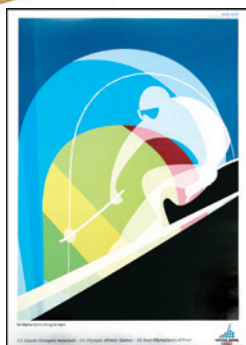

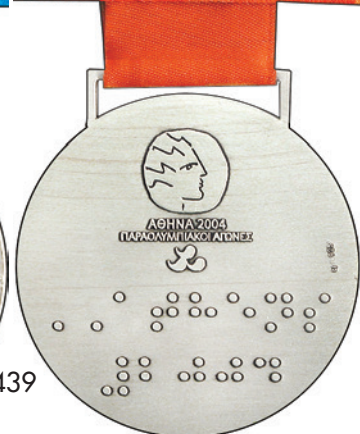

436. **Colorful Commemorative Blanket.** Acrylic, 127x152cm (50"x60"), made by Northwest Acrylic Company. Large logo in center, surrounded by pictogram border. EF. (\$100)
437. **Group of Ten Torch Relay Posters.** Multicolor, 46x61cm (18"x24") each, designed by McRay Magleby. Nine are unopened in original wrapping, one opened, horizontal creases. (10 pcs.) (\$180)
438. **Official Report.** Text in English. Two volumes, plus a CD containing official results and the official report in French language. Linen, silver embossed. New. (2 vols.) (\$200)

#### ATHENS, 28th OLYMPIC GAMES, 2004

439. **Paralympic Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 60mm. View of Acropolis in Athens. Rev. Paralympic logo above Braille legend. With multicolor ribbon. EF. (\$3,000)

440. **Official Torch.** Silver colored metal and olive wood, 68cm (26.8") long. The torch resembles an olive leaf, and the design wants to express "Pan Metron Ariston" (All things in moderation, translated from Greek). A simple and beautiful design. EF. (\$2,800)
441. **Attractive Athens 2004 Large Commemorative Beer Stein.** Handpainted multicolor ceramic, 47cm (18.5"), designed by Don Curran, handmade by Ceramarte. Illustrations from ancient Greek vases: the footrace, boxing, discus, javelin etc. adorn the stein, Olympic flaming torch and olive branch at right, waves with seagulls on pewter top (top detached). The stein is in the form of an ancient amphora. Numbered, with certificate of authenticity. In colorful box, by Anheuser-Busch. EF. Scarce. (\$300)
442. **Lighting of the Flame and Olympic Torch Relay Commemorative Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by the Hellenic Olympic Committee. Nike with torchbearer at altar, from a red pottery vase image by Nikias in 400 BC. Rev. Greek NOC logo. Unc, cased with brochure, numbered. (\$120)

#### TORINO, 20th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2006

443. **Official Torch.** Blue techno-polymer-coated aluminum, 77cm (30.3") long, made by Pininfarina. *The fire was lit in Olympia on November 27, 2005 and arrived in Rome on December 8. Until February 10 the torch traveled over 11,300 km across Italy, also France, Switzerland and Slovenia.* Used in the torch relay with light darkening around upper part (may be wiped off). EF. (\$2,000)
444. **Participation Certificate.** Multicolor, 22x30cm (8.7"x11.8"). In colorful portfolio. EF. (\$80)
445. **Alpine Skiing Poster.** Multicolor, 47.9x67.8cm (18.9"x26.7"), printed by Bolaffi. Downhill skier. EF. (\$100)

#### BEIJING, 29th OLYMPIC GAMES, 2008

446. **Official Torch.** Red and anodized aluminum, 72cm (18.4") long. Curved form in the shape of a paper scroll, with lucky clouds graphic expressing harmony. *The torch relay started in Olympia, Greece, on March 24, traveled to over 100 cities on five continents and all of China, a distance of 137,000km.* EF. (\$5,500)
447. **Participation Medal.** Copper, 55mm. Logo over Bird's Nest Olympic Stadium. Rev. Five Fuwa mascots over Chinese and English "One World One Dream" motto, waves below. Unc., in red presentation box. (\$260)
448. **Paralympic Participant's Certificate.** Yellow and orange, 20.4x28.3cm (8"x11.1"). Paralympic logo and legend in English and Chinese. EF. (\$80)
449. **Baseball Silver Second Place Winner's Diploma.** Silk, 45x35cm (17.7"x13.8"). Silver-colored silk surrounds legend in center. *The Cuban team won second place.* EF. (\$400)
450. **Fifth Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Men's Diving, 10m Springboard.** Green and ivory silk, 46x35.1cm (18.1"x13.8") in French, English and Chinese. EF. (\$200)

#### VANCOUVER, 21st OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2010

451. **Official Torch.** Stainless steel, aluminum and sheet molding compound, 94.5cm (37.1"), made by Bombardier. The lines of the torch reflect the lines made by snow and ice winter sports. It shows the engraved motto "With Glowing Hearts / Des plus brillants exploits" and the logo. *The torch relay ended after its 45000km journey through Canada with the lighting of the Olympic flame cauldron at the opening ceremony on February 12, 2010.* EF, in its protective bag. (\$2,200)

452. **Small-Size Olympic Torch Replica.** Base metal and white composite material, 31.8cm (12.5"), made by Birks. Logo in color on front, red Canadian maple leaf and logo on sides. With metal base for display. Housed in a Canadian Alderwood box complete with map and story of the Olympic torch relay, and certificate of authenticity. EF. (\$500)
453. **Participation Medal.** Silvered, 60mm. Graphics over logo and motto "With Glowing Hearts/Des Plus Brillants Exploits". Rev. Orca whale design and Olympic rings. EF, in presentation case and box. (\$400)

#### SOCHI, 22nd OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2014

454. **Official Paralympic Torch.** Aluminum and polymer, partially blue, 95cm (37.4") high, 14.5cm (5.7") wide, designed by Vladimir Pirozhkov and Andrei Vodyanik. The design of the torch reminds of the feather of the Firebird, a magical bird in Russian folklore. *The torch relay was held from February 26 to March 7, 2014 and passed through all eight Federal Districts of Russia.* EF. (\$3,000)
455. **Official Miniature Torch.** Red and silver, 37cm (14.6"). Housed in red case and illustrated sleeve. EF. (\$300)
456. **Participation Medal.** Steel, 50mm. Sochi logo and patchwork quilt design of the various cultures and ethnicities of the Russian Federations. Rev. Olympic rings and snowflake design. Similar to winner's medal. Housed in square cardboard box lined in blue velvet. "Hot-Cool-Yours." on side. Unc. (\$500)

458. **Participation Certificate.** Blue and white, 20.9x32.4cm (8.2"x12.8"). Facsimile signatures of Th. Bach and D. Chernyshenko. With envelope. EF. (\$150)
459. **Volunteer's Certificate.** Red and gold, 20.8x29.6cm (8.2"x11.7"). EF. (\$100)
460. **128th IOC Session in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, 2015. Olympic Council of Malaysia Pewter Presentation Plate for IOC Members.** 20.3cm (8"), made of Royal Selangor Pewter. 461. **Official Torch.** Recycled aluminum and resin, 69 cm (27") high. The colorful layers reflect the Ground (like the Copacabana Promenade), the Sea (blue ocean ripples), the Mountains (green natural beauty surrounding Rio), and the Sky at the top with the yellow sun (the flame). In original tube. Used in the torch relay, light discoloration inside the top, torch EF. A beautiful torch reflecting the beautiful location of Rio. (\$3,750)
462. **Gold First Place Medal Winner's Pin.** Goldplated, 13x15mm. Numbered, with Congratulations fold-out brochure by IOC President Thomas Bach. *The winner's pins were housed with the winners' medals in the award cases.* EF. (2 pcs.) (\$150)
463. **Bronze Winner's Diploma Awarded to Alexandr Zaichikov, Khazakshtan Third Place Weightlifting, Men's 105kg.** 42x29.5cm (16.5"x11.6"). Large bronze olive branches around logos, legend, and Bach and Nuzman facsimile signatures. In green envelope. EF. (\$400)
- PYEONGCHANG, 23rd OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2018**
464. **Official Torch.** White, 70cm (27.6") long, the length matching the altitude of 700 Meter of Pyeong Chang. The five parts at top simulating a flame, being also based on the Korean name of Pyeong Chang. This symbol is shown also over the lower part in gold. *The flame was lit in Olympia, Greece, on October 24, 2017. After an 8-day relay in Greece the torch relay in Korea started on November 9. It will end at the Opening Ceremony on February 9, 2018 with the lighting of the cauldron.* Used in the torch relay. In carrying case, EF. Torch lightly discolored at top, o.w. EF. (\$4,000)
465. **Participation Medal.** Cupro-nickel, 40mm, made by KOMSO. 2018 Games inscription. Rev. Olympic rings and snowflakes. Housed in orange case and sleeve with certificate of authenticity. **Very hard to find.** Unc. (\$2,000)
