Bidding will continue after 8 pm for lots with active bidding until 10 minutes pass without a new bid. We also accept bids by email, phone, mail and fax (by fax: please follow up by phone or email to confirm that bids were received). All bids by email will be acknowledged. E-mail bids which have not been acknowledged have not been received. Phone bids must be confirmed in writing upon request. The estimates listed in the catalog are starting prices. Bids will be increased per the increment table on our website. If you enter a maximum bid (your highest), the bidding will be incremented as needed to win the lot, up to your maximum bid. Bids must be for an entire lot. Auctioneer reserves the right to extend bidding.

Value estimates are for guidance only. **Bids under estimate will not be accepted.** Bids must be for an entire lot. Bids will be accepted by lot number only. Each lot constitutes a separate sale.

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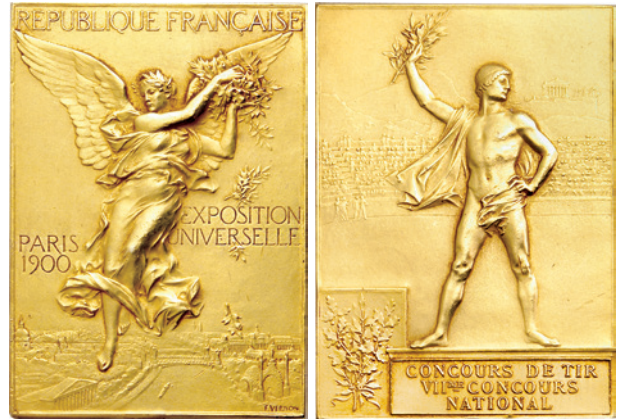
Highlights of the Auction



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1. **Grenoble 1968 Winter. Very Rare Official Torch, One of Only 33 Torches.** Copper, 76cm (29.9”) long, with partial green original wrapping, weight about 4.5 lbs. (abt. 2 kg), made by Société Technique d' Equipment et de Fournitures Industrielles (STEFI). The torch top looks like a flame. It is also decorated by three silver logo plaques on its sides, designed by Roger Excoffon. Green wrapping soiled, a few small minor bumps, toned, abt. EF. **(\$200,000)**

The flame was lit in Olympia, Greece on December 16, 1967. The first torchbearer was Tassos Bahouras. The relay went first to



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2. **Paris 1900. Gold Winner's Plaque Awarded for Shooting.** Vermeil (goldplated silver), hallmarked, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Fame scattering laurel branches over exhibition. Rev. Victorious athlete on podium inscribed “Concours/de Tir / V^{me} Concours / National”. *All sport events in Paris were considered to be Olympic Games events.* Choice Unc., housed In green box with gold legend, lined in velvet and silk. **(\$5,000)**
3. **Paris 1900. Silver Award Plaque for Gymnastics.** Hallmarked silver, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Fame scattering laurel branches over exhibition. Rev. Victorious athlete on podium inscribed “Championnat / de Gymnastique”. Housed in red case with gold inscription on top, lined in velvet and silk, VF-EF. Plaque polished EF. **(\$3,500)**



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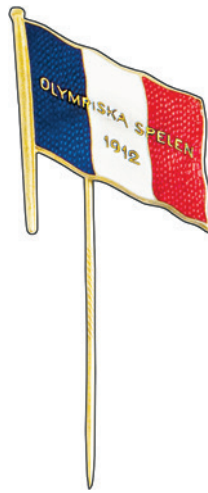


4. **St. Louis 1904. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded to Milton A. Hellman in the 4x400 Yard Relay in the Interscholastic Meet for the State of Missouri, May 14, 1904.** Silver, 32mm, by Mermod & Jaccard. AAU logo above Meet information and Missouri State emblem in open olive wreath. Rev. 3-line engraved award legend. Suspended from bar with "1904/Universal Exhibition/Olympic Games/St. Louis". EF. (\$3,500)
5. **St. Louis 1904. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Awarded for "Run Broadjump" to Milton A. Hellman, Olympic Interscholastic Handicap Meet on June 29, 1904.** Bronze, 32mm, by Dieges of Clust, New York. Bust of Peace facing at top between 6-line event legend and oak branch. Rev. "Run Broadjump/M.A. Hellman" engraved in 2 lines. Suspended from bar with legend "1904/Universal Exposition/Olympic Games/St. Louis" and red-white-blue ribbon (frayed). *All athletic events in St. Louis were Olympic events. Mallon, The 1904 Olympic Games, page 89.* Toned EF. (\$5,000)
6. **Athens 1906. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 50mm, by J.C. Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch on globe. *Same design as the 1896 winners medal, only the date changed. While in 1896 only a silver and bronze medal were awarded for the first two places, in 1906 the Committee awarded gold, silver and bronze medals.* Lightly toned EF. (\$7,000)

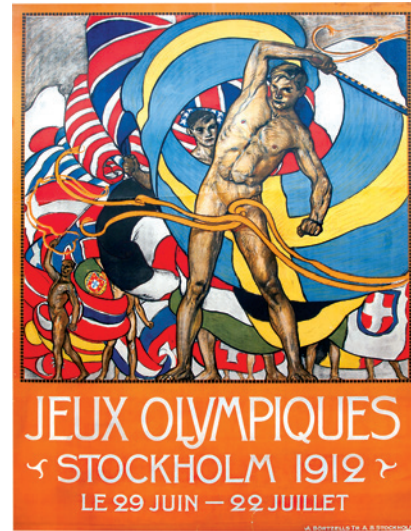
7. **London 1908. Comité d'Honneur Badge.** Goldplated, partial red enamel, 48x56mm, made by Vaughton. Helmeted head left of Pallas Athene, laurel branch at left. *The recipients included some IOC members.* Elbel S-5. Very rare in gold, a beautiful badge! EF. (\$9,000)
8. **London 1908. Organizing Committee Badge.** Silvered, partially blue enamel, 57mm. Elbel S-8. EF. Scarce. (\$4,000)
9. **Stockholm 1912. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 33mm, by Erik Lindberg and Bertram MacKenna, struck by Sporrang & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. Lt. rubbing on high points, EF. (\$7,500)
10. **Stockholm 1912. Participation Medal Struck in Bronze.** Bronze, 51mm, by Lindberg/MacKenna. Zeus seated on Ionian column holding figure of Victory, Stockholm in background. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing l. *Only 100 medals were struck in bronze for presentation to the Presidents of the Special Commissions and the Chairmen of the International Juries. Athletes received a pewter medal.* Toned EF. Rare. (\$2,500)



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11. **Stockholm 1912. Chef de Mission and Special Committee President's Badge.** Silver, with blue and yellow cockade, 60mm. *The badge entitled the wearer to the Committee Box in the Stadium. Official report (English) p. 162. Elbel S-3. Cockade abt. EF, badge EF. Rare. (\$2,700)*
12. **Stockholm 1912. French Interpreter's Badge.** Goldplated, 30x25mm. French tricolor enameled flag with "Olympiska Spelen/1912" in gold. Elbel S-11. EF. Rare. (\$2,000)
13. **Stockholm 1912. Official Poster.** 75x105cm (29.1"x41.3"), designed by Olle Hjörzberg, Swedish Professor at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts, printed by A. Bortzells, Stockholm. Nude young men waving flags of participating nations, legend in French below. *At the time, the design was considered too daring by some countries, and the poster and seals with this design were not distributed in the respective countries (China and Holland). Center crease, lt. spots upper right corner, a few sm. marginal tears. Lined on linen. Bright colors, VF-EF. (\$2,500)*
14. **Beautiful Art Nouveau Vase Illustrating Sports of the Stockholm 1912 Olympic Games by Celebrated Artist Carl Hjalmar Norrström.** Etched bronze, colored and gilded, 48cm (18.9") high, 24cm (9.5") wide. Three figures of Nike, goddess of Victory holding a laurel wreath in each hand divides three panels of sports illustrations. In the first panel a group of four runners is trying to catch Nike's winners wreath. The second panel shows



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five young men playing soccer, a discus thrower and a javelin thrower in upper right in background. The third panel depicts four tennis players in a game of Doubles, three tennis players waiting their turn in background. There is a gold border of olive branches around the top, the bottom half is decorated with numerous green olive wreaths and gold flowers. The vase stands on four small balls. Signed on bottom gold border "C.H. Norrström 1912". C.H. Norrström (1853-1923) studied at the Royal Academy in Stockholm, also at the Ecole des Arts Decoratifs in Paris from 1877 to 1880. He was a sculptor, a painter and celebrated for his bronze etched artworks. He received a gold medal at the Paris 1900 World Exposition, and his works are displayed at the Stockholm National Museum. *The first time Olympic events are depicted on a work of art. Small bumps, color faded in lower half of vase, abt. EF. (\$15,000)*



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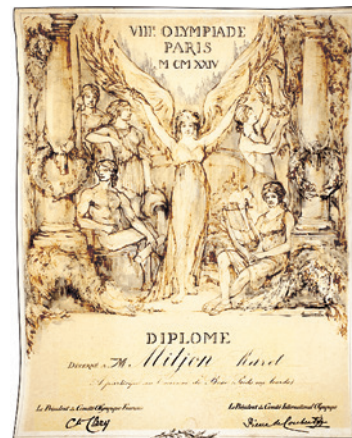
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15. **Chamonix 1924 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Housed in its Presentation Case.** Goldplated silver, 55mm, by Raoul Benard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. Housed in its presentation case lined in green velvet and silk. An extremely rare winner's medal from the First Olympic Winter Games. EF. (\$35,000)
16. **Chamonix 1924 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by Raoul Benard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. An extremely rare winner's medal from the First Olympic Winter Games. The participation medal had the same design. Toned EF. (\$16,000)

17. **Paris 1924. International Sports Federation Official's Badge.** Bronze, white enamel, 34x42mm. With red ribbon inscribed in gold (partially faint) "FEDERATION INTERNATIONALE". Elbel S-3. EF. Rare. (\$3,000)
18. **Paris 1924. Participation Diploma and Participation Medal of Karel Leendert Miljon, Boxer in Light Heavyweight from Holland.** Diploma 60.5x75cm (23.8"x29.5"), brown and gray colors by Bernard Naudin. Winged Goddess of Victory between athletes and allegorical figures. *Miljon won a bronze medal when he competed again in Amsterdam 1928. See lot 22.* Light browning, lightly cut around the border, small water spots at bottom. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. City view over French legend in three lines. Rev. Victory with laurel wreaths crowning victorious athletes. Toned EF. (2 pcs.) (\$1,850)
19. **St. Moritz 1928 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Won by Famous Norwegian Skier Johan Groettumsbraaten, Housed in its Presentation Case.** Goldplated silver, 50mm, by Arnold Hünerwadel. Female skater with outstretched arms surrounded by icicles. Rev. 5-line French legend between olive branches, Olympic rings above, "Johan Grøttumsbraaten" engraved at bottom. He was the best skier in the 1920's and early 1930's in Nordic Combined and Cross-country. He won gold in both events in St. Moritz 1928, having already won a silver medal and two bronze medals in Chamonix in 1924. He went on to win gold in Nordic Combined in Lake Placid 1932. Housed in its cardboard presentation case, legend on top partially missing, medal EF. (\$35,000)



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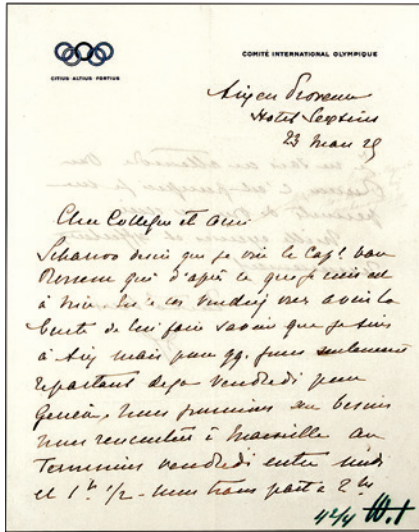
20. **St. Moritz 1928 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by Arnold Hünerwadel. Female skater with outstretched arms surrounded by ice crystals. Rev. Olympic rings above 5-line French legend, olive branches on sides. Only 25 bronze medals were awarded. Very rare. Uneven toning on rev., EF. **(\$10,000)**
21. **Amsterdam 1928. Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 55mm by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. *This design was selected in a competition by the IOC, and winner's medals kept the same design through Mexico City 1968.* Polished EF. **(\$11,000)**

22. **Amsterdam 1928. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Boxing to Karel Leendert Miljon, Together with the Award Diploma, The Participation Medal and the Participant's Badge. Bronze Winner's Medal,** Bronze, 55mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. *This design was selected in a competition by the IOC, and it stayed the winner's medals design through Mexico City 1968.* Toned EF. **Third Place Winner's Diploma.** Black and gold, 54.5x74.2cm (21.3"x29.2"), by C.J. van der Hoef. Winged Nike above Olympic rings, beautiful Art Deco design. Inscribed in black "3e Pris/K.L. Miljon Holland/Voor/Boksen (Zwaarmiddengewicht)". 7.5cm tear at bottom (taped), o.w. EF. Plus his **Participation Medal** and his **Competitor Badge**, both toned EF. *A very seldom seen group from a Boxing winner.* All EF. (4 pcs.) **(\$10,000)**

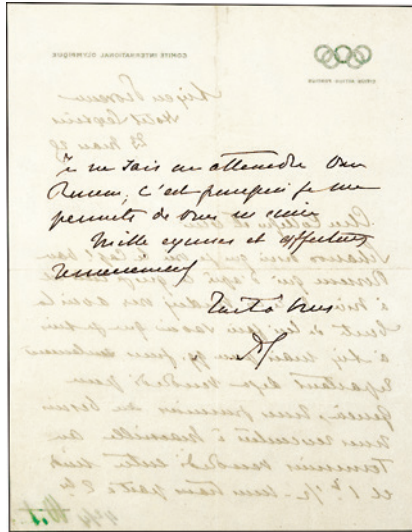

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23. **Amsterdam 1928. Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 55mm, by J.C. Wienecke. Nude male and female athlete on podium holding torch over Olympic flame. Rev. Nike over Marathon Tower, shield of Amsterdam between two hemispheres. *A very small number of participation medals were goldplated. The referee of the Uruguayan soccer team, Domingo Lombard, also received a gold participation medal (see Auction 72, lot 255).* Rare. EF. (\$5,000)
24. **Handwritten Letter in Ink by Pierre de Coubertin, March 23, 1929 on Official Letterhead of the IOC.** Two pages, 21x27cm (8.3"x10.6"). The letter is written as Coubertin is at the Hotel Sextius in Aix-en-Provence, returning soon to Geneva by train. He tells his colleague and friend (who?) that Peter Wilhelm Scharroo, Dutch IOC member 1924-1950, wants him to meet Captain van

- Rossem, president of the Amsterdam 1928 Games, who is presently in Nice. He could also meet him at the train station in Marseille on his way back to Geneva. Also enclosed in this lot is a copy of a letter in English that Coubertin wrote to Tait McKenzie on May 28, 1928, asking him for copies of his famous works for the Olympic Museum: "Brothers of the Wind" and "Joy of Effort". Plus a photocopy of an invitation to the USOC President to attend the Paris 1924 Olympic Games. Coubertin official letter folded twice, signed with his initials. Abt. EF. (\$1,200)
25. **Los Angeles 1932. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. EF. (\$7,000)
26. **Garmisch-Partenkirchen 1936 Winter. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded to the German National Ladies Team in Curling.** Silvered bronze, 57x87mm, by Poellath. Color enameled logo in laurel wreath affixed over plaque with 6-line award legend. *Curling was a demonstration sport in 1936. The women's curling club team from Zwiesel won the silver medal (Official report p. 406).* Toned EF. A seldom seen winner's medal. (\$4,500)

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27. **St. Moritz 1948 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Housed in Presentation Case.** Goldplated silver, 60mm by Huguenin. Hand holding torch in raised design, Olympic rings and snowflakes in background. Rev. 4-line French legend between ice crystals. *This is an actual winner's medal, not an inscribed presentation medal.* Housed in brown leather case (lt. wear), lined in velvet and silk (spots). Medal EF. **(\$25,000)**
28. **London 1948. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Housed in its Presentation Case.** Silver, 50mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Housed in its blue leatherette case, VF. Medal EF. **(\$8,000)**
29. **Oslo 1952 Winter. Official Torch of the First Winter Olympic Torch Relay.** Silver colored alloy of brass and steel, 22cm (8.7") high, 32x15.5cm (12.6"x6.1") wide, designed by Geir Grung and Adolf Thoresen. On the oval top are the Olympic rings and "1952", also "Morgedal" pointing with an arrow to "Oslo". *Cauldrons were*

- burning already in Garmisch-Partenkirchen 1936 and St. Moritz 1948, but Oslo staged the first torch relay of the Olympic Winter Games. A fire was lit on February 13 in the birthplace of 19th century skiing legend Sondre Norheim (1825-1897), considered the father of skiing in Norway, in Morgedal, Telemark. 94 skiers carried the flame for 225km through Kongsberg, Drammen, the Huseby Hill at Oraker where skiing competitions had been held since 1879, to Oslo where it arrived on February 15 for the Opening Ceremony in Bislett Stadium. The last torchbearer was Eigil Nansen, grandson of the Norwegian Polar explorer Fridtjof Nansen. EF, lt. discoloration around top opening from the flame, o.w. EF. Rare and important torch of about 100 of the First Winter Olympic Torch Relay. **(\$65,000)***
30. **Helsinki 1952. Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 50mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Goldplating worn on highpoints, toned, abt. EF. **(\$12,000)**



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31. **Helsinki 1952. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal in Presentation Case Won by Soviet-Jewish Gymnast Maria Gorochovskia in Floor Exercises.** Silver, 50mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Toned EF, in bezel with loop and part of ribbon in Olympic colors. Housed in blue presentation case, abt. EF. The medal is accompanied by her **Second Place Winner's Diploma** Awarded for gymnastics "Voimistelu Vapaaliike" (Gymnastics Free Movement – Floor Exercises). 35x50cm (13.8"x19.7"). Creases, tear at top, VF+. Her **Identity Card** with photo, VF+. Plus her **Bronze Winner's Medal and Diploma in the Rome 1954 Gymnastics World Championship.** Medal 50mm, by Moschi, EF, housed in damaged box. **Diploma** EF. *The Soviet Union participated for the first time in Olympic Games in Helsinki, and Maria Gorochovskia dominated women's gymnastics winning 2 gold medals and 5 silver medals. Born in 1921 she emigrated in 1990 to Israel where she died in 2001. An outstanding group of an outstanding gymnast.* (5 pcs.) **(\$14,000)**
32. **Cortina 1956 Winter. Official Torch.** Aluminum, 47cm (18.5") long. "VII° GIOCHI OLIMPICI INVERNALI CORTINA 1956" legend, cut-out Olympic rings at top. *The flame was lit at the Temple of Jupiter in Rome on January 22, 1956, and flown to Venice. The torch relay from there went to Cortina where the fire was lit in the stadium at the opening ceremony on January 26 by Guido Caroli.* VF-EF. **(\$22,000)**



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33. **Cortina 1956 Winter. Large Size Award Vase for Gold Medal Winners in Cortina 1956.** Cast bronze, 21cm (8.3") high with carrying handle. Vase has three legs in the shape of a Greek tripod, "CORTINA 1956" legend with Olympic rings on front. Official report p.266. EF. Scarce. **(\$2,000)**

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34. **Stockholm 1936 Equestrian Olympic Games. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 49mm, by J. Sjösvärd/V. Falireus. Rider on horseback l., image after the frieze of the Parthenon. Rev. Torch and Olympic rings. *Only three events were held during these Equestrian Games, single and team. This is one of 12 bronze winner's medals.* EF. Very rare. (\$22,500)

35. **Melbourne 1956. Bronze Third Place Winners Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli. Victory seated about Colosseum Stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Toned EF. (\$7,250)

36. **Tokyo 1964. Large Organizing Committee Badge.** Goldplated, 50x67mm. Olympic colors around top and sides, with blue bar "O.O.C.". With ribbon, two gold stripes in center (Itly. faded). Elbel S-15. Very rare. EF. (\$9,500)

37. **Grenoble 1968 Winter. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Cross Country Skiing, Housed in Presentation Case.** Silver, 60mm, by Roger Excoffon. Logo within French legend. Rev. Depiction of a skier, "FOND" (Cross Country, translated) below. *Winners medals show, for the first time, the sport on the reverse.* With ribbon in Olympic colors. Housed in black leather case with gold logo on top, lined in blue velvet and silk. EF. (\$15,000)

38. **Lake Placid 1980 Winter. There were athletes who didn't know that the events they participated in were Olympic Games events. Few items relate directly to the Games. 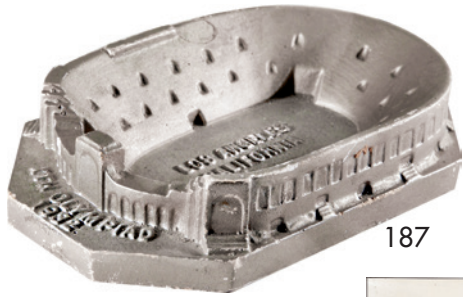
