

- 30. Cortina 1956 Winter. Official Torch. Aluminum, 47cm (18.5") long. "VII° GIOCHI OLIMPICI INVERNALI CORTINA 1956", legend, cut-out Olympic rings at top. The flame was lit at the Temple of Jupiter in Rome on January 22, 1956, and flown to Venice. The torch relay from there went to Cortina, where the fire was lit in the stadium at the opening ceremony on January 26 by Guido Caroli. EF. (\$23,500)
- 31. Cortina 1956 Winter. Cased Gold Participation Medal. Goldplated silver, 45mm, by C. Affer. Female head facing, crowned by Olympic rings, flame in lower r. Rev. Snowflake over Mount Pomagagnon. Housed in blue leather presentation case lined in blue velvet and silk, color rings attached on top. Medal EF. (\$3,000)
- 32. Cortina 1956 Winter. First Place Winner's Diploma Awarded to Heinrich Angst, Switzerland, for Four-Man Bobsleigh.
 37.5x48cm (14.8"x18.9"), designed by Pino Strampini, printed by Stabilimente L. Salomone, Rome. Border of Alpine flowers, snow crystals throughout, embossed logo on bottom. An angel shows when held towards the light. Signed by Organizing Committee President, and IOC President A. Brundage. Official report pp. 212/213. Lt. crease, EF. (\$1,250)

- 33. **Melbourne 1956. Official Lead Trial Strike of the Winner's Medal.** Lead, 50mm, by Cassioli, struck by K.G. Luke, Melbourne. Victory seated above Colosseum Stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. *The Melbourne Olympic Museum at the Cricket Grounds has another one of these extremely rare lead medals.* EF. (\$3,500)
- 34. Rome 1960. Gold First Place Winner's Medal, Awarded to Gymnastics Team. Goldplated silver within bronze olive wreath, 68mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above Colosseum in Rome. Rev. Victorious athlete carried by jubilant teammates, "Ginnastica" on panel below. Gymnastic team members received the winner's medal without chain. Light wear on highpoints, abt. EF. (\$15,000)
- 35. Tokyo 1964. Olympic Cup Awarded by the IOC to the City of Tokyo (1965). Silver plaque, 50x72mm. by Huguenin. The Olympic Cup created by Pierre de Coubertin. Rev. Olympic rings above 8-line legend in French "The Olympic Cup Created by Baron/Pierre de Coubertin/Renovator of the Modern Era Olympic Games, has been Awarded to the City of Tokyo". The Olympic Cup has been awarded since 1906; it is being kept at the Olympic Museum in Lausanne, and the names of the recipients are engraved on a plaque on the trophy. Tokyo was awarded the Cup for Organizing the 1964 Olympic Games. Lennartz-Borger-Höfer pages 428-430. Housed in brown leatherette case with gold legend. EF. Rare. (\$3,000)



36. Grenoble 1968 Winter. Giant Slalom Bronze Winner's Medal.
Bronze, 60mm, by Roger Excoffon, struck at the Paris Mint.
Logo within French legend. Rev. Depiction of giant slalom,
"Slalom Geant" below. Housed in black leather presentation case,
gold embossed logo on top, lined in white velvet and silk. Unc.

37. Grenoble 1968 Winter. Hallmarked Silver Participation Medal. Silver, hallmarked "Argent" and "1968", 68mm, by J.M. Coeffin. Profile of Greek victorious athlete l. Rev. Grenoble city view. In brown leatherette case. EF. Very rare. (\$4,500)

- Grenoble 1968 Winter. Le Dauphin The Dolphin. First Proposed Official Mascot of the Olympic Winter Games. Red cloth, 13x14cm (5.1"x5.5"). Dolphin's head facing up, with felt eyes and red ribbon, and yellow ribbon inscribed "Xes Jeux Olympiques Grenoble 1968". The dolphin representing the former Dauphiné province with its capital Grenoble, was not selected. Shuss became the official mascot. Plus official Postcard featuring the mascot and a logo of the dolphin over Olympic rings (first suggested logo?). Extremely rare. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$800)
- 39. Sapporo 1972 Winter. Official Torch Used in the Torch Relay on Hokkaido. Bowl cast blackened aluminum alloy, 13x21cm (5.1"x8.3"), with stainless steel flame tube, total 56cm (22") long, designed by Munemichi Yanagi, made by Nippon Kokki Co. The bowl and the tube display the Sapporo Olympic emblem. Used in the torch relay on Hokkaido. Lt. wear to bowl, tube discolored from flame. A very rare torch. (\$29,500)
- 40. **Munich 1972. International Federation Badge.** Silvered, 25x35mm. Lavender "IF" on bar. Elbel S-4. EF. (\$800)



41. Innsbruck 1976 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Bobsleigh and Housed in Red Presentation Leather Case. Goldplated silver, 70mm, by M. Coufal. "BOB" over Bergisel ski jump, Olympic flame at r. Rev. Official logo and legend. With ribbon in Austrian colors. Buyer will receive name of winner. Housed in red leather presentation case with gold-stamped logo on top. Choice EF. (\$19,500)

Dove of Peace flying left carrying laurel branch, Seoul logo above. Unawarded. With loop and ribbon, in dark violet velvet presentation case. Unc. (\$20,000)
- 46. Barcelona 1992. Gold Participation Medal. Goldplated copper, 70mm, by X. Corbero. Spanish legend and date above Barcelona Olympic emblem, a stylized jumping athlete. Rev. Spiral and elongated bolt of lightning. EF, in pouch decorated with Olympic rings and bid pin design, and panel "In appreciation for your collaboration" in Spanish. EF. Very rare. (\$4,500)
