SECOND NATIONAL GREEK OLYMPIC GAMES, ATHENS, 1870


58. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Class B'. Silver, 37mm, by Barre. Head r. of King George. Rev. Greek legend in open wreath (translated): "Olympia/in Athens/1870/Class B", above "Consecrator of Games Evangelis Zappas". Since 1859 Greece tried to revive the ancient Olympic Games. A few sm. rim nicks, VF. (\$2,000)


THIRD NATIONAL GREEK OLYMPIC GAMES, ATHENS, 1875

59. Copper Winner's Medal. Copper, 41mm, by Barre. Head r. of King George. Rev. "Olympia in Athens 1875" surrounded by "Consecrator of Games Evangelis Zappas" (translated from Greek) and open olive wreath. Since 1859 Greece tried to revive the ancient Olympic Games. Toned Unc. (\$1,500)

ATHENS, 1st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1896

60. **Participation Medal in Presentation Case.** Bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath, phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Greek legend in laurel wreath. EF, in original round leatherette box. (\$1,500)






PARIS, 2nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1900

The 1900 Paris Olympic Games were held in conjunction with the World's Exposition. They played only a minor role. There were athletes who didn't know that the events they participated in were Olympic Games events. Few items relate directly to the Games. For this reason, we are also offering items commemorating the World Exposition.

- 61. **Silver Winner's Medal Awarded for Gymnastics.** Hallmarked silver, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Fame scattering laurel branches over exhibition. Rev. Victorious athlete on podium inscribed "Championnat / de Gymnastique". Housed in red case with gold inscription on top, lined in velvet and silk, VF-EF. Plaque polished EF. (\$2,400)
- 62. Official Olympic Games Silver Plaque. Silvered bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Fame scattering laurel branches over exposition. Rev. Victorious athlete on podium inscribed "Exercises Physiques et Sports". This is the only plaque with the official name of the Olympic Games during the World Exposition. The official report states that this plaque was also presented to the judges. Lightly toned EF. (\$1,000)



- 63. **Athletics Bronze Winner's Plaque.** Bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed "Concours de Jeux Athletiques" *Athletic events were Olympic events*. Small spots obverse, EF. (\$1,200)
- 64. **Silver Shooting Winner's Plaque.** Silvered bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed "CONCOURS DE TIR/VII CONCOURS/NATIONAL". Toned EF. (\$1,000)
- 65. Ninth Shooting Competition for Students. Silver Winner's Plaque. Silverplated bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Fame scattering laurel branches over Exposition. Rev. Victorious athlete on podium inscribed "IXth Championnat/De Tir/Des Lycées/et Collèges". Light toning, choice EF. (\$800)
- Minister of Sports Bronze Award Plaque. Bronze, 41x59mm, obverse by F. Vernon. Victorious athlete on podium. Rev. 5-line legend. EF. (\$500)
- Minister of Public Education. Bronze Award Plaque. Bronze, 41x59mm, obverse by F. Vernon. Victorious athlete on podium. Rev. 5-line legend. EF. (\$500)
- 68. Large Silver Jury Plaque in Presentation Case. Silver, 7.3x12.8cm (2.9"x5") uniface, by L. Bottée, made by Christofle, Paris. Seated fame with palm branch and horn, "1900" within rays above, "Jury" on plaque below. Numbered. Housed in original case lined in green velvet. A beautiful plaque by the famous Christofle Goldsmith Company in Paris. EF. (\$1,200)
- 70. **Bronze Award Medal of the Paris 1900 World's Exposition.**Bronze, 61mm, by Chaplain. Head of French Republic r. Rev. Male with torch carried by Victory. Awarded to "J. Symons and Co., Limited". Since no participation medals were made in 1900, collectors like to add this medal to their collection. Toned EF. (\$180)

ST. LOUIS, 3rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1904

The 1904 Olympic Games in St. Louis were also held in conjunction with a World's Fair. This, again, detracted a lot from the importance of the Games. Few items are available that relate directly to the Olympiad, and they usually command very high prices. For this reason we are also offering some memorabilia from the World's Fair which celebrated the Centennial of the Louisiana Purchase from Napoleon in 1803.

71. St. Louis 1904. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded to Milton A. Hellman in the 880 Yards Race, Olympic Athletic Meet for Schools in Louisiana Purchase Exposition Territory. Silver, 35mm, by Mermod & Jaccard. Winged foot surrounded by ribbon with event legend, rays around sides. Rev. Engraved award legend in 5 lines "Second/880 Yd. Run/Won by/Milton A. Hellman/2.06.4/5". Suspended from silver bar with "1904/ Universal Exposition/Olympic Games/St. Louis". All athletic events in St. Louis were Olympic events. See Mallon, The 1904 Olympic Games, page 76. Attractive winner's medal. Toned EF. (\$5,000)





- 72. **Group of Four Commemorative Sterling Silver Spoons.** Three spoons 15cm (5.9") long. Two depict the Cascade Gardens, and the Industrial Palace; one depicts the Festival Hall with Cascades, and the Conquest of the West until the arrival of the Railroad. A fourth spoon, 13.5cm (5.3"), depicts the Palace of Library and Arts. All EF. (4 pcs.) (\$140)
- 73. **Group of Four Tickets of the Track & Field Olympic Games, August 28-31, 1904.** Green, 7x11.7cm. Archie Hahn wins 200M on August 31; Thomas Hicks wins the Marathon on August 30 etc. Peripheral browning, o.w. EF. (\$220)

LONDON, 4th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1908

- 74. **Silver Participation Medal.** Silver, 50mm, by B. MacKennal. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. *Presented to dignitaries and high officials*. EF. (\$1,500)
- 75. **Participation Medal.** White metal, 50mm, by B. MacKennal. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. *Presented to the athletes*. VF-EF, holed at top. (\$400)
- 76. German Gymnastic Society, London. Silver First Prize Winner's Medal for Pole Jump. Silver, 50mm, 62.7 grams, by O.K., made by Waterlow's, London. Nude Hercules standing, with club. Rev. 5-line engraved award legend in oak wreath. In 1861 the German Gymnastic Society was founded by E.G. Ravenstein. He was also instrumental in 1865 in setting up the National Olympian Society, together with Wm. Penny Brookes of the Wenlock Olympian Society, and J. Hulley from Liverpool. EF, lt. hdlg. in fields. (\$240)
- 77. **Participant's Badge.** Silvered, partially enameled, 30mm. Helmeted head l. of Athena facing laurel sprig, surrounded by legend on blue enamel. Numbered on back. Elbel S-9. EF. (\$650)

78. Very Early International Olympic Committee Medal, 1910. Goldplated silver, color enamelled, 25mm, by Vaughton & Sons, Birmingham. Olympic motto on red and white ribbon flanked by two olive branches, "Comité International Olympique" on outer edge. Looped, white ribbon with red center stripe. Rare. EF. (\$500)

STOCKHOLM, 5th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1912

- 79. Participation Medal. Pewter, 51mm, by Lindberg/MacKennal. Zeus seated on Ionian column holding figure of Nike, Stockholm in back. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing l. EF. (\$300)
- 80. **Miniature Silver Olympic Merit Medal.** Silver, 15mm. Head l. of King Gustav V. Rev. 3-line Olympic legend over crossed branches. Crown at top, and loop. EF. (\$100)



81. **Official Silver Logo Pin.** Silver, hallmarked, 22x26mm. Nude flagbearers with flags of participating nations, legend below. Toned EF. (\$200)

- 82. **Pair of Commemorative Pins. Olympic Stadium Pin.** Silvered, 35x24mm. View of stadium between Olympic legend. **Plus Crowned Shield Pin.** Bronze and blue enamel, 12x17mm. Crown above shield with Swedish legend "Olympic Games Stockholm 1912". Both EF. (2 pcs.) (\$120)
- 83. **Official Stadium Program, July 7, 1912.** 56pp., 14.3x22.2cm (5.6"x8.7"), in Swedish and English. Track & Field, Wrestling, also Modern Pentathlon and Swimming, 2 pages of pencil notes above events. Lt. browning, abt. EF. (\$120)
- 84. **Official Stadium Program, July 9, 1912.** 64pp., 13.8x20.9cm (5.4"x8.2"), in Swedish and English. 4x100-Meter Relay won by Great Britain's team. Covers VF, inside abt. EF. (**\$120**)
- 85. **Official Stadium Program, July 10, 1912.** 64pp., 14.4x22.2cm (5.7"x8.7"), in Swedish and English. A. Jackson, Great Britain, wins 1500 Meters; H. Kolehmainen, Finland, wins 5000 Meters etc. Some results penciled in. Abt. EF. (\$150)
- 86. **Sixth Olympic Congress in Paris, June 1914. Official IOC Plaque.** Bronze, 70x45mm, by André M. Méry. Nude Greek athlete at r. looking at the IOC seat in Parc Pomery, "Congrès/International/Olympique/Juin 1914" on panel below. Rev. View of Paris. Very rare plaque. Toned EF. (\$900)

87. (Rules) Swedish Games in Stockholm, July 8-16, 1916. Rules for Greco-Roman Wrestling. 11pp., 14.2x21cm (5.6"x8.3"), in Swedish. Rare brochure of the Swedish Games held instead of the cancelled 1916 Olympic Games in Berlin. Crease, VF-EF. (\$200)

ANTWERP, 7th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1920

- 88. Cased Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal. Bronze, 60mm, by Joshua Dupont. Nude victorious athlete with palm branch and laurel wreath, fame blowing horn. Rev. View of Antwerp. Housed in its leatherette case, gold legend on top, VF. Medal toned EF. (\$6,000)
- 89. (Book) Tegner, Torsten. Paris Antwerpen Chamonix. Olympiska Glimtar (Olympic glimpses, translated from Swedish). Stockholm, 1924. 126pp. illustrated, 16x23.7cm (6.3"x9.3"), in Swedish. Olympic notes, sports and travels. Softbound, spots, contents EF. (\$80)
- 90. Seventh IOC Congress in Lausanne, 1921. Swimming Federation Congress Medal Held in Conjunction with the IOC Congress. Silver, 23mm. Chillon Castle in Lake Geneva, "Year II of the VII Olympiad" below. Rev. Laurel and palm branch. Looped, with ring. EF. (\$120)

CHAMONIX, 1st OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1924

91. Original Chamonix 1924 Olympic Bobsleigh Events Film. 8mm film, by Pathé Baby, France. Jean de Rovera made a film of the winter Olympic Games events. Chamonix wasn't declared the first Olympic Winter Games until the following year; at the time of the Chamonix Games they were considered part of the VIIIth Olympic Summer Games. EF. Rare. (\$300)
