TERMS OF SALE
(Please read carefully before bidding.)

The auction will be conducted in accordance with the terms set forth below. Bidding in the sale constitutes acceptance of all terms stated herein.

(1) **BIDDING. Bids by phone, fax, e-mail and mail will be accepted until 11 p.m. Pacific Standard Time, on Saturday, March 5, 2016.** All e-mail bids will be acknowledged. E-mail bids which have not been acknowledged have not been received. Phone bids must be confirmed in writing upon request. Auctioneer reserves the right to extend bidding. Lots will be sold to the highest bidder. In the case of tie bids, the first bid received will normally be given preference. Auctioneer has sole discretion to make the determination of the winning bid.

Value estimates are for guidance only. Bids higher than estimate will be reduced to 10% above the second highest bid. **Bids under estimate will not be accepted.** Bids must be for an entire lot. Bids will be accepted by lot number only. Each lot constitutes a separate sale.

(2) **MODIFICATION.** The catalog is incorporated in and deemed a part of these Terms of Sale. Auctioneer has the absolute right to modify the terms of sale at any time. Bidding after notification of modification constitutes acceptance of modification. Auctioneer has the absolute right to conduct the auction as auctioneer may decide, including the right to decline bids for any reason and from any person, to decline challenges to bids or bidding increments and to make the final determination of all disputes by any method auctioneer deems appropriate. No bidder shall have a claim or recourse against auctioneer for loss or damage due to modification, auctioneer mistake, departure from stated terms of sale, method of dispute resolution or result thereof.

(3) **GUARANTY. By bidding in the sale, bidder accepts all terms stated herein and personally guarantees timely and complete payment and performance of all obligations stated herein.** Auctioneer is not responsible for bidding errors. Successful bidders are unconditionally bound to perform all obligations hereunder regardless of mistake. Bidding by minors and undisclosed agents is prohibited. Bidding constitutes a representation and warranty that bidder is of legal age and acting on his or her own behalf with full power and authority to make the bid placed and to legally bind bidder to all terms of sale.

(4) **PRICE. Payment in full is due upon receipt of invoice.** A 15% Buyer's Fee will be added to the successful bid price of each lot. Handling, shipping, sales tax for California residents, insurance, and all other costs associated with shipping will be added to the invoice. A \$1 handling charge per lot may be added to bulky lots (books, large plates, sculptures, etc.) California sales tax will be added to the invoice of California residents unless a valid resale number is on file with the auctioneer; however, buyer is solely responsible for and agrees to pay all sales or other applicable tax due by virtue of the sale and shall indemnify and hold auctioneer harmless therefore, including penalties or interest assessed, regardless of whether or not taxes were included on the invoice or correctly calculated by the auctioneer.

(5) **PAYMENT.** Payment must be in U.S. funds payable by check drawn on a U.S. bank or by wire transfer to auctioneer's account, by credit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover) or Paypal. Wiring instructions should be requested from auctioneer before funds are wired. A 3.5% convenience charge (4% for overseas purchases) will be added to credit card or Paypal purchases except where prohibited by law. Bidders may be asked for satisfactory credit references or a deposit of funds prior to bidding.

(6) **DEFAULT.** If buyer fails to make payment in full within 30 days of the invoice date or to timely comply with any other term of sale, then, in addition to all other remedies available at law or in equity, auctioneer may, at auctioneer's option: (a) charge 1.5% monthly interest on unpaid amounts; (b) if payment is not received in a timely manner, auctioneer may resell the lot(s) and recover from buyer the difference between the proceeds and buyer's indebtedness in excess of the proceeds, which indebtedness shall include the successful bid price, Buyer's Fee and all other expenses incurred by auctioneer from the date of sale until resale on accounts of such lot(s), including attorney fees, transportation, handling, storage, insurance, collection and resale costs. Proceeds collected in excess of buyer's indebtedness shall belong to auctioneer; (c) pursue collection efforts and/or recover from buyer all costs incurred by auctioneer as a result of buyer's default from date of default, including attorney fees, transportation, handling, storage and insurance costs; and (d) sue for damages. Amounts charged hereunder are immediately due and payable. Buyer waives all requirements of notice, advertisement, bidding rights, rights to proceeds and all other rights with respect to the sale of a lot purchased by buyer except as prohibited by law. Auctioneer's rights and remedies stated in this section and elsewhere in this agreement are cumulative and the exercise of one shall not operate to the exclusion of another.

(7) SHIPMENT. It is buyer's responsibility to contact auctioneer to make shipping arrangements. Failure to timely make shipping arrangements or to accept delivery constitutes default. Lots will be delivered to buyer's address on file with auctioneer, unless otherwise requested, after payment in full and funds have cleared. Lots will be packaged, insured and shipped as auctioneer deems appropriate unless otherwise requested; however, auctioneer may charge additional handling, shipping and insurance fees or decline to package and/or ship any item. Buyer is responsible for packaging and/or shipping any purchased lot(s) at auctioneer's request within 30 days of the request. Risk of loss and title pass at delivery of lot to place of shipment, if shipped by auctioneer, and at time of payment in full at place of pick-up, if shipped by buyer. **Custom duties for an overseas buyer are buyer's sole responsibility.** Overseas buyers must supply fully detailed shipping instructions prior to shipment. Lots will be shipped overseas at buyer's risk only. Buyer waives all claims against auctioneer for loss or damage as a result of delayed shipment or failure to ship any item. Auctioneer's breach in the delivery of any item shall not give buyer the right to refuse or receive any other shipment.

(8) AS-IS SALE; LIMITED WARRANTY. Catalog descriptions are provided solely for convenience and are not a warranty of any kind. This is not an approval sale. Goods are offered for sale on an "AS IS" basis without warranty of any kind except as expressly provided below. Catalog errors should be brought promptly to auctioneer's attention. In the case of photo error, only the text is valid.

All items sold are guaranteed to the original buyer to be authentic (unless otherwise stated). **AUCTIONEER MAKES NO OTHER WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, AND SPECIFICALLY EXCLUDES ANY WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. THIS WARRANTY IS GIVEN SOLELY TO THE ORIGINAL BUYER AND IS NON-TRANSFERABLE AND NO OTHER PERSON SHALL HAVE ANY RIGHTS UNDER SUCH WARRANTY.**

(9) CLAIMS. The sole basis for a claim against auctioneer is the lack of authenticity of a purchased item. Buyer is solely responsible for determining authenticity without reliance on statements or acts of auctioneer. Authenticity claims must be made in writing and submitted to auctioneer no later than 5 days after delivery of such item. Authenticity claims are not permitted outside of warranty period except as may be permitted by auctioneer. Acceptance of a claim does not constitute an admission. If auctioneer disputes a claim, the final determination of authenticity shall be made by a qualified authenticator selected by buyer and auctioneer. Costs of authentication will be borne by buyer. If a claim is accepted or an item determined to be not authentic, buyer's exclusive remedy is a refund of the successful bid price and Buyer's Fee, payable upon delivery of the item to auctioneer in accordance with the conditions of return set forth below, except as may otherwise be agreed by auctioneer and buyer in writing.

Highlights of the Auction

*The Very Rare Innsbruck 1964 Winter Torch
that Lit the Cauldron in the Bergisel Stadium on
Opening Day, January 29, 1964*

*Pinewood Torch that
transferred the flame to
the First Oslo Torch
on February 13, 1952*



1. **Innsbruck 1964 Winter Torch.** The torch is made of brass, bronze colored, 61cm (24”) long, designed by Ludwig Haselwanter and Anton Fritz. Olympic rings and “IX Olympische Winterspiele 1964” are shown around the edges of the bowl at the top.

The Innsbruck torch relay is the first Olympic winter relay that started in Olympia, Greece. The flame was lit on January 22nd, and taken by car to Athens. From there it was flown to Vienna, and then to Innsbruck where it was displayed at the Golden Dachl until the Opening Day. On this day this torch lit the cauldron in the Bergisel Stadium. Later it was displayed for about 10 years at the Golden Dachl in Innsbruck, and it was attached to a wall – the torch still shows the attachment spot.

A second cauldron was lit on Opening Day with a second torch in front of the Ice Stadium.

The exact number of Innsbruck 1964 torches is not known, but certainly less than 10.

This torch is of utmost importance having carried the flame lit for the first time in Olympia, to light the cauldron in the Bergisel Stadium. (\$225,000)

2. **Traditional Norwegian Pinewood Torch from the First Lighting Ceremony in Søndre Norheim’s Birthplace Øverbø in Morgedahl, Telemark, February 13, 1952.** The pinewood torch was lit at the fireplace in Søndre Norheim’s cottage, and, taken outside, lit the first Oslo torch. 94 Skiers carried the flame over 225 km to the Opening Ceremony in Oslo’s Bislett Stadium on February 15, 1952.

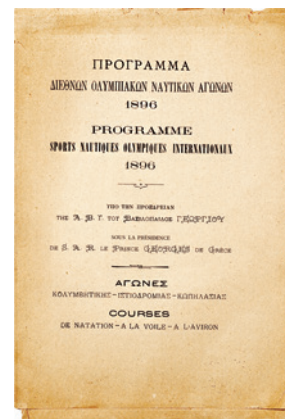
Søndre Norheim (1825-1897) is considered the father of skiing in Norway. The torch relay followed the same route that Søndre took when he skied from Morgedahl, Telemark to Oslo for a skiing competition in 1868.

The pinewood torch is 39.7cm (15.6”) long, and was made by Olav Strondi. It is burnt at the top, and there used to be a cover at the bottom where the torch was held, otherwise it is in excellent condition, and of utmost importance. (\$25,000)

3. **Oslo 1952 Winter. Official Torch with Name and Date of Ragnar Navelsaker Who Carried the Torch on February 13, 1952 in Telemark, Norway.** Silver colored alloy of brass and steel, 22cm (8.7") high, 32x15.5cm (12.6"x6.1") wide, designed by Geir Grung and Adolf Thoresen. On the oval top are the Olympic rings and "1952", also "Morgedahl" pointing with an arrow to "Oslo". Cauldrons were burning already in Garmisch-Partenkirchen 1936 and St. Moritz 1948 but Oslo staged the first torch relay of the Olympic Winter Games. A fire was lit on February 13 in the birthplace of 19th century legend Sondre Norheim (1825-1897), considered the father of skiing in Norway, in Morgedahl, Telemark. 94 skiers carried the flame for 225km through Kongsberg, Drammen, the Huseby Hill at Oraker where skiing competitions had been held since 1879, to Oslo where it arrived on February 15 for the Opening Ceremony in Bislett Stadium. The last torchbearer was Eigil Nansen, grandson of the Norwegian Polar explorer Fridtjof Nansen. EF. Lt. discoloration around top opening from the flame, o.w. EF. Rare and important torch of the First Winter Olympic Torch Relay. **(\$75,000)**
4. **Athens 1896. Official Program for the Nautical Sports: Swimming, Sailing and Rowing.** 8pp., 16.5x24cm (6.5"x9.4"), in Greek and French. Includes list of Judges, program of the races, and list of participants. Browning, small tears and sm. chips, VF. Very rare. **(\$1,500)**

5. **St. Louis 1904. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Broad Jump to Culver L. Halstedt in the Western AAU Handicap Meeting on July 29, 1904.** 14 Karat gold, 31mm, 15.2 grams, by Mermod & Jaccard, St. Louis. Olive branch dividing "WAAAU/Handicap" and winged foot, symbol of the American Athletic Union. Rev. "Running / Broad Jump / Culver Hastedt". Suspended from mural crown bar with legend "1904 / Universal Exposition / Olympic Games / St. Louis". Handicap meant getting a slight advantage in position. Culver Halstedt of St. Louis won four gold and one silver, and he was named "King of Handicaps". See also Mallon, Bill. *The 1904 Olympic Games*, p. 98. Housed in its red presentation case lined in ivory silk. EF. Very rare. **(\$15,000)**
6. **St. Louis 1904. Participation Medal in its Presentation Box.** Bronze, 40x40mm, made by Dieges & Clust, New York. Nude athlete striding r., laurel branch in hand. Rev. Legend in eleven lines, shields of St. Louis, France and U.S.A. between ivy leaves. This medal was only presented to athletes. Housed in its cardboard box inscribed "1803/Universal Exposition Commemorating the / Olympic Games / 1904/Physical Culture Department/Frederick J.V. Skiff / Director of Exhibits / Jas. E. Sullivan / Chef of Dept." Inside lined in white silk. Box VF, extremely rare. Medal toned EF. **(\$22,500)**
7. **Athens 1906. Cased Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 50mm, by J. Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch on globe. Rev. View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend. Similar to 1896 winner's medal - only the date on the reverse was changed to 1906. In round red leatherette case lined in green velvet. EF. **(\$8,500)**

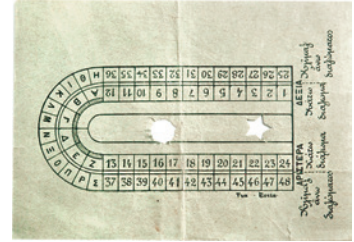

8. **Athens 1906. Earliest Gold American Olympic Committee Member's Badge.** Unmarked gold, 32x44mm, by Dieges & Clust, New York. Greek and U.S. shield over "MEMBER" and A.A.U. logo. "Olympic Games/Held at Athens Greece/1906" legend. Two prongs on rev. *Earliest U.S. American Committee badge.* EF. (\$2,250)
9. **Athens 1906. Ticket of Day 1, Opening Ceremony, April 22, 1906.** Section 21, Price Drachma 1. 11.5x8.5cm (4.5"x3.3"). Reverse shows map of the stadium with seating sections. Lt. horizontal center fold, 2 small tears, o.w. EF. Very rare. (\$850)
10. **London 1908. Cased Second Place Gymnastic Teams Winner's Medal Won by the Norwegian Team, for Team Combined Exercises.** Bronze, 33mm, by Bertram MacKenna. Victorious athlete being crowned by two females. Rev. St. George slaying dragon. Edge engraved "Second Prize Gymnastic Teams". *In 1908 only first place team members received a silver medal; second place team members received a bronze medal as the Norwegian team did.* Housed in its gold embossed blue leatherette case by P. Vaughton & Sons, lined in blue velvet and white silk. EF. Rarely found with presentation case. (\$7,000)

11. **Stockholm 1912. Cased Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 33mm, by Erik Lindberg and Bertram MacKenna, struck by Sporrang & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. Housed in red presentation case, gold legend on top. EF. (\$7,000)
12. **First Russian Olympiad in Kiev, 1913. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 53mm, by Joseph Marshak. Nude discus thrower, view of Kiev in background. Rev. City shield, crossed oak and olive branch below. *Russia participated the first time in Olympic Games in Stockholm 1912. The Russian team came in second to last of 18 participating nations. Grand Duke Dmitrii Pavlovich oversaw the Russian Olympic Games in order to train athletes for better results in the next Olympic Games in Berlin 1916. The Sports Ground for the Games was the first permanent stadium in Russia. The "Cartier of Kiev", Joseph Marshak, main competitor of Karl Fabergé, created the winner's medal for the First Russian Olympic Games. See Bubka, Sergey and Bulatova, M.M. "Kiev – The First Russian Olympiad 1913", with much information and many photos.* EF. Rare. (\$2,250)
13. **Antwerp 1920. "Victory!" Trophy Awarded to Gold Medal Winners in Single Events.** Cast bronze, on marble base, 37cm (14.6"), by M. Grandmoulin. Victorious athlete, arm raised, holding laurel wreath, standing on base inscribed "Victoire!" and signed by the artist with date "1920". Mounted on round marble base and square bronze plaque below with "VII OLYMPIADE ANVERS 1920". *Only in Antwerp 1920 and Paris 1924 did the first place winner's receive a trophy in addition to their medals.* Extremely rare and attractive. (\$12,500)

14. **Antwerp 1920. Beautiful Rowing Trophy Presented to Members of the Gold Medal Winning Rowing Team.** White metal, 39.5cm (15.6”) high, signed by artist. Flying winged female (Nike?) upholding Olympic rings (first time shown at Olympic Games), and race between Eight-Oared Shell with Coxswain; raised lions heads on either side. Olive and oak branch at top, two scrolled handles at sides. Mounting opening at bottom. Abt. EF. Very rare. **(\$7,500)**
15. **Paris 1924. The Olympic Winner’s Vase Awarded for Soccer, Rowing, Rugby and Diving.** Sèvres porcelain, 33.3cm (13.1”) high, designed by talented artist M.O. Guillonet and executed by Bracquemond at the world famous porcelain factory of Sèvres. Golden laurel branches are handpainted on French blue background, the medallions depicting **Soccer, Rowing, Rugby and Diving** on gray background with green border. Official report page 804. *The vases were made in several versions to accommodate all Olympic events. They were presented by the Paris City Council to gold medal winners.* EF. Seldom seen sports, very rare vase, and beautiful. **(\$17,500)**

16. **Paris 1924. American Olympic Committee Report on the VIII Olympiad Paris, France, 1924.** From Robert M. Thompson, President of the American Olympic Committee. 124pp., 15.8x22.8cm (6.1”x9”), a six-page fold-out tipped-in in back listing first and second places in all of Paris events including the Art Competition. Cover browning, spine chipped at ends, contents EF. **Rarest of all USOC reports! (\$800)**
17. **St. Moritz 1928 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner’s Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by Arnold Huenerwadel. Skater with outstretched arms within ice crystals. Rev. 5-line French legend between olive branches, rings above. Toned EF. Rare. **(\$9,500)**

18. **St. Moritz 1928 Winter. Group of 20 Glass Slides Depicting Figure Skating Couples (13) and Singles (8).** Each 13x6cm (5.1"x2.4"), made by Guilleminot, Boespflug & Co., Paris. Included are gold medal winner Karl Schäfer, Austria, Gillis Grafström (second), Sweden, possibly Sonja Henie and many other skaters. Housed in original box. All EF. Rare. (20 pcs.) (\$400)
19. **Amsterdam 1928. Official Poster.** Multicolor lithograph, designed by J. Jos Rovers, printed by Joh. Enschedé en Zonen, Haarlem, 59.7x94cm (23.5"x37").
