bronze, 60x66mm uniface, by N. Mitric. Stylized "Sarajevo 84", within circle, abo ve Sarajevo Olympic emblem. EF, cased. (\$500)
- c582. Plush Mascot Voochko the Wolf. 27cm (10.6"), by Tik-Tik, Yugoslavia. Dark brown plush with lighter brown nose, ears, and paws. EF. (**\$200**)

LOS ANGELES, 23rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1984

- 583. Official Torch. Brass-finished aluminum with tan leather handle, length 56.5cm (22.4"). Bowl portrays Olympic rings, motto and L.A. Memorial Coliseum Stadium. Flame lit in Olympia, Greece on May 7, 1984, and it arrived in New York the following day. It took 82 days to carry the flame through 33 states, 9,375 miles, to Los Angeles. Leather handle partially faded, o.w. EF. (\$3,500)
- 584. **Salvador Dali Equestrian Ev ent Large Silver Medal.** 47mm, by Salvador Dali. Equestrian jumping o ver hurdle. Rev. U.S. Olympic Committee Logo. Unc., in capital plastic holder, as made. **(\$225)**
- 585. Bronze Pin Presented with the Olympic Order in Br onze. 13x13mm. Olympic rings in open olive leaf wreath. Housed in green case lined in velvet. Rare. The Olympic Order is presented no longer in bronze. EF. (\$300)
- c586. Japanese Team Volleyball Uniform. Red and white jack et and pants, plus two white T-shirts. Medium size. EF. (4 pcs.) (\$225)
- 587. Commemorative Colorful Events Beer Stein with P ewter Top. Gray and dark blue ceramic, 16.4 (6.5") high, designed by Craig Calsbeek, made by Thewalt, W. Germany. Four colorful images of athletics, water sports, gymnastics and ball g ames (soccer, basketball, baseball, etc.) Numbered. EF. (\$100)

CALGARY, 15th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1988

- 589. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 64mm, by C. Martens. Calgary Olympic emblem, stylized sno wflake design. Rev. Olympic motto under panorama of Calg ary and Rocky Mountains. EF, in presentation case. **(\$400)**
- 590. Identity Card of J an Behrendt, German Democratic Republic, Silver Medal Winner in Two-Men Luge. 9.5x14cm (3.7"x5.5"). Behrendt won gold in Albertville 1992 and Na gano 1998, also Br onze in Lillehammer. EF. (\$250)

SEOUL, 24th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1988

- c591. **Official Torch.** Brass, 50cm (20"), with tan leather handle, designed by Lee Woo-Sing. Bowl depicts dragons, Seoul Olympic logo enameled in color below. Used in the torch relay event, darkening around the top, lt. wear, discoloration on leather handle. (\$5,000)
- c592. Official Commemorative Torch. As preceding torch, but 41cm (16.1") tall. On black pedestal and torch podium, 14.5x14.5cm (5.7"x5.7"), 11cm (4.3") high. With brass "Miniature Torch" plaque on front, numbered. EF. (\$2,500)
- c593. Official Volunteer's and Press Medal. Octagonal bronze, 6.5x6.5cm. Ancient archer on horseback. Re v. Logo over stadium. EF, in blue velvet case. EF. (\$100)

- 594. Salvador Dali 1988 Official USOC Team Medal Set. Silver, 30mm each. Set is comprised of one Winter 1988 skiing medal, and four Summer 1988 medals, equestrian, track and field, swimming/diving, and archery. Each medal is in a capital plastic holder , housed in a black case (top almost detached). Medals Unc. Scarce set. (\$500)
- 595. U.S. Team Medal Set. Silver, 39mm, by Deak International. Featured are Tennis, Equestrian, Swimming and Hurdles, plus Skiing for Calgary Winter Games. Rev. USOC logo. Proof, Unc., in blue velvet case. (5 pcs.) (\$200)
- 596. Commemorative Gold Runners Medal, 1988. Goldplated white metal, 80mm (3.2"). Runners in stadium. Re v. Large flower surrounded by Korean legend. EF/VF. (\$100)
- 597. **'88 Nagoya Bid Medal.** Silvered, 65mm. Red and white enameled "'88 Nagoya" bid logo. Rev. "1988 Olympic Council Nagoya, Japan" next to castle. EF, cased. Very scarce. **(\$225)**
- 598. Official Ancient Greek Olympic Bronze Helmet Made fr om the Mold of the Original Helmet Awarded as a Prize in Berlin 1936 to the Korean Marathon Winner Sohn Kee-chung. Cast bronze, 18.7x22cm (7.4"x8.7"), 27cm (10.6") tall. The Olympic Helmet was found in 1875 by aGerman archeological team in Olympia, Greece. The team took the helmet to Berlin. One theory says the purpose of the helmet was to dedicate the Olympic Games to Zeus along with giving thanks for victory Another theory states that the helmet was worn by Olympic competitor s who fought against each other on horses. In July 1936, Vradyni newspaper in Athens announced that the Olympic Helmet would be presented to the winner of the marathon in Berlin. Son, the K orean winner, won it, b ut it was not



by computer graphics and laser technology. The Korean government insisted on the return of the Olympic helmet and of the mold. Repr oductions were originally made only for museums, then a small number was also made for sale to the public to promote the spirit of the Olympic Games of Seoul 1988. EF. Rare. (\$2,500)
