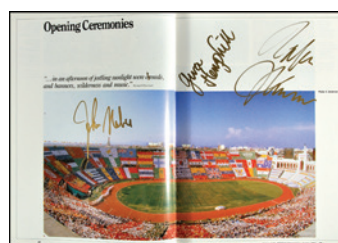

416. **Second Place Winner's Diploma Awarded to a Member of the German Field Hockey Team.** Framed, 38.5x38.5cm (15.2"x15.2"). Silver stars in motion logo over award legend. Four signatures at bottom (Samaranch, Ziffren, Ueberroth and Usher) faded but still readable. EF. (\$500)
417. **Bronze Third Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Baseball to a Member of the Chinese Taipei Team.** Silver, black award legend, rings in color, 38x38cm (15"x15"). Facsimile signatures of IOC President Samaranch etc. EF, with stiff brown cover. (\$450)
418. **(Autographs) Gold Edition of "Games of the XXIIIrd Olympiad Los Angeles 1984 Commemorative Book".** Officially sanctioned by the IOC. 287pp., color photos, 23.5x31cm (9.3"x12.2"). Numbered, with 26 gold pen autographs of Olympic champions such as Rafer Johnson and Edwin Moses, also pop star Lionel Ritchie at the closing ceremony. With list of signatures, and goldstamped Certificate of Authenticity. Bound in leather with gold metal plate for inscription of name. Originally sold for \$2,000. Beautiful keepsake of the Los Angeles Games. EF. (\$900)

CALGARY, 15th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1988

419. **Commemorative Olympic Porcelain Wall Clock.** 24cm (9.5"). Large Calgary logo in center surrounded by color seals of 12 Canadian provinces. Battery compartment on back. EF. (\$120)

SEOUL, 24th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1988

420. **Official Torch.** Brass 50cm (20"), with tan leather handle, designed by Lee Woo-Sing. Bowl depicts dragons, Seoul Olympic logo enamelled in color below. EF. Scarce condition. (\$7,000)
421. **Paralympic Participation Medal.** Bronze, 65x65mm. South Gate mountains in back, Paralympic logo above. Rev. Paralympic mascots above stadium. EF, spotty on rev. (\$200)
422. **Olympic Korean Wrestling Federation Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 56mm. Two wrestlers. Rev. Logo over Korea Amateur Wrestling Federation. Unc., cased. (\$120)
423. **Official Commemorative Mascots Porcelain Plate.** Multicolor, 20.7cm (8.2"). Large logo in center surrounded by 23 Hodori mascots illustrating the different sports in Seoul. EF. (\$100)
424. **Olympic Flame Commemorative Plate.** Blue and white porcelain, 18.3cm (7.2"), by Bing & Groendahl. Olympic flame in front of Seoul landmarks. EF. (\$100)
425. **Commemorative Olympic and Paralympic Mascots Porcelain Plate.** Multicolor, 20.5cm (8.1"), made by Charmstone Chen Hung. Smiling mascots over legend. EF. (\$90)

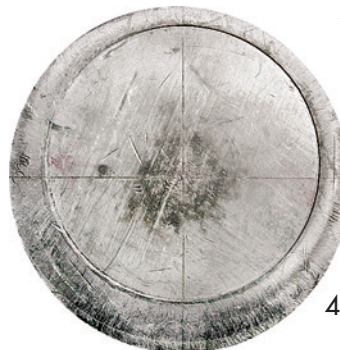

426. **Commemorative Seoul 24th Olympic Games 1988 Plate.** Oval brass, 23.9x17.8cm (9.4"x7"). Logo and Hodori mascot with flag between Seoul 1988 legend in Korean and English, laurel branches on sides. May also be hung on wall. EF. (\$120)
427. **Plush Hodori Mascot Standing on the '88 Olympic Main Stadium.** Stadium 17.3x16.5cm (6.8"x6.5"), 4.3cm (1.7") high, made by Tae Sung Co., Ltd. Hodori, 25cm (9.8") high, is held on the stadium by magnets on his feet. He wears a necklace with Olympic rings, waving to the crowd. EF. (\$130)
428. **Commemorative Main Stadium Clock.** 16.5cm (6.5") high. The hands run around the stadium ready for a soccer game. Battery driven. EF. (\$100)
429. **Participation Diploma and Identity Card of a Second Place U.S. American Water Polo Player.** Diploma 30x41cm (11.8"x16.1") with gold embossed logo at top left. EF. Plus **Identity Card** with photo. 4pp., 8.5x14cm (3.4"x5.5"). Abt. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$400)
430. **Official Guide and Souvenir Program.** 304pp., color and b&w photos, 21x29.7cm (8.3"x11.7"). Program, venues, Seoul and Korea, history, etc. Stiff color covers, lt. scuffing, contents EF. (\$100)

ALBERTVILLE, 16th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1992

431. **Commemorative U.S. Winter Olympic Team in Albertville Plate.** 21.7cm (8.5"). Hand holding torch surrounded by skaters, ice hockey player, skier, etc. in Alpine landscape. EF. (\$100)

BARCELONA, 25th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1992

432. **Official Torch.** Chrome-plated aluminum, 65cm (23.6"), designed by André Rich. "XXV Olympiad Barcelona 1992" legend and goldplated Barcelona emblem. Rubbing on leather part as usual, o.w. EF. (\$5,750)
433. **Lead Pattern Medal for the Barcelona Winner's Medal.** Lead, 70mm, by Xavier Corbero. Blank obverse with circular indented space for winner's medal insert (see the following lot), two engraved lines dividing space in quarters. Rev. Hand engraved logo. EF. (\$900)
434. **Silver Winner's Medal Center Insert.** Silver, 55mm, uniface, by Xavier Corbero. Seated Victory holding wreath and palm branch, legend at right. *These medals were inserted in the indent on the obverse of the winner's medals.* EF. (\$300)
435. **Paralympic Games Gold Winner's Medal.** Goldplated copper, 70mm, by Xavier Corbero. Paralympic logo. Rev. "Paralympics Barcelona" over Braille legend. Holed at top for ribbon. EF. (\$500)
436. **Paralympic Participation Medal.** Bronzed copper, 70mm, by Xavier Corbero. Paralympic logo. Rev. Braille legend. EF. (\$180)

437. **Commemorative Winner's Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 55mm. Victory seated above stadium, "XXV Olimpiada Barcelona 1992" engraved in three lines. Rev. Dove of Peace, Seoul 1988 logo above. *From a Spanish NOC member who received the medal around the Seoul Olympic Games.* With blue pouch. EF. (\$800)
438. **Commemorative Olympic Games in Barcelona Medal.** Bronze, 50x60mm, made by Calico, Barcelona. Ancient Greek vase with runners. Rev. Olympic rings and Barcelona Olympic 1992 legend. EF. (\$800)
439. **Official Commemorative Barcelona 1992 Olympic Games Plate.** Blue and white porcelain, 18.3cm (7.2"), made by Bing & Groendahl. Olympic cauldron with flame, in front of Barcelona landmarks. EF. (\$100)

LILLEHAMMER, 17th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1994

440. **Group of 21 Russian NOC and Team Pins from Lillehammer 1994 Winter to Sochi 2016.** Included are Lillehammer 1994, Atlanta 1996 (3), Nagano 1998, Sydney 2000, Salt Lake City 2002 (2), Athens 2004 (4), Torino 2006 (2), Beijing 2008 (2), Vancouver 2010, London 2012, Sochi 2014, Rio 2016, plus an undated NOC pin. Scarce set. All Unc. (21 pcs.) (\$300)
441. **Pair of Häkon and Kristin Savings Banks.** Multicolor hard plastic, 20cm (7.9") high. Smiling mascots on snowy ground. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$120)
442. **Mascots Häkon and Kristin.** Multicolor cloth, 23cm (8") each. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$100)

ATLANTA, 26th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1996

443. **Official 1996 Centennial of the Olympic Games Torch.** Silvered aluminum and wood, 55cm (21.65"). Names of all 23 Olympic cities from 1896 to 1996 inscribed on torch. *The Hellenic Olympic Committee celebrated the 100th Anniversary of the 1896 Olympic Games in the Panathenean Stadium in Athens on April 6, 1996. Part of this celebration was the re-enactment of the 1896 Games. Olympic medalists and representatives of all cities who had hosted the Olympic Games since 1896 took part in the torch run within the stadium. Afterwards, they took the torches back to their Olympic cities for a ceremony.* EF. (\$4,000)

444. **Official Torch.** Aluminum and Georgia pecan wood, 80cm (31.5"), designed by Peter Mastrogiannis. 22 reeds represent the cities where Olympic Games were held since 1896. Gathered by 2 goldplated brass bands, the top band displays the Atlanta torch logo and the quilt of leaves design, the bottom band lists all Olympic cities since 1896. The wooden pecan handle represents the connection of the flame between heaven and earth. *The flame was lit in Olympia. It reached Los Angeles on April 27 and ended 84 days later in Atlanta, carried by 10,000 relay runners, horses, bicycles, trains, ships, and hydroplanes.* EF. (\$2,500)
445. **Winner's Medal Presentation Case.** Wood, 13x17.5cm (5.1"x6.9"), 5cm (2") high. Large logo engraved on top, inside lined in black velvet, gold Atlanta logo inside top. *The case was the same for gold, silver and bronze winners medals.* EF. (\$600)

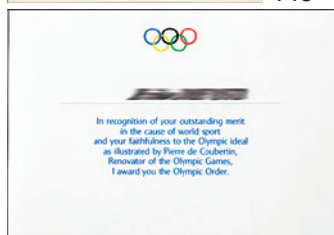

446. **Centennial of Olympic Games Commemorative Sword by Famous Sword Maker Wilkinson, England.** 40.5cm (16") long. The sword is engraved with the Olympic cities and dates from 1896 to 1996, and on the reverse with the Olympic Winter Games from Chamonix 1924 through Lillehammer 1994. Goldplated sheath of laurel branches and goldplated finely detailed top. Housed in a leather case lined in velvet and silk, with gold lettering of appointment to Queen Elizabeth and Duke of Edinborough. EF. (\$800)

447. **The Pierre de Coubertin Medal, an IOC Award Medal for Education Created in 1997.** Goldplated, 84mm (by Andre Ricard). Shape of a polished disk, Olympic rings in center emitting five rays of light in high relief, "CITIUS ALTIUS FORTIUS" around the edge. Rev. Bust I. of Coubertin surrounded by "Medaille Pierre de Coubertin". The award is presented to people in the field of education who promoted the Olympic Movement. The first recipient in 1997 at the 106th IOC Session was President Samaranch. It is awarded yearly at IOC Sessions. With 18mm goldplated miniature pin with ribbon. Housed in green velvet case, gold rings on top. EF. (\$950)

448. **Olympic Order Diploma, December 1997.** Gold embossed, 21x29.6cm (8.3"x11.7"). Signed by IOC President J.A. Samaranch. **Plus Award Certificate** for "outstanding merit in the cause of world sport". Buyer will see the recipient's name. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$750)

NAGANO, 18th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1998

449. **Official Torch.** Aluminum, partially gilt, 55cm (21.7") long. Designed after ancient Japanese torches called Taimatsu. It shows the Nagano emblem and sports pictograms, and a brightly colored orange cord wrapped around the lower part forms the grip. Fueled with clean burning propane, it burnt for about 20 minutes. The torch relay in Japan took place from January 6 until February 7, when the Olympic fire was lit during the opening ceremony. Choice EF, in original cardboard box. (\$6,000)
450. **Swiss Olympic Team Medal.** Silvered, partially enameled in color, 56x56mm. Logo between Japanese and Swiss shield. Rev. Japanese and English legend. Unc., in presentation case. (\$180)
451. **Group of 13 Different Polish Team Pins.** Multicolor, domed, 30x20mm (12 pcs) and 20x20mm. Nagano logo and pictogram of events in which the Polish team participated, plus Polish NOC Pin. EF. (13 pcs.) (\$100)
452. **Cased U.S. Team Pin Set of 17 Pins.** Multicolor enamel, each 35x40mm. All 14 sports the team participated in such as ice hockey, snowboarding, figure skating etc., plus sports medicine, staff and NOC. All EF, cased. (\$150)
453. **Rare Kirin Ski Jumper Noritake Bone China Beer Stein.** 16cm (6.3") high, 14cm (5.5") wide, designed by Shigeo Fukuda. The handle is formed by a gold ski jumper, color logo surrounded by silver snowflakes. In original box. EF. Rare. (\$225)
454. **Commemorative Blue and White Mascots Plate.** Porcelain, 25cm (8.8"), by Hachijuni Bank. Four Nagano Snowlet mascots on ski hill surrounded by legend. EF. (\$80)
