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Highlights of the Auction



1. **Official Torch of the Stockholm 1956 Equestrian Olympic Games.** Aluminum alloy, 41cm (16.1") high, mounted on wooden base, 14.9cm (5.9"), 5.5cm (2.2") high. Cut-out Olympic rings above legend "**XVI OLYMPIAD 1956: OLYMPIA-STOCKHOLM**". Our research so far revealed that only five torches were used in the torch relay in Sweden. One of these torches resides in the Olympic Stadium Museum in Stockholm. Another torch (one only ?) was used in the torch relay in Copenhagen, Denmark. Two torches came up a few years ago from individuals whose relatives had worked in important positions for the manufacturer of the torches. A third torch was sold in Auction 73. The torch in this auction comes from the family of an employee of a company closely associated with the torch relay. The buyer of the torch will receive a letter from the son of the employee.

A unique opportunity to acquire an important part of the unique Equestrian Olympic Games in Stockholm. Be aware of auction rules stating that the torch cannot be returned for any reason after two months from the auction date. Less than 10 torches are known, one of the rarest of all Olympic torch relays. Polished, VF. (\$280,000)

The 1956 Equestrian Olympic Torch Relay from Olympia to Stockholm

When Melbourne was awarded the 1956 Olympic Games at the 43rd IOC Session in Rome in 1949, the strict 6-month quarantine rules regarding the entry of horses into Australia was not considered. At the 50th IOC Session in Athens 1954, Stockholm was chosen - against Paris, Rio de Janeiro, Berlin and Los Angeles - to hold the 1956 Equestrian Olympic Games.

The fire for the Olympia-Stockholm torch relay was lit on June 2 in Olympia, Greece, and carried by runners with the Helsinki 1952 torch over 325 km to Athens. A hurricane lamp was lit by a representative of SAS Airlines, and a few hours later it landed at Copenhagen's Kastrup Airport. Riders carried the Stockholm torch into the city where it was kept overnight in the Town Hall.

The following day the flame was flown to Malmö in the south of Sweden. From there 150 riders took the flame in the Stockholm torch relay in five days and nights to Stockholm.

On the opening day on June 10, 1956, Hans Wikne rode with the flaming torch into the stadium where he lit the cauldron. Then two gold medal winners, Karen Lindgren (Gymnastics, Helsinki 1952) and Henry Eriksson (1500 Meters, London 1948) ran with their lit torches to the two stadium towers where already during the Stockholm 1912 Olympic Games fires had been burning throughout the Games. According to eyewitness and IOC member Wolf Lyberg, no flame was lit on the opening day on the towers, only on and off during the duration of the Games.



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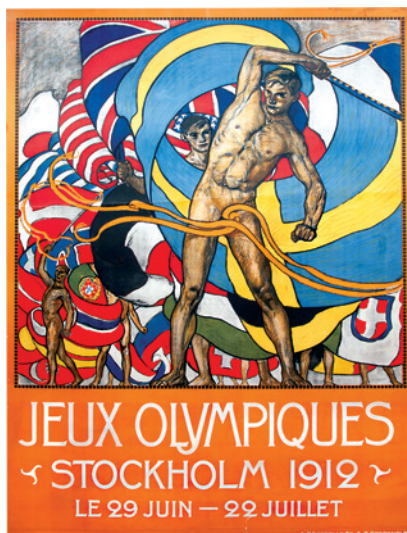


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2. **Paris 1900. Gold Winner's Plaque Awarded for the Automobile Competition, an Official Olympic Event.** Vermeil (goldplated silver), hallmarked, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Fame scattering laurel branches over the exhibition. Rev. Victorious athlete on podium inscribed "Concours/Automobiles". EF, cased, no legend on top of case. Very rare Olympic event in Paris 1900. Unc. (\$4,500)
3. **Paris 1900. Gold Winner's Plaque Awarded for Lifesaving in Water, an Official Olympic Event.** Vermeil (goldplated silver), hallmarked, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Angel scattering laurel branches over Paris Exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete with laurel branch on podium inscribed "CONCOURS DE SAUVETAGE/SUR L'EAU". All events in 1900 were considered Olympic events. Housed in red and gold decorated award case, lined in red velvet and white silk. EF. (\$4,000)
4. **St. Louis 1904. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Standing High Jump to African-American Joseph F. Stadler.** Silver, 40mm, made by Dieges & Clust, New York. Victorious athlete with wreath, Acropolis and ancient Greek athletes in background, "OLYMPIAD 1904". Rev. Victory holding wreath over engraved "Standing High Jump", bust of Zeus at l. Complete with ribbon suspended from silver bar inscribed "1904/Universal Exposition/Olympic Games/St. Louis". According to David Wallechinsky, Stadler was the first African American athlete to win an Olympic medal in a field event. He was a member of the Franklin Athletic

5. **Athens 1906. Cased Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 50mm, by J. Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch on globe. Rev. View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend. Similar to 1896 winner's medal - only the date on the reverse was changed to 1906. In round red leatherette case lined in green velvet. EF. (\$7,500)
6. **Stockholm 1912. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Housed in its Presentation Case.** Bronze, 33mm, by Erik Lindberg and Bertram MacKenna, struck by Sporrong & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. Housed in green leather presentation case. EF. (\$6,500)

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7. **Stockholm 1912. Official Poster.** 75x105cm (29.1"x41.3"), designed by Olle Hjörtzberg, Swedish Professor at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts, printed by A. Bortzells, Stockholm. Nude young men waving flags of participating nations, legend in French below. *At the time, the design was considered too daring by some countries, and the poster and seals with this design were not distributed in the respective countries (China and Holland).* Center crease, lt. spots upper right corner, a few sm. marginal tears. Lined on linen. Bright colors, VF-EF. (\$2,400)
8. **Antwerp 1920. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 60mm, by Dupon. Nude victorious athlete with palm branch and laurel wreath, fame blowing horn. Rev. View of Antwerp. Small loop at top. Lightly toned EF. (\$6,000)
9. **Chamonix 1924 Winter. Third Place Bronze Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by Raoul Benard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. An extremely rare winner's medal from the First Olympic Winter Games. The participation medal had the same design. Toned EF. (\$16,000)
10. **Chamonix 1924 Winter. Participant's Badge.** Silvered, 41mm. "CONCURRENT" on blue enamel. With screw back and disk, numbered. Elbel W-1. Toned EF. Very rare. (\$4,500)
- 11.* **Paris 1924. Fifth Place 400M Winner's Diploma of John Coard Taylor, USA, and his Running Shoes.** Multicolor diploma, visible part 47.3x62cm (18.6"x24.4"), by Bernard Naudin. Matted, in ornate gold frame. Winged Goddess of Victory between athletes and columns decorated with winners' wreaths. A few light spots around edges, o.w. EF. Plus a few large size pages of the **New York Times, July 12, 1924**, with articles about the Paris Olympic Games, including the 400M finals on July 11. Pages enclosed in archival clear plastic. Plus **Taylor's Pair of Black Leather Running Shoes**, with spikes, Size 10. Well worn, Fine. *The 400M*



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finals July 11, 1924 were shown in the film "Chariots of Fire" where Eric Liddell won first place. The diploma and shoes were favorite items of Craig Perlow, the well-known Olympic collector who passed away last year. Items from his collection are marked with a star next to the lot number. Ex: Craig Perlow's Estate. EF, VF and Fine. (3 pcs.) (\$2,400)

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12. **Paris 1924. The Johnny Weissmuller Sèvres Porcelain Gold Medal Award Vase – The Winner of Five Gold Swimming Medals, Future Tarzan Movie Star.** Sèvres porcelain, 33.3cm (13.1”), designed by talented artist M.O. Guillonet and executed by Bracquemond at the world-famous porcelain factory of Sèvres. Golden laurel branches are handpainted on French blue background, the medallions depicting Swimming, Football, Rowing and Rugby on gray background with green border. *Johnny Weissmuller won in Paris 1924 gold medals in 100m freestyle (Duke Kahanamoku second), 400m freestyle, and 4x200m freestyle, additionally a bronze Water Polo team medal. In Amsterdam 1928 he again won gold in 100m freestyle and 4x200m freestyle. In 1922 he broke Duke Kahanamoku's world record in the 100m freestyle. All together, in addition to his Olympic gold medals, he won 52 national U.S. Championships, and set a total of 67 world records in swimming. The Associated Press declared him in 1950 to be the greatest swimmer of the first half of the 20th century. In 1932, he played, for the first time, Tarzan in the movie “Tarzan the Ape*

Man”, and he played that role for a total of 12 Tarzan movies. The vase is accompanied by a Johnny Weissmuller Enterprises certificate of authenticity, signed by his last wife, Maria Weissmuller. EF. A rare opportunity to add the trophy of a famous Olympian to ones’ collection. (\$22,000)

13. **Amsterdam 1928. Gold First Place Winner’s Medal.** Goldplated silver, 55mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. *This design was selected in a competition by the IOC, and winner’s medals kept the same design through Mexico City 1968. Refinished. EF. (\$10,000)*
14. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner’s Medal.** Bronze, 54mm, with scalloped edge, by Julio Kilenyi, struck by Robbins Co. Winged goddess of victory in clouds holding laurel wreath over Lake Placid site with venues. Rev. Olympic rings over Games legend, crossed laurel branches below. EF. Very rare. (\$28,000)



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15. **Los Angeles 1932. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 55mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant team members. EF. (\$7,000)
16. **Garmisch-Partenkirchen 1936 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, "990" hallmarked, 10cm (3.9"), 325.1 grams (almost 10.5 oz), by Richard Klein, struck by Deschler, Munich. Victory holding laurel wreath riding in triga to left, bobsled, ski, hockey stick and skate below. Rev. Large Olympic rings surrounded by "IV Olympic Winter Games 1936" (translated from German). *Largest size Olympic winner's medal until Torino 2006, and one of only 36 medals.* Housed in red leatherette case, silver rings on top scuffed, taped on top edge, part of top right side missing, lined in silk and velvet. Medal EF. Very rare. (\$35,000)
17. **Second Maccabean Winter Games in Banska-Bystrica, February 18-24, 1936. Bronze Third Place Awarded Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 65mm. Athlete wearing Star of David over shield engraved "III", "Stafety" below, ski jumper and skates at sides. Rev. Star of David surrounded by Hebrew legend. **Jewish protests of the Garmisch Olympic Games led to the staging of the Winter Maccabean Games directly after the Garmisch Games which ended on February 16.** Extremely rare medal important to Jewish history during the Third Reich. Toned EF. (\$3,750)

18. **Oslo 1952 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Housed in its Presentation Case.** Goldplated silver, 70mm, by V. Falireus/Knut Yren, struck by Th. Marthinsen C/S. Raised torch with Olympic rings within legend. Rev. Oslo City Hall outlines between snowflakes, 3-line legend below. Housed in its brown velour case, inside lined in velvet and silk, abt. EF. One of only 44 awarded gold medals. Medal EF. (\$32,500)
19. **Helsinki 1952. Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 50mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Goldplating worn on highpoints, toned, VF-EF. (\$10,000)



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20. **Melbourne 1956. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Housed in its Presentation Case.** Silver, 50mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli, struck by Luke Ltd., Melbourne. Victory seated about Colosseum Stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Housed in its plastic case, chips on sides as usual. Medal toned EF. (\$8,500)
21. **Sapporo 1972 Winter. Official Torch.** Bowl cast blackened aluminum alloy, 13x21cm (5.1"x8.3"), with stainless steel flame tube, total 56cm (22") long, designed by Munemichi Yanagi, made by Nippon Kokki Co. The bowl displays the Sapporo Olympic emblem. The torch was carried in Hokkaido by 6,969 torchbearers for a distance of 3173 km. The Japanese relay runners were between 11 and 20 years old, and each had to run 1 km. Only a very small number of torches was made. Used in the torch relay. Lt. wear to bowl, tube discolored from flame, several bumps, VF, bowl abt. EF. Rare (\$28,000)
22. **Innsbruck 1976 Winter. Cased Bronze Winner's Medal for Slalom.** Bronze, 70mm, by M. Coufal. "SLALOM" over Bergisel ski jump, Olympic flame at r. Rev. Official logo and legend. With ribbon in Austrian colors. Housed in red leather case with gold logo on top, lined in green velvet. The medal was presented to John Pickett who worked for the Canadian Olympic Association in the 1960's to 1980's. He was Assistant Chief of Mission for the 1976 Innsbruck and Montreal Olympic Games, and in this position received the cased and unawarded Innsbruck Bronze medal as a Present. Unc. (\$8,500)



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23. **Sarajevo 1984 Winter. Ice Hockey First Place Winner's Medal Awarded to a Member of the Soviet Team.** Goldplated silver, 65.1x71.1mm, struck by Majdanpek/Zin Mint. Laureated athlete's head r., "Ice Hockey" engraved below. Rev. Logo encircled by Croatian legend. With orange ribbon. The Soviet team won gold in Ice Hockey between 1964 and 1976, but in Lake Placid 1980 they were beaten by the American Team ("Miracle on Ice"). They won gold again in 1984, 1988 and 1992. With orange ribbon. EF. (\$20,000)

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24. **Seoul 1988. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Equestrian Team Three-Day Event, Housed in its Presentation Case.** Goldplated silver, 60mm, by Korea Security Printing and Minting Corporation. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Dove of Peace flying left carrying laurel branch, Seoul logo above. Event engraved on edge. Name of winner will be disclosed to buyer. With loop and ribbon, housed in presentation case. EF. **(\$30,000)**
25. **Seoul 1988. Gold First Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Equestrian Team Three-Day Event to an Equestrian from West Germany on September 22, 1988.** 30x34.5cm (11.8"x13.6"). Signed by IOC President Samaranch and Seoul IOC President Park Seh-Jik. Name of winner is on diploma, not shown now. Housed in stiff folder, lt. wear, diploma EF. **(\$500)**
26. **Seoul 1988. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Field Hockey.** Silver, 60mm, by Korea Security Printing and Minting Corporation. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Dove of Peace flying left carrying laurel branch, Seoul logo above. Edge engraved "HOCKEY MEN". Name of winner will be disclosed to buyer. With loop and ribbon. Toned EF. **(\$15,000)**

27. **Albertville 1992 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated sterling silver and Lalique crystal glass, 92mm, 9mm thick. The crystal shows large Olympic rings over Alpine mountains, set in a gold border which is engraved with logo and olive branch, Albertville 92 legend at bottom. No sport was engraved on the 1992 winners medals although an IOC direction asked for it. With silver ribbon, Olympic color stripes in center. *The medals were entirely handmade by Lalique in 35 different processes.* Housed in grey leatherette case lined in grey velvet, logo on top. Medal EF. A beautiful and rare medal. **(\$35,000)**

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28. **2000 IOC Presentation Sculpture.** Cast bronze, 30cm (11.8") high, on base 17x9.8cm (6.7"x3.9"), initialed NAG, cast by Fonderia Artistica Baroni, Italy. Doors with Olympic rings opening into New Century "2000" on bar above on which four athletes are upholding large Olympic rings. Presented by the IOC to a high U.S. Olympic sports official. Very impressive sculpture! EF. (\$1,500)
29. **Athens 2004. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Women's Soccer to a Member of the Brazillian Team.** Silver, 60mm, by Elena Votsi and Kostas Kazakos. Winged Nike over Panathinaikon Stadium, Acropolis in background. Rev. Athens 2004 logo and Olympic flame dividing 4-line Greek legend, sport in Greek language below. With multicolor ribbon. *For the first time since Amsterdam 1928, the design of the winner's medals was changed. From now on the medals will reflect the fact that Greece was the country where the Olympic Games originated and saw their revival.* Housed in presentation case and cardboard box. Medal toned EF. (\$10,000)

30. **Beijing 2008. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Men's Soccer to a Member of the Argentinian Soccer Team.** Gold plated silver, 70mm, with circle of inlaid white jade on reverse. Winged goddess of Victory above Panathenian Stadium in Athens. Rev. Logo in center surrounded by white jade, event engraved at top and bottom. Ornate loop, no ribbon. Housed in its red presentation case. EF. (\$30,000)

58. **Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Class B'.** Silver, 37mm, by Barre. Head r. of King George. Rev. Greek legend in open wreath (translated): "Olympia/in Athens/1870/Class B'", above "Consecrator of Games Evangelis Zappas". Since 1859 Greece tried to revive the ancient Olympic Games. A few sm. rim nicks, VF. (\$2,000)

THIRD NATIONAL GREEK OLYMPIC GAMES, ATHENS, 1875

59. **Copper Winner's Medal.** Copper, 41mm, by Barre. Head r. of King George. Rev. "Olympia in Athens 1875" surrounded by "Consecrator of Games Evangelis Zappas" (translated from Greek) and open olive wreath. Since 1859 Greece tried to revive the ancient Olympic Games. Toned Unc. (\$1,500)

ATHENS, 1st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1896
