16. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60x48mm, by Julio Kilenyi. Winged figure of Fame blowing horn, Olympic rings above, winter landscape in background. Re v. Six winter sports depicted on shields around legend in six lines, scenes of curling and dogsledding below. Toned EF. **(\$8,500)**
17. **Garmisch-Partenkirchen 1936 Winter. Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 60mm, by M. Joerres. Alpine summit over Olympic rings within German legend. Rev. Olympic motto over fir branches. EF. **(\$2,500)**

18. **Berlin 1936. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Toned EF. **(\$6,000)**
19. **St. Moritz 1948 Winter. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 60mm, by Huguenin. Hand holding torch in raised design, Olympic rings and snowflakes in background. Re v. 4-line French legend between ice crystals. Lt. wear on highpoints on obverse, abt. EF/EF. Very rarely available. **(\$15,000)**
20. **Grenoble 1968 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Awarded for 1500M Speed Skating, Participation Medal and IOC Winner's Pin.** Bronze, 60mm, by Roger Excoffon. Logo within French legend. Rev. Depiction of a speed skater, "Patinage de Vitesse" (Speed Skating) below. Edge inscribed with winning event. With ribbon, in black leather presentation case, lined in red velvet and silk. Plus **Participation Medal** in cardboard box, and **IOC winner's pin** in black plastic with ribbon. Buyer will receive name of winner. All EF. (3 pcs.) **(\$10,500)**

21. **66th IOC Session in Grenoble Badge 1968.** Goldplated, rings in color, 23x45mm. French rooster on panel with Olympic rings and "C.I.O./66e Session/Grenoble 1968". Fifty IOC members were present. Rare. (\$2,500)
22. **Munich 1972. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Won by Vadim Gulyayev, Soviet Union, in Water Polo.** Goldplated silver, 66mm, by G. Marcks. Victory seated over stadium. Rev. Castor and Pollux, patrons of competitive sport and friendship. Edge inscribed "Vladimir Gulyayev-Schwimmen Wasserball". Loop replaced at top; with chain. EF. (\$8,500)
23. **Innsbruck 1976 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Bobsleigh.** Goldplated silver, 70mm, by M. Coufal. "BOB" over Bergisel ski jump, Olympic flame at r. Rev. Official logo and legend. With ribbon in Austrian colors, small spots, with red-white-red ribbon. Buyer will receive name of winner. Housed in blue leather presentation case with gold -stamped logo on top. Choice EF. (\$15,000)
24. **Lake Placid 1980 Winter. Official Torch.** Bronze-colored poly-aluminum top with a 15" leather handle, 73cm (24") long, designed by Don McFarland. The torch was lit on January 30 in Olympia, Greece and carried to Athens, then transported in a miner's lamp on a U.S. aircraft to Virginia. 52 runners representing all 50 states plus the District of Columbia and the host village of Lake Placid carried the torch in nine days to Lake Placid over approximately 1,000 miles (1600km). Very rare torch. EF. (\$39,000)

25. **Lake Placid 1980 Winter. Cased Bronze Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 80mm, by Tiffany & Co. Hand holding flaming torch, Whiteface Mountain in background. Rev. Logo over legend, large conifer branch at r. Unawarded. EF, with light blue and white striped ribbon. In dark blue leather case with embossed logo. (\$7,500)

26. **Moscow 1980. Cased Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Won by Lyudmila Kondratyeva, Soviet Union, in 100 Meter Track & Field. Goldplated silver, 60mm, by Ilya Postal. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Olympic flame over stadium; edge inscribed with event. *Kondratyeva won in 0.01 seconds before Marlies Goehr, East Germany.* Housed in presentation case with gold logo on top. EF. (\$10,000)
27. **Moscow 1980. Large Torch Relay Oil Painting in Blue** by Boris Talberg, 1979. Oil, 70x70cm (27.5"x27.5"). Running torchbearer with outstretched arms holding a flaming torch in his left hand, accompanied by two athletes. Study for the central gigantic triptych painting for the Hall of the Ministry of Culture in Moscow. Signed and dated on back. *Boris Talberg, a Russian monumental painter (1930-1979) is widely recognized worldwide.* EF. (\$4,000)
28. **Los Angeles 1984. Cased Gold Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 60mm, by Dugald Sterner. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. With tricolor ribbon. Unawarded. Housed in blue presentation case and cardboard box. EF. (\$6,500)
29. **Calgary 1988 Winter. Official Torch.** 60cm (23.6"), maplewood handle with pictograms of 10 Olympic winter sports, steel torch bowl. *The flame was flown from Athens, Greece to St. John, Newfoundland. In 88 days, it was carried about 18,000 km across Canada by 6,520 torchbearers sharing torches. Only about 100 torches were made. Very rare.* EF. (\$39,000)

30. **Barcelona 1992. Paralympic Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 70mm, by X. Corberro. Paralympic logo. Rev. "Paralimpics/Barcelona '92" over Braille legend. With ribbon in Olympic colors (pinholes). *Winners medals were not inscribed at the 1992 Olympic Games.* EF. (\$2,750)

31. **Atlanta 1996. Cased Paralympic Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 82mm (3.2"). Paralympic Atlanta 1996 logo and legend. Rev. Braille legend over Paralympic logo. Looped, with blue ribbon. In green cardboard presentation box with blue velvet insert. EF. (\$2,500)
32. **Sydney 2000. Cased Gold First Place Winner's Medal Won by Alvin Harrison, Men's 4x400 Meters Relay.** Goldplated pure silver, 68mm, by Wojciech Pietranik. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Olympic rings over Sydney opera house and Sydney torch. Last time the obverse design since 1928 Amsterdam was on a winner medal. A new design was introduced in Athens 2004 featuring the Athens Panathinaikon stadium, not the Coliseum in Rome. With blue ribbon embroidered in silver "SYDNEY 2000". Housed in round silver colored box with blue translucent top. Medal small rim bump on rev., EF. (\$10,000)
33. **Athens 2004. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Baseball.** Goldplated silver, 60mm, by Elena Votsi and Kostas Kazakos. Winged Nike over Panathinaikon Stadium, Acropolis in background. Rev. Athens 2004 logo and Olympic flame dividing 4-line Greek legend, sport in Greek language below. With multicolor ribbon. For the first time since Amsterdam 1928, the design of the winner's medals was changed. From now on the medals will reflect the fact that Greece was the country where the Olympic Games originated, and saw their revival. EF, small rim bump on rev. bottom. (\$9,500)

34. **David Beckham Autographed Soccer Ball.** Made by Adidas, Size 5. Signed with a gold pen. With certificate of authenticity. EF. (\$950)
35. **Sochi 2014 Winter. Official Torch.** Aluminum and polymer, partially red, 95cm (37.4") high, 14.5cm (5.7") wide, designed by Vladimir Pirozhkov and Andrei Vodyanik. The design of the torch reminds of the feather of the Firebird, a magical bird in Russian folklore. The fire was lit on September 29, 2013 in Olympia; the torch relay started in Russia on October 7, reached the North Pole on October 20, was flown into space by a Soyuz rocket, reached Europe's highest mountain (Mount Elbrus) and the world's deepest lake (Lake Baikal). It ended at the opening ceremony on February 7, 2014, in Sochi. EF. (\$5,000)
