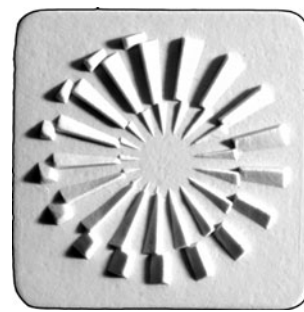

545. **Iraq NOC Plaque.** Gilt, multicolor enamel, 10.2x12.8cm (4"x5"), by Picchiani E Barlacchi, Florence. Olympic flame over color rings. EF, in presentation case (scuffed). **(\$175)**
546. **Desk-Top Japanese Team Medal.** Bronze, 70mm, by Taro. Victorious runner at finish. Mascot Waldi over Olympic stadium. In clear acrylic case, 13cm (5.1") high. EF. **(\$150)**
- c547. **Commemorative Munich and the Olympic Stadium Gold Medal.** Gold, "999.99", 39mm, 15.3 grams, signed "HH". View of Munich. Rev. Aerial view of the Olympic site with stadium and tower. EF. **(\$750)**
548. **Italian NOC Merit Medal, ND.** Silvered, 40mm, by Greco. Bust of athlete with torch, head facing r. Rev. Italian NOC logo. In dark blue wallet with white CONI logo. Unc. **(\$100)**

561. **Paavo Nurmi Memorial Medal, 1973.** Cast silver, 58mm, 256 grams (8.3 ounces), by Sporrang. Bust I. in high relief of famous Olympic runner in the 1920's (1897 – 1973). Re v. "Antwerpen-Paris-Amsterdam" Nurmi won 1500m in Paris 1924; 5000m in Paris 1924 and Amsterdam 1928; and 10000m in Antwerp 1920 and Amsterdam 1928. Numbered, limited edition. Housed in original wooden box with his name in gold. **(\$250)**
- c562. **7th Asian Games in Tehran, 1974. Official Presentation Plaque and Guest Badge.** Presentation plaque 12.1x15.1cm (4.8"x6"), made by Huguenin, Switzerland. Gold medallion in center "Seventh Asian Games Tehran 1974" surrounded by intricate gold and lilac enameled design. With stand on back. Housed in red leatherette case with gold legend, lined in red velvet and cream silk. And **Guest Badge**, 50mm, silvered and gilt, with yellow ribbon and "Guest" bar. Plus 65x20mm bronze plaque. 568. **The Official History of the Olympic Games 1896-1976. Set of 50 Sterling Silver Medals in Original Album.** Each medal 39mm, total weight 31.25 troy ounces, by Franklin Mint. Showcased are the best athletes in the history of the Olympic Summer and Winter Games including Spiridon Louis 1896, Johnny Weissmueller, Sonja Henie, Jesse Owens, Fanny Blankers-Koen, Emil Zatopek, Toni Sailer, Jean-Claude Killy, Bob Beaman, Olga Korbut, Nadia Komanecki. 579. **KGB Moscow Olympiad 1980 Merit Medal.** Bronze, 65mm. Facing head with hat, flaming torch behind. Reverse 5-line Russian merit legend over Olympic rings and Kremlin tower. EF. Very scarce. (\$250)
- c580. **Official Soviet Soccer Trophy Presented to the Third Place Winning Russian Olympic Soccer Team Members.** Brown ceramic, 25.2cm (9.9") tall. Large Moscow 1980 logo and soccer player between laurel branches, "Moscow 1980" in Cyrillic below. EF. Rare. (\$450)
- c581. **Commemorative Mascot Misha Soccer Plate.** Multicolor painted aluminum, 27.3cm (10.8"). Smiling Misha playing soccer, in flower field. EF. (\$150)
- c582. **Black Handpainted Russian Lacquer Box with Moscow Logo.** 17cm (6.7"). Red Moscow logo encircled by wreath of flowers, all painted by hand in the old Russian tradition. EF. (\$200)
583. **Large Commemorative Mascot Misha Clear Glass Plate.** 26cm (10.4"). Smiling Misha surrounded by flowers consisting of five rings, and "80". EF. (\$125)
584. **Commemorative Blue and White Porcelain Plate.** 19.4cm (7.6"), made by Berlin Design. View of Kremlin Basilica, Olympic rings and date below. EF. (\$100)
- c585. **Commemorative Sailor Doll, Tallinn 1980.** Hard rubber, 27cm (10.6") tall. Dressed as a sailor with hat, "Tallinn 1980" and rings patches on vest. Abt. EF. (\$125)

591. **Gold Press Medal.** Goldplated, 54mm. Text in 3 languages. Reverse Logo of Congress with "Presse". In original acrylic case, 10x10cm (3.9"x3.9"). EF. (\$150)
592. **'88 Nagoya Olympic Games Bid Medal (1981).** Silvered bronze, 65mm. Red and white enameled bid logo. Reverse Nagoya temple over flowers. *Seoul and Nagoya, Japan, were the only cities bidding for the 1988 Olympic Games. Seoul was awarded the 1988 Games in Baden-Baden.* EF, cased. (\$200)

SARAJEVO, 14th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1984

593. **Cased Large Size Participation Medal.** Bronze, 9.5x10.3cm (3.7"x4.1") uniface, by Nebojsa Mitric. Stylized "Sarajevo 84" above logo. One of only 100 medals presented to high officials. EF, in large presentation case. Very rare. (\$4,250)
594. **Participant's Badge.** Silvered, 30x30mm. With long orange ribbon. Elbel W-002. *This is the last of the Olympic badges, dating back to 1896.* EF. (\$150)



- 595. **Official Logo Enameled IOC Presentation Box (1984).** Multicolor enameled copper, 60mm, 33mm high, made by Crummls, England. Red logo over white and blue background. EF. (\$175)
- 596. **Identity Card of Olga Weiler-Pall, Austria, Head of Team.** Red and white, 7.2x13.3cm (2.8"x5.2"). Won Gold in Grenoble 1968 in Women's Downhill event. EF. (\$250)
- 597. **Ice Hockey Full Ticket, February 13, 1984, Zetra.** Orange and blue, 6.5x19.4cm (2.6"x7.8"). EF. (\$75)
- 598. **Third Paralympic World Winter Games in Innsbruck, Austria, 1984. Group of Three Winner's Medals.** Two silver medals, 60mm, awarded for **Alpine Skiing** in Mutters, and **Nordic Skiing** in Natters, and a **Bronze Medal for Nordic Skiing**. Medals show the Event. Rev. Logo. Plus a cased **Bronze Merit Medal**, 60mm, with logo, and a Starting Bib. All EF. (5 pcs.) (\$950)

LOS ANGELES, 23rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1984
 c599. **Gold Winner's Medal in Display Case.** Goldplated, 60mm. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant athletes, "Sample" on both sides. With multicolor ribbon. In Josten's original wooden display case with glass sides, inscribed bronze plaque on top. EF. (\$2,750)

- 600. **The Salvador Dali Olympic Collection of 11 Large Sport Silver Medals on the Occasion of the XXIII Olympiad Los Angeles 1984.** Silver, 45mm, "999", 46.2 grams each. Archer, soccer player, discus thrower, boxers, equestrian, gymnast, etc. Re v. Official emblem of the U.S Olympic Committee. EF, lt. cabinet friction. Each medal in clear plastic, housed in black leather case, 40x30cm (15.8"x11.8"), with nine descriptive cards. Rare set. (\$1,500)
- 601. **Participant's Pin Presented by the IOC.** Goldplated, 14x19mm. Unc. Numbered, in white plastic wallet. (\$100)
- 602. **Los Angeles 1984. Set of 29 Soviet Team Pins.** Gilt, 16x18mm (28 event pins) and 39x24mm (1 team badge), enameled in color. *The Soviet Union boycotted the Los Angeles 1984 Olympic Games.* All EF. (29 pcs.) A very rare set. (\$300)
