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**TERMS OF SALE**  
**(Please read carefully before bidding.)**

**The auction will be conducted in accordance with the terms set forth below. Bidding in the sale constitutes acceptance of all terms stated herein.**

(1) **BIDDING.** Bids by phone, fax, e-mail and mail will be accepted until 11 p.m. Pacific Standard Time, on Saturday, March 28, 2015. All e-mail bids will be acknowledged. E-mail bids which have not been acknowledged have not been received. Phone bids must be confirmed in writing upon request. Auctioneer reserves the right to extend bidding. Lots will be sold to the highest bidder. In the case of tie bids, the first bid received will normally be given preference. Auctioneer has sole discretion to make the determination of the winning bid.

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(2) **MODIFICATION.** The catalog is incorporated in and deemed a part of these Terms of Sale. Auctioneer has the absolute right to modify the terms of sale at any time. Bidding after notification of modification constitutes acceptance of modification. Auctioneer has the absolute right to conduct the auction as auctioneer may decide, including the right to decline bids for any reason and from any person, to decline challenges to bids or bidding increments and to make the final determination of all disputes by any method auctioneer deems appropriate. No bidder shall have a claim or recourse against auctioneer for loss or damage due to modification, auctioneer mistake, departure from stated terms of sale, method of dispute resolution or result thereof.

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(4) **PRICE. Payment in full is due upon receipt of invoice.** A 15% Buyer's Fee will be added to the successful bid price of each lot. Handling, shipping, sales tax for California residents, insurance, and all other costs associated with shipping will be added to the invoice. A \$1 handling charge per lot may be added to bulky lots (books, large plates, sculptures, etc.) California sales tax will be added to the invoice of California residents unless a valid resale number is on file with the auctioneer; however, buyer is solely responsible for and agrees to pay all sales or other applicable tax due by virtue of the sale and shall indemnify and hold auctioneer harmless therefore, including penalties or interest assessed, regardless of whether or not taxes were included on the invoice or correctly calculated by the auctioneer.

(5) **PAYMENT.** Payment must be in U.S. funds payable by check drawn on a U.S. bank or by wire transfer to auctioneer's account, by credit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover) or Paypal. Wiring instructions should be requested from auctioneer before funds are wired. A 3.5% convenience charge (4% for overseas purchases) will be added to credit card or Paypal purchases except where prohibited by law. Bidders may be asked for satisfactory credit references or a deposit of funds prior to bidding.

(6) **DEFAULT.** If buyer fails to make payment in full within 30 days of the invoice date or to timely comply with any other term of sale, then, in addition to all other remedies available at law or in equity, auctioneer may, at auctioneer's option: (a) charge 1.5% monthly interest on unpaid amounts; (b) if payment is not received in a timely manner, auctioneer may resell the lot(s) and recover from buyer the difference between the proceeds and buyer's indebtedness in excess of the proceeds, which indebtedness shall include the successful bid price, Buyer's Fee and all other expenses incurred by auctioneer from the date of sale until resale on accounts of such lot(s), including attorney fees, transportation, handling, storage, insurance, collection and resale costs. Proceeds collected in excess of buyer's indebtedness shall belong to auctioneer; (c) pursue collection efforts and/or recover from buyer all costs incurred by auctioneer as a result of buyer's default from date of default, including attorney fees, transportation, handling, storage and insurance costs; and (d) sue for damages. Amounts charged hereunder are immediately due and payable. Buyer waives all requirements of notice, advertisement, bidding rights, rights to proceeds and all other rights with respect to the sale of a lot purchased by buyer except as prohibited by law. Auctioneer's rights and remedies stated in this section and elsewhere in this agreement are cumulative and the exercise of one shall not operate to the exclusion of another.



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(10) RETURNS. Auctioneer shall not be liable for any item returned without auctioneer's prior written approval. Items must be returned in their original container and in the same condition as sold to buyer in the manner and at the time specified by auctioneer in writing. Late remittance, removal from the original container or return in a condition other than as sold to buyer constitutes just cause for revocation of all return rights, based on warranty or otherwise, and buyer shall no further rights or remedies under this agreement, at law or in equity. Refunds will not be made until items have been received and inspected to auctioneer's satisfaction. Refunds are conditioned upon buyer's execution prior to payment of any documents requested by auctioneer to effect the intent of this paragraph.

(11) BIDDER'S RELEASE. **THE TERM BIDDER AS USED IN THIS RELEASE REFERS TO BIDDERS AND BUYERS ALIKE. EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY PROVIDED HEREIN, BIDDING IN THE SALE CONSTITUTES AN UNCONDITIONAL RELEASE BY BIDDER OF AUCTIONEER AND AUCTIONEER'S AFFILIATES, SUBSIDIARIES, SUCCESSORS, MEMBERS, MANAGERS, EMPLOYEES AND AGENTS AND THEIR HEIRS, LEGAL REPRESENTATIVES AND ASSIGNS (COLLECTIVELY, "AUCTIONEER'S AFFILIATES"), FROM ALL CLAIMS, DEMANDS, SUITS, ACTIONS, OBLIGATIONS, LIABILITIES, LOSSES AND DAMAGES OF ANY KIND OR NATURE WHATSOEVER, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO SPECIAL, INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, INDIRECT OR SIMILAR DAMAGES (COLLECTIVELY "CLAIMS"), ARISING OUT OF OR RELATING TO, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, THE AUCTION, THESE TERMS OF SALE OR MODIFICATION THEREOF, THE BIDDING PROCESS, DENIAL OF BID, TITLE, CONDITION, QUALITY OR DESCRIPTION OF ANY LOT OR AUCTIONEER OR AUCTIONEER'S AFFILIATES' NEGLIGENCE, GROSS NEGLIGENCE, MISTAKE, MISREPRESENTATION, BREACH OF CONTRACT, BREACH OF WARRANTY OR ANY OTHER ACT OR OMISSION WHETHER SOUNDING IN CONTRACT, TORT, IN EQUITY OR OTHERWISE. Auctioneer may, at auctioneer's option, offer a remedy to buyer but in no event shall buyer have any entitlement or right to any remedy from auctioneer unless stated in a writing signed by auctioneer and buyer.

# Highlights of the Auction



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1. **Albertville 1992 Winter. Official Torch.** Steel, 42cm (16.5"), up to 8cm (3.2") wide, designed by famous French designer Philippe Starck. The torch, when turned over, has the shape of a flame. *The flame was lit in Olympia on November 27, 1991, when the relay through Greece started. It left Greece on December 8 on the Concorde to visit about 70 countries and islands worldwide, to arrive in Paris on December 14. 5,500 torchbearers carried the flame 5,536 km (3,440 miles) around France to Albertville where the cauldron was lit at the opening ceremony on February 8, 1992, by Michel Platini and Françoise-Cyrille Grange, a Savoyard girl.* One of only 100 torches (numbered) and very difficult to find. EF. **(\$75,000)**

## THE MOST IMPORTANT PHOTOGRAPHIC RECORD OF THE FIRST MODERN OLYMPIC GAMES, 1896

2. **Meyer, Albert. Album with 25 Photographs of the Athens 1896 Olympic Games.** Platinotypes, 13.7x10cm (5.4"x3.9") to 16.7x23.1cm (6.6"x9.1"), mounted on 22 loose cardboards, 33.3x27cm (13.1"x10.6"), each with the photographer's blind stamp: "Albert Meyer/BERLIN", with handwritten titles in German. Album original leather embossed with a crocodile pattern, seven tack holes, silk doublures, title in gold on cover. "Olympische Spiele / Athen 1896" and imprint inside: "Albert Meyer/Hof-Photograph / Sr. Majestät des Königs von Sachsen / Sr. Hon. D. Herzogs von Sachsen Meiningen / BERLIN W / Potsdamer-Str. 125" in gold. Meyer, one of only seven photographers accredited in Athens 1896, made a small number of luxurious albums for presentation.

According to Volker Kluge these albums contained 25 to 30 platinotypes. Meyer's firm closed in the early 20th century and the archives were destroyed during WWII. Platinotype was the most expensive photographic technique of the day.

The albums that Albert Meyer produced for presentation are of the utmost rarity. He presented them to some European Kings and Princes, only in order to receive in return honorary distinctions ("court titles" and medals). Furthermore, he apparently sold to the public only reduced copies of his platinotypes in the cabinet card format. Volker Kluge was able to locate a total of 7 albums worldwide, which are to be found: in the Olympic Museum in Lausanne (from Coubertin's possession), in the Benaki Museum in Athens (from the possessions of George Streit, Secretary of the Organizing Committee of 1896), in the Bibliothèque Royale de Belgique, in the Frederiksborg National Historical Museum (from the possessions of King Christian IX), in Coburg Castle (from the possessions of the Duke of Sachsen-Altenburg), in Sofia, Bulgaria (probably from the possessions of the King of Bulgaria) and in the Sportmuseum in Leipzig (from the photographer's grandson). The present album is the last album of this type still in private hands.

No Meyer's album seems to have ever been sold at auction. A group of 28 of his platinotypes, in the much smaller cabinet card formation, sold in Auction 70, lot 105 for \$50,600. Only about 100 photos taken by the seven photographers are known today. The album covers are soiled and slightly worn, VF. The 25 photos and the 22 cardboards are in excellent condition. **(\$65,000)**

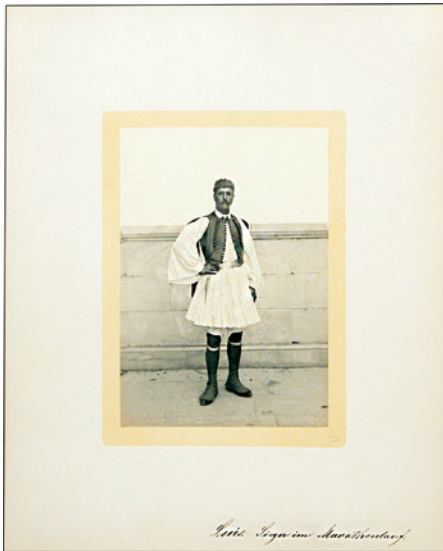

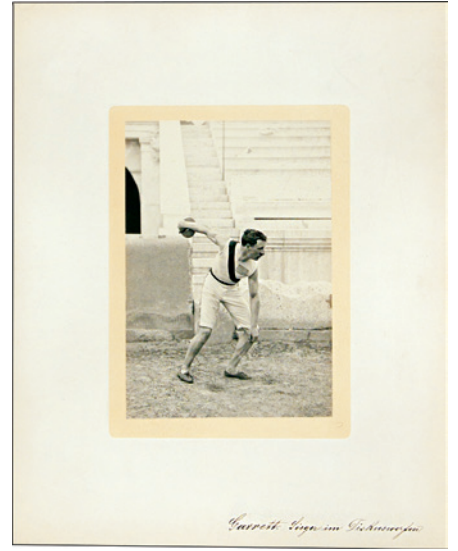

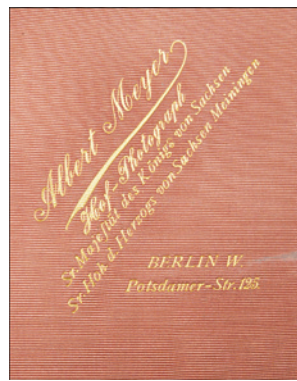

3. **Ancient Greek Strigil Used by Wrestlers and Other Athletes.** Bronze, 23cm (9.1") long, 10cm wide at curved top. Greek wrestlers, also at Olympic Games, used to cover their bodies with oil supplied by a gymnasiard (in charge of a gymnasium) before a match. Afterwards they scraped the oil and dirt on their bodies off with a strigil, and they are sometimes shown on ancient Greek pottery. Oxidized, VF. Rare. **(\$2,250)**
4. **Paris 1900. French Team(?) Pin.** Bronze, 37x36mm. French rooster facing color-enameled shield, "EU" (=Exposition Universelle) over rising sun. EF. Rare. **(\$500)**
5. **Paris 1900. Official Poster.** Lithograph, designed by Jean Pal, printed by Chardin, Paris, 110.5x144.8cm (43.5"x57"). Female fencer holding foil, épée and sabre, legend above and at left. Olympism Through Posters p. 12/13. Professionally linen-matted and wooden framed, under glass. EF. Rare. **(\$8,500)**

6. **London 1908. Organizing Committee Badge.** Silvered bronze, 57mm, by Vaughton. Helmeted head of Athena l. facing laurel branch, surrounded by blue enameled band with legend. Elbel S-8. EF. Rare. **(\$4,000)**
7. **London 1908. Hungarian Team Pin.** Bronze, 37x28mm. Two angels supporting Hungarian shield, ribbon below with "Olympiai Játékok 1908". Toned EF. Very rare. **(\$1,000)**
8. **Stockholm 1912. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 33mm, by Erik Lindberg and Bertram MacKernal, struck by Sporrang & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. EF. **(\$5,750)**
9. **Stockholm 1912. Official Poster in French Language.** 75x105cm (29.1"x41.3"), designed by Olle Hjörtzberg, Swedish Professor at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts, printed by A. Bortzells, Stockholm. Nude young men waving flags of participating nations, legend in French below. *At the time, the design was considered too daring by some countries, and the poster and seals with this design were not distributed in the respective countries.* Olympism p. 20/21. A few marginal tears, center crease, lined on linen, VF-EF. Very scarce poster. **(\$3,500)**
10. **Antwerp 1920. Cased Gold First Place Sailing Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 60mm. by Dupon. Nude victorious athlete with palm branch and laurel wreath, fame blowing horn. Rev. View of Antwerp. *The medal was won by Ole Sørensen in Sailing 10 meter type 1907 in the Norwegian ship "Eleda".* Housed in original red leatherette case with gold legend on top, top detached. Medal choice EF, rarely seen with full original goldplating. **(\$8,000)**





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11. **Chamonix 1924 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 55mm, by Raoul Benard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. An extremely rare winner's medal from the First Olympic Winter Games. EF. Very rare (\$35,000)
12. **Chamonix 1924 Winter. Participant's Badge.** Silvered, 41mm. "CONCURRENT" on blue enamel. With screw back (gold color), numbered. Elbel W-1. Toned EF. Very rare. (\$9,000)

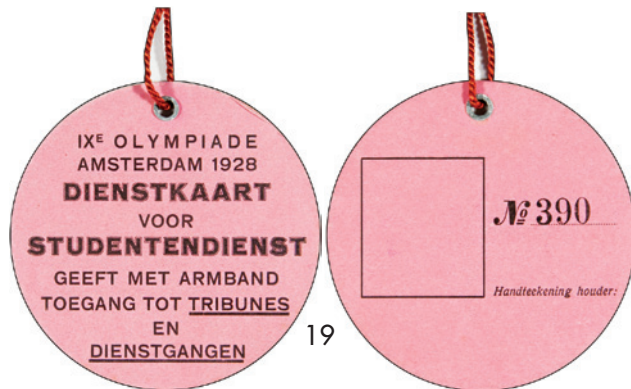
13. **Paris 1924. Official Poster Depicting Olympic Salute Athletes.** Multicolor lithograph, designed by Jean Droit, printed by Machard et Cie, Paris, 73.7x91.4cm (29"x36"). One of two official posters for the Paris Games. Professionally linen matted and framed, under glass. EF. Rare. (\$6,000)
14. **Paris 1924. Official Olympiad National Subscription Poster by the Interior Ministry, Paris 1924.** 42x54cm (16.5"x21.3"), by Renee Baudichon. Olympic motto at top intertwined with color Olympic rings (first time shown on a poster!), large javelin thrower behind legend below – the French President being patron of the subscription to raise funds for the Olympic Games, Paris city shield at bottom. Encircled by tricolor French lines. Light creases, folded twice, sm. chip on lower left corner, o.w. VF+. Rare and important poster. (\$1,250)
15. **St. Moritz 1928 Winter. Daily Ticket Nr. 339, Wednesday, February 15, 1928, I. Rang, Tribune, Price Fr. 20.-, Olympic Stadium, 45x65mm.** Skating Women Compulsory and Men, Skating Freestyle; and two hockey matches. With yellow-blue cord. EF. Rare. (\$1,250)
16. **Amsterdam 1928. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner being carried by jubilant teammates. From 1928 to 1968 the design by Giuseppe Cassioli was the official design of the summer winners medals. Unevenly toned EF. (\$6,000)
17. **Amsterdam 1928. Press Service Badge.** Light brown cardboard, 8.1cm (3.2"). Elbel unlisted. According to the Official Report in Dutch, pages 266/267, 109 service badges were issued for the porters of telegrams or helping journalists with various tasks, having access to the telephone and telegram office, and to the press tribune. Not valid for seating at tribunes. Numbered, with round blind stamp, and cord at top. EF, reverse discolored. Very rare, first time offered. (\$1,500)

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18. **Soigneur (Provider of Services to Athletes) Badge.** Orange cardboard, 8.1cm (3.2"). Space on reverse to note area of access. Unissued. Elbel unlisted. With string at top. EF. Very rare, first time offered. **(\$1,250)**
19. **Service Badge for Students.** Pink cardboard, 8.1cm (3.2"). Together with an armband it gives access to the Tribunes and Hallways. Numbered on back, unissued. Elbel unlisted. With cord at top. EF. Very rare, first time offered. **(\$1,250)**
20. **Amsterdam 1928. Group of 76 Original Glass Slides of the Amsterdam 1928 Olympic Games.** Each slide 10.2x8.3cm (4"x3.3"), almost all color-tinted. Opening ceremony (about seven) including oath of the athletes; groups of officials; almost all slides are from various athletic events: marathon; Williams, Canada, winning 200 Meters, and Canadian female team winning 4x100 Meters relay; 800 Meters; Paavo Nurmi, etc. Many relating to Canadians, also Canadian team photos of lacrosse, boxing, athletics, rowing and swimming. Housed in a wooden case (VF). Five slides have a hairline crack, 71 slides EF. A very rare documentation. **(\$2,250)**

21. **Amsterdam 1928. Official Poster.** Multicolor lithograph, designed by J. Jos Rovers, printed by Joh. Enschedé en Zonen, Haarlem, 59.7x94cm (23.5"x37"). Large marathon runner over legend, Olympic stadium with Olympic flag and first cauldron in background. *The Rovers descendants recently withdrew permission to use the poster by the IOC, and a new 1928 poster was selected from the cover of a Swiss report by Julius Wagner, Zürich on the 1928 Olympic Games: an athlete holding a laurel branch on his outstretched right arm. See lot 225.* This is the original poster selected by the Amsterdam Organizing Committee. Professionally linen-mounted in beautiful wooden frame, under glass. EF. Extremely rare. **(\$15,000)**
22. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 54mm with scalloped edge, by Julio Kilenyi, struck by Robbins Co. Winged goddess of victory in clouds holding laurel wreath over Lake Placid site with venues. Rev. Olympic rings over Games legend, crossed laurel branches below. EF. Very rare. **(\$27,500)**





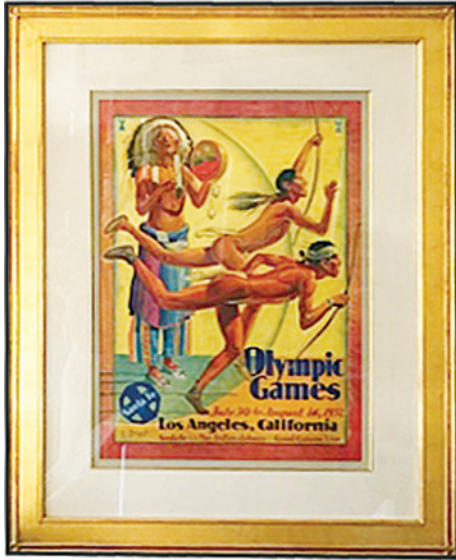
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23. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. Cased Participation Medal.** Bronze, 48x60mm, by Julio Kilenyi. Winged figure of Fame blowing horn, Olympic rings above, winter landscape in background. Rev. Six winter sports depicted on shields around legend in six lines, scenes of curling and dogsledding below. EF. In very rare cardboard presentation box. (\$12,000)

24. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. New York State Olympic Winter Games Commission Badge.** Goldplated, 34x34mm octagonal. With two red-white-blue silk ribbons, inscribed in gold "NYS OWG COMITE" (partially faded, tear on ribbon, VF.) Numbered on back. Pictured in official report p. 138, Elbel W-5. One of only 15 badges and the rarest of the 1932 Winter Games badges. Badge EF. (\$4,500)

25. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. National Host Badge.** Goldplated, 34x34mm. With two red-white-blue ribbons inscribed "NATIONAL HOST". Elbel W-6. One of 45 badges. Ribbons frayed, badge EF. Rare. (\$3,750)

26. **Los Angeles 1932. Official Poster of the Santa Fe Grand Canyon Line to the Olympic Games in Los Angeles.** Multicolor, 49.5x67.3cm (19.5"x26.5"). 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**EUGEN MACK, SWITZERLAND, MEDAL WINNER IN GYMNASTICS IN AMSTERDAM 1928 AND BERLIN 1936**

*Eugen Mack (1907-1978) is considered the greatest Swiss gymnast. He participated in the 1928 Amsterdam Olympic Games winning two gold medals: in vaulting and in team competition, also two bronze medals in floor exercises and horizontal bar. At the 1934 Budapest World Championships he won five gold medals: the All-Around (15 events!), the pommel horse, vault and parallel bars, as well as team competition. 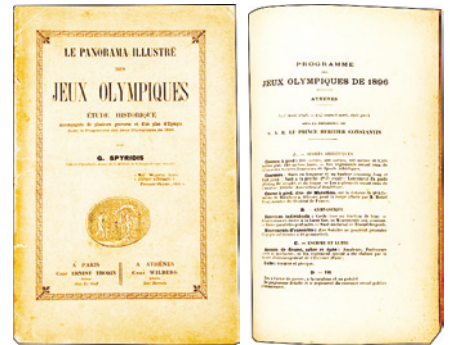
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**THE OLYMPIC GAMES AT ATHENS.**  
**I.—THE REVIVAL OF THE FESTIVAL.**  
*(From our Athens correspondent.)*  
**ATHENS, March 31.**  
 The idea of fastening a series of international athletic contests to be held in some European capital at intervals of every four years in the observance of the remarkable movement in favour of athletics which has manifested itself throughout Europe and especially in France, during the last two decades. In Continental nations where the committee prevails and they exercise more than they would the place of that physical training by means of athletic sports which agrees to the Anglo-American race, as it did in the Games of old, most grateful to the attainment of health, strength and manly beauty. In recent years, however, the advantage of supplementing the mechanical practice of skill and the mechanical practice of the hunting school by the adoption of English outdoor sports has become generally recognized in the Continent and the athletic movement of the younger Britons on the one hand and athletic leagues steadily becoming a thing of the past. In France the growing popularity of outdoor sports in its own right have due to the indistinguishable character of them to the "Cochet," the secretary of the Union of French Athletic Societies, whom intimate acquaintance with English and American educational systems has led him to appreciate the great importance of physical training. To Dr. de Cochet, aided by his English and American friends, Messrs. Harter and Thomas, is due the convocation of the International Athletic Congress, which assembled at Paris in the summer of 1894 under the presidency of Baron de Coubertin, which has also organized the present or imminent a somewhat comprehensive program of athletic contests by the revival of the ancient Olympic games.  
 The movement was thus inaugurated under French auspices but from the beginning the English shared its sense of what it was to do to that wonderful race which attributed to the progress of physical perfection and regarded to posterity.

**THE OLYMPIC GAMES.**  
**ATHENS, April 6.**  
 The coincidence to-day of the 75th anniversary of the declaration of Greek independence and the celebration of the national festival with the revival of the ancient Olympic Games is an event calculated to stimulate in the highest degree the patriotic enthusiasm of the Greek nation, recalling, as it does, not only the heroic deeds of a past generation, but also the noble institutions of a remote and illustrious age. If the enthusiasm of strangers is not quite so great as was expected the delirium is fully made up by the immense crowd of Greeks who have arrived from every part of the world. Great enthusiasms prevail among the people, and it is fully warranted by the success with which all the preparations for the festival have been carried out. This success is all the more creditable to the Greeks inasmuch as they have hitherto been without the experience requisite for the organization of so great an undertaking. The Crown Prince and those working under his eye to be congratulated upon the admirable manner in which all the arrangements have been carried out.  
 Perfect order reigned in the enormous crowd which thronged the Stadion this afternoon, and not a single accident or mishap of any kind occurred. The inauguration of the festival was announced this morning by salutes of artillery, and in the forenoon the King and the Royal Family, with the Grand Duke George, attended a Te Deum in the Cathedral. These events assembled in the streets to see the Royal procession pass. As rain seemed imminent, fears were entertained for the success of the afternoon's programme, but fortunately the weather remained fine.  
 At 5 o'clock the King and the Royal Family proceeded to the Stadion, where they were received by the Crown Prince, Prince George, and the members of the committee. Their Majesties
