39. **Moscow 1980. United States Olympic Team Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 75mm, by Tiffany & Co. Flaming torch between rings and "1980", United States Olympic Team" above. Rev. Five doves flying towards "Games of the XXII Olympiad". With fob and tricolor ribbon in American colors. *This medal, styled like a winner's medal, was presented to American 1980 Moscow team members by the United States Olympic Committee after President Carter decided to boycott the Moscow Olympic Games in protest of the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan. Seldom seen. EF. (\$1,500)*

40. **Calgary 1988 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Ice Hockey, Housed in its Presentation Case.** Goldplated silver, 69mm, made by Jostens. Joint profiles of Native American and Olympic winner left, headdress made of winter sports equipment. Rev. Large Calgary 1988 logo. With multicolor ribbon, in presentation case (lt. wear inside). Medal partially toned, EF. (\$30,000)

41. **Calgary 1988 Winter. Official Torch Used in the Torch Relay.** 60cm (23.6"), maplewood handle with pictograms of 10 Olympic winter sports, steel torch bowl at top with Calgary Olympic legend in English and French. Unused wick inside top bowl. *The flame was flown from Athens, Greece to St. John, Newfoundland. In 88 days, it was carried about 18,000 km across Canada by 6,520 torchbearers sharing torches. Only about 100 torches were made. With black carrying pouch. Unused, EF. (\$37,500)*

42. **Albertville 1992 Winter. Official Torch.** Steel, 42cm (16.5"), up to 8cm (3.2") wide, designed by famous French designer Philippe Starck. The torch, when turned over, has the shape of a flame. The flame was lit in Olympia on November 27, 1991, when the relay through Greece started. It left Greece on December 8 on the Concorde to visit about 70 countries and islands worldwide, to arrive in Paris on December 14. 5,500 torchbearers carried the flame 5,536 km (3,440 miles) around France to Albertville where the cauldron was lit at the opening ceremony on February 8, 1992, by Michel Platini and Francoise-Cyrille Grange, a Savoyard girl. One of only 100 torches, numbered, and very difficult to find. EF. (\$65,000)

43. **Albertville 1992 Winter. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Biathlon.** Silver and Lalique crystal, 92mm, 9mm thick. The crystal shows large Olympic rings over Alpine mountains, set in a silver border which is engraved with logo and olive branch, Albertville 92 legend at bottom. No sport was engraved on the Albertville 1992 medals although an IOC direction asked for it. With silver ribbon, Olympic color stripes in center. The medals were entirely handmade by Lalique in 35 different processes. Buyer will receive the name of the winner. Housed in gray leatherette case lined in gray velvet, logo on top, a few spots on box. Medal Unc. A beautiful and very rare medal. (\$32,500)

44. **The Olympic Order in Silver, Housed in its Presentation Case.** Silver, 22.5x32.8cm (8.9"x12.9"), designed by Otl Aicher. Five rings in the center are flanked by olive leaves leading into a chain. Since 1975, the Olympic Order represents the highest award of the IOC. Housed in blue presentation case, silver Olympic rings attached on top, inside lined in blue velvet and silk. Box VF. Order EF. Rare. (\$11,000)

45. **Official Award Sculpture Presented by IOC President Jacques Rogge.** 21.5cm (8.5") high, made by Bertoni. Two large sails, silver Olympic rings on top of left sail, mounted on black base with "Jacques Rogge" signature panel in front. Housed in large blue leather and velvet lined presentation case. EF. (\$800)




46. **Beijing 2008. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Men's Soccer to a Member of the Argentinian Soccer Team.** Goldplated silver, 70mm, with circle of inlaid light green jade on reverse. Winged goddess of Victory above Panathenaic Stadium in Athens. Rev. Logo in center surrounded by jade, event engraved at top and bottom. Ornate loop, with red and orange ribbon with "Beijing 2008" and Olympic rings. Housed in its red presentation case and gray silk case. EF. (\$35,000)

47. **London 2012. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Men's Artistic Gymnastics, Housed in its Presentation Case.** Silver, 85mm (3.4"), by Elena Votsi and Kostas Kazakos (obv.), and David Watkins (rev.) Winged Nike over Panathinaikon Stadium in Athens. Rev. Large London 2012 logo. Edge inscribed. With purple ribbon inscribed in white. Housed in its presentation case with card describing the medal. Buyer will receive the event and name of the well-known winner. Lt. wear on high points, EF. (\$35,000)

Winged Nike over Panathinaikon Stadium in Athens. Rev. Large London 2012 logo. Edge inscribed. With purple ribbon inscribed in white. Housed in its presentation case. *Buyer will receive name and event of winner.* EF. **(\$28,000)**

49. **Rio 2016. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Artistic Gymnastics – Men, and Housed in its Wooden Presentation Case.** Sterling silver, 8.5cm (3.3"), abt. 500 grams, obverse by Elena Votsi and Kostas Kazakos. Winged Nike, Goddess of Victory, over the Panathinaikon Stadium in Athens, the Acropolis

in background. Rev. The Rio 2016 Olympic logo. Edge inscribed. With green and multicolor ribbon. *Awarded in a single event, and the buyer will receive the name of the winner.* Housed in its unround wooden case with the logo impressed on top. Lt. wear on medal, VF-EF. Case EF. **(\$32,000)**

50. **IOC Session and Congress Badges**
54th IOC Session in Tokyo, 1958. Tokyo Metropolitan Association Badge. Silver, partially goldplated, 45x27mm. "IOC" in center, the letter "O" being a red stone, between "1958-Tokyo". EF. Rare. **(\$700)**
