







They were organized by Victor Balck, IOC member and Swedish NOC member, and were a predecessor to the Olympic Winter Games whose success in 1924 contributed to the discontinuation of the Nordic Games. Antwerp Organizing Committee Official Report in Fr ench Language. Rapport Officiel des Jeux de la VIIME Olympiade **Anvers 1920.** Brown cloth and marbled boards with marbled end papers, typescript of 180 pages, 21. 7x28.4.cm (8.5"x11.2"). The Organizing Committee had prepared this e xtensive official report for publication when it went bankrupt, and the report was never published. Only a few of these original typescripts exist. The two pages of contents are sho wn in the illustration above. The report is augmented by the 2 -page Speech to the Athletes held by Cardinal Mercier in the Antwerp Cathedral on the Opening of the Games on August 14, 1920, and a 5-page speech by Pierre de Coubertin held at the opening of the 18th IOC Session on August 17, 1920. A preface by the Secretary General, A. Verdyck conclude the additions in the beginning of the report Verdyck indicates that the regulations need to be developed further, and suggestions will be presented by Belgian NOC members at the ne xt IOC Congress (held in 1921). Tipped-in at the end of the report is the illustration of the Olympic medal instituted by King Albert in 1922, and a fold -out plan of the Olympic stadium with tick et prices on the back. Ex -library. Light browning of the pages, o.w. EF. Extremely rare report, and the first we have ever offered. (\$25,000)
