

- 182. **Cased Donor's Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered, 50mm, by B. MacKennal. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. *Presented to high officials*. Housed in a dark blue case with gold legend on top, VF. Medal EF. (\$1,500)
- 183. **Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 50mm, by B. MacKennal. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. *Presented to high officials.* EF. (\$1,300)
- 184. Jury Presentation Medal of the Franco-British (and Olympic) Exposition. Goldplated bronze 63mm, by F. Bowcher, struck by Vaughton, Birmingham. Winged female standing behind seated personification of France and England. Rev. Draped female holding olive branch, exposition in background, "A. Darras-Jury" on panel below. The Exposition included the 1908 London Olympic Games. EF. (\$300)

- 188. **Swedish Choir at the Olympic Games Badge.** Brass, 26x30mm. Harp over laurel wreath, with yellow-blue Swedish color ribbon and bar "12-14 Juli 1912". Elbel page 23. Small frayed spot on ribbon, o.w. EF. (\$180)

- 194. IOC Recognition Plaque for Pierre de Coubertin on the 20th Anniversary of the Restoration of the Olympic Games, 1914. Bronze, 52x69mm, by H. Kautsch. Bust l. of Coubertin in high relief, 4-line French legend below. Rev. Winged Nike in clouds holding laurel branch over cities of IOC meetings and Olympic Games, from Paris 1894, Athens 1896, to Paris 1914 and Berlin 1916, Acropolis in Athens in background at top. EF. Very rare. (\$1,250)
- Winner's Medal Awarded in the Berlin Olympic Stadium Games, June 1916. Cast blackened iron, 90mm. Bust r. of Podbielsky who was instrumental in building the stadium. Rev. Victorious athlete. The "Podbielsky Games" were held at the time of the planned 1916 Olympic Games in the Olympic Stadium - these Games were cancelled due to World War I. EF. Rare. (\$500)
- Official IOC 25th Anniversary Medal on the Restoration of the Olympic Games, 1919. Bronze, 50mm, by Edouard Elzingre. Victorious athlete on horseback holding statue of Victory, led by two young athletes. Rev. 11-line French legend, laurel sprig below. Housed in original case. EF. (\$1,250)

- Participation Medal. Bronze, 60mm, by P. Theunis. Nike standing before tripod crowning victorious athletes. Rev. Flying Victory crowning charioteer in biga. EF. Very scarce. (\$700)
- Czech Olympic 100M Trials Winner's Medal, July 4, 1920. Silvered, 32mm, scalloped edge. Legend above athlete and laurel branch. Rev. 4-line engraved award legend. Looped, with ring. Unevenly toned EF. (\$150)

- 203. Group of 24 Great Britain NOC Pins, from Paris 1924 to 2012. Included are Paris 1924, Amsterdam 1928, Helsinki 1952 through London 2012. The large size badge from 1968 is very rare, presented to high dignitaries and some medal winners only. All EF. (24 pcs.) (\$1,700)
- 204. **First Place Winner's Medal in the Olympic Shooting Competition in Reims.** Silver, 24x44mm. Winged Victory holding a wreath in each hand. Rev. "First Shooter" (in French) on ribbons around panel, city shield below. With ribbon and bar "200 Meters". EF. (\$180)

205. Olympic Congress in Prague, 1925. Official Medal. Bronze, 45mm. View of Charles Bridge and Hradschin Castle. Rev. Oak branch with rings and scroll with Olympic motto. Toned EF. (\$350)

ST. MORITZ, 2nd OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1928

- 206. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 37mm, by M. Martin. Victory with laurel branch in horse-drawn sled to left, Olympic rings in exergue. Rev. French legend in six lines over laurel branch. EF, toning. (\$800)
- National Skating Association of Great Britain Gold Award Medal. Gold, 9 Karat, 24.2 grams, 39mm. Gentleman skater on frozen lake. Rev. Legend and crossed olive and laurel branch. EF. (\$300)

AMSTERDAM, 9th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1928

208. **Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. *This design was selected in a competition by the IOC, and it stayed the winner's medals design through Mexico City 1968.* Toned EF. (\$6,500)

- 212. Commemorative Ninth Olympiad City Shield Pin. Bronze, multicolor enamel, 17mm. "Olympiade Amsterdam 1928" around city shield. EF. (\$80)
- Beauty in Sport Medal, 1928. Bronze, 41mm, by Jaap Kaas. 213. Muscular running athlete, stadium in background. Rev. Initials between "19-28". In original box. EF. (\$80)
- 214. Large Olympic Events in Amsterdam Embossed Brass Plate. 50cm (19.7"). Stadium and Olympic legend encircled by 12 Olympic sports: fencing, field hockey, soccer, track & field, equestrian, sailing etc. Toned EF. Scarce. (\$600)
- Olympic Games Uniting the Five Continents Plate. Multicolor handpainted ceramic, 29cm (11.3"), made by Société Céramique, Maastricht. Amsterdam city shield surrounded by five rings with names of continents: Africa, America, Australia, Asia and Europe, united by ribbon in Dutch colors. Olympic logo, "Olympic Games Amsterdam" and Dutch quote on black border. EF. Very rare and beautiful plate. (\$650)
- Silsa Advertising Porcelain Plate. Blue and white, 21cm (8.2"), 216. made by Petrus Regout & Co., Maastricht. Ancient Greek winner's head I., "Amsterdam 1928", "Silsa Margarine, N.V.H. Hartog's Fabrieken Oss" and "Olympiade 1928" legend. Earliest Olympic advertising plate. EF. Very rare. (\$400)

- Colorful Commemorative Olympic Events Porcelain Plate. Multicolor, 25cm (9.8"), made by Société Céramique, Maastricht. Supported Amsterdam city shield in circle of six events: soccer, rowing, running, swimming, cycling, and tennis. EF. (\$300)
- Pewter Ashtray Commemorating the Olympiad Held in the Netherlands 1928. 10cm (3.9"), made by H.T. Buiksloot, Holland. Crowned royal arms over crossed palm branches, surrounded by Olympiad legend. Toned EF. (\$100)
- 219. Group of Eight Glass Slides: Five Featuring Athletic Events and One Featuring Sailing in Amsterdam 1928. 8.2x8.2cm (3.2"x3.2"), Gevaert Diapositif B Images. In original box. EF. (\$180)
- Report of the Swiss Olympic Committee on the Swiss Participation in Amsterdam 1928. 24pp., 15.3x22.5cm (6"x8.9"), in French. Included are five photos of Swiss athletes and the opening ceremony. Lt. browning, abt. EF. (\$150)
- 221. Ice Hockey World Championship in Chamonix, France, 1930. Participant's Badge. Silver, 26mm, made by Le Médaillier, Paris. French rooster, legend on blue band. Austria and Germany were also host countries. Twelve countries participated in the first world championship outside of Olympic Games. EF. Rare. (\$250)
