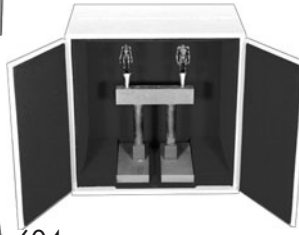

- c613. **Paralympic Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 63mm. Calgary logo. Rev. Flame on cauldron with Olympic rings, Braille legend around top. The events were disabled skiing; Alpine skiing and cross-country skiing. The Paralympic Games with the other Paralympic events were held in 1988 in Innsbruck, Austria. From 1992 on, the Paralympic Games were held in the same location as the Olympic Games. Small hole in top for loop, no ribbon. One of only 20 silver winner's medals. EF. Rare. (\$6,000)
- c614. **Silver Demonstration Event Winner's Medal.** Silver, 63mm. Calgary logo. Rev. View of curling, freestyle skiing and short-track speedskating. The medals were smaller in size, and only 34 silver medals were awarded. All three sports are part of the Olympic events since 1998. EF, no ribbon. Unawarded. (\$5,000)
