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1. **Athens 1896. Bronze Second Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by J. Chaplain. Laureated head of Zeus facing right holding winged statue of Victory with laurel branch on globe. Rev. View of Acropolis and Parthenon between Olympic legend. *First place winners of the 43 events received a silver medal, second place winners a bronze medal. No gold medals were awarded in the first Olympic Games.* Toned EF, in original red velvet-lined presentation case. Very rare. **(\$40,000)**
2. **St. Louis 1904. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 40x40mm, made by Dieges & Clust, New York. Nude athlete striding r., laurel branch in hand. Rev. Legend in eleven lines, shields of St. Louis, France and U.S.A. between ivy leaves. "E.C. Brown" engraved on bottom edge. *Everett C. Brown (1863-1937) was a member of the American Olympic Committee, and he had been a member of the Chicago Olympic Planning Committee (the 1904 Games were first awarded to Chicago). He also was a timer in St. Louis. As a member of the Executive Committee of the AOC he was in charge of American teams for London 1908, Stockholm 1912, Antwerp 1920, and Paris 1924. He was also President of the National AA Union in 1910.* With loop and ring. Toned on reverse. EF. **(\$14,000)**

3. **St. Louis 1904. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded to Fred Prosch Jr. for Gymnastics Long Horse in the Olympic YMCA Championships on August 17, 1904.** Silver, 33mm, scalloped edge, by Dieges & Clust, New York. Logo in open laurel and oak wreath. Rev. "Championship/Long Horse/Fred Prosch Jr.". With red ribbon, suspended from bar "1904/Universal Exposition/Olympic Games/St. Louis". *According to IOC rules, all sport events held during the course of the World's Fair were to be called "Olympic Games".* Ribbon VF, medal and bar EF. **(\$5,000)**
4. **IOC Member's Badge, 1910.** Goldplated, multicolor enamel, 50mm, made by Vaughton, Birmingham. IOC motto "Citius Altius Fortius" over rings and open olive branches surrounded by "Comite International Olympique". The hallmarks date it to the year 1910. In that year the 11th IOC Session was held in Luxembourg, and this badge was possibly made for that session. Very rare. EF. **(\$1,000)**
5. **Stockholm 1912. Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 33mm, by Eric Lindberg/ Bertram MacKenna. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling (father of Swedish gymnastics) on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. EF. **(\$8,000)**
6. **Stockholm 1912. Silver Participation Medal for IOC Members.** Silver, 50mm, by Erik Lindberg/Bertram MacKenna. Zeus seated on Ionian column holding figure of Nike, Stockholm in back. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing left. *One of only 50 silver medals presented to IOC members and Swedish Olympic Committee members.* EF. Rare. **(\$2,600)**



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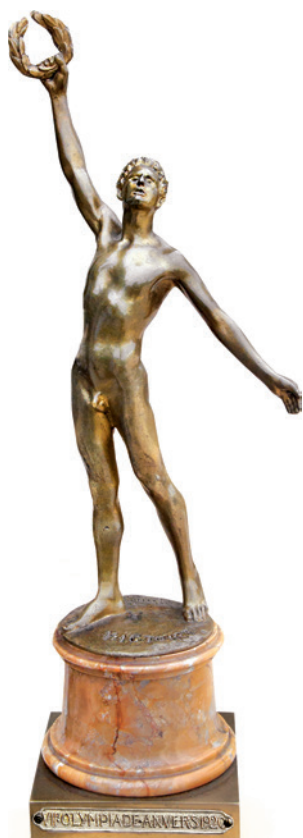
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7. **Stockholm 1912. First Depiction of Olympic Sports on an Art Nouveau Vase.** Colored and gilded etched bronze, 48cm (18.9") high, 24cm (9.5") wide. Three figures of Nike, goddess of Victory, holding a laurel wreath in each hand dividing three panels of sports illustrations. In the first panel a group of four runners is trying to catch Nike's winner's wreath. The second panel shows five young men playing soccer, a discus thrower and a javelin thrower in upper right in background. The third panel depicts four tennis players in a game of Doubles, three tennis players waiting their turn in background. There is a gold border of olive branches around the top, the bottom half is decorated with numerous green olive wreaths and gold flowers. The vase stands on four small balls. Signed on

bottom gold border "C.H. Norrström 1912". C.H. Norrström (1853-1923) studied at the Royal Academy in Stockholm, also at the Ecole des Arts Decoratifs in Paris from 1877 to 1880. On his return to Sweden he lived in Eskilstuna, later in Storängen. He was a sculptor, a painter and celebrated for his bronze etched artworks. He received a gold medal at the Paris 1900 World Exposition, and his works are displayed at the Stockholm National Museum. This is the first time Olympic events are depicted on a work of art: a beautiful museum piece. Small bumps, abt. EF. Unique. (\$12,000)

8. **Antwerp 1920. Gold First Place Winner's Medal.** Goldplated silver, 60mm, by Dupon. Nude victorious athlete with palm branch and laurel wreath, fame blowing horn. Rev. View of Antwerp. Rarely seen gold medal. EF. (\$9,500)

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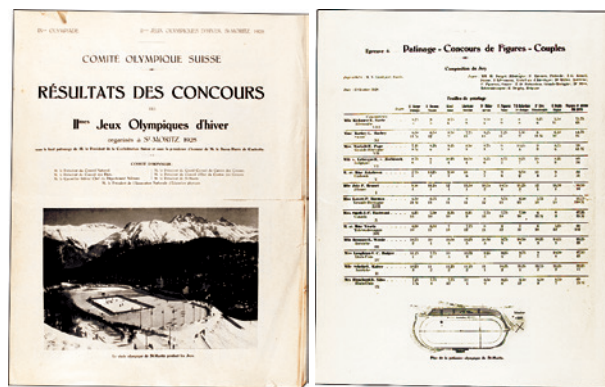
9. **Antwerp 1920. "Victory!" Trophy Awarded to Gold Medal Winners in Single Events.** Cast bronze, on marble base, 37cm (14.6"), by M. Grandmoulin. Victorious athlete, arm raised, holding laurel wreath, standing on base inscribed "Victoire!" and signed by the artist with date "1920". Mounted on round marble base and square bronze plaque below with "VII OLYMPIADE ANVERS 1920". *Only in Antwerp 1920 and Paris 1924 did the first place winner's receive a trophy in addition to their medals.* Extremely rare and attractive. (\$12,000)
10. **Chamonix 1924 Winter. Third Place Bronze Winner's Medal Housed in its Presentation Case.** 55mm, by Raoul Benard. Victorious athlete holding skis and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. An extremely rare winner's medal from the First Olympic Winter Games, and very rarely seen with its presentation case! Presentation case VF-EF, medal EF. (\$22,000)

11. **Paris 1924. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 55mm, by A. Rivaud. Winner helping fallen athlete back on his feet. Rev. Legend surrounded by sports equipment for summer and winter (ski) Games plus a harp for the Arts Competition. Choice EF. (\$7,000)
12. **Paris 1924. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by A. Rivaud. Winner helping fallen athlete back on his feet. Rev. Legend surrounded by sports equipment for summer and winter (ski) Games plus a harp for the Arts Competition. Toned EF. (\$6,000)
13. **Paris 1924. French Olympic Committee Badge.** Goldplated, white enamel, 34x42mm. Numbered on back, with disk. With French tricolor blue-white-red ribbon inscribed "Comité/Olympique/ Français". Elbel S-2. EF. (\$3,000)

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14. **St. Moritz 1928 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by Arnold Hünérwadel. Female skater with outstretched arms surrounded by ice crystals. Rev. Olympic rings above 5-line French legend, olive branches on sides. Only 25 bronze medals were awarded. Toned EF. (\$9,500)
15. **St. Moritz 1928 Winter. (Report) Swiss Olympic Committee. Results of the Competitions of the 22nd Olympic Winter Games Organized in St. Moritz. 1928.** 24pp. illustrated, 24.5x32cm (9.7"x12.6"), in French. Detailed results for each participant in each event in St. Moritz - here is the information missing in the official report. Included are sketches of the skating rink the course of 50km skiing event, the ski jump, the Skeleton Cresta Run, the bobsleigh run, and the military ski patrol. Furthermore, the hockey finals on closing day and the closing ceremony in the stadium, the participation and winner's medal etc. Tear in center fold, corner creases, browning. Fine to VF. Extremely rare. (\$9,500)
16. **Amsterdam 1928. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 55mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. *This design was selected in a competition by the IOC, and it stayed the winners medal design through Mexico City 1968.* Toned abt. EF. (\$7,500)
17. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 54mm, with scalloped edge, by Julio Kilenyi, struck by Robbins Co. Winged goddess of victory in clouds holding laurel wreath over Lake Placid site with venues. Rev. Olympic rings over Games legend, crossed laurel branches below. EF. Very rare. (\$22,000)

18. **Lake Placid 1932 Winter. Participation Medal.** Bronze, 48x60mm, by Julio Kilenyi. Winged figure of Fame blowing horn, Olympic rings above, winter landscape in background. Rev. Six winter sports depicted on shields around legend in six lines, scenes of curling and dogsledding below. EF. Very scarce. (\$8,000)

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19. **Garmisch-Partenkirchen 1936 Winter. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, "990" hallmark, 10cm (3.9"), 329 grams (about 11 oz), by Richard Klein, struck by Deschler, Munich. Victory holding laurel wreath riding in triga to left, bobsled, ski, hockey stick and skate below. Rev. Large Olympic rings surrounded by "IV Olympic Winter Games 1936" (translated from German). *Largest size Olympic winner's medal until Torino 2006, and one of only 37 medals.* Housed in green leatherette case with silver rings on detached top, VF. Medal EF. Rare. (\$26,000)

20. **Berlin 1936. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 55mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. EF. (\$7,500)
21. **Berlin 1936. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Toned EF. (\$6,500)
22. **Berlin 1936. Organizing Committee Departmental Director Carl Rost Badge.** Silvered, 41x43mm. With bar "Rost" and ribbon in Olympic colors. *Rost had responsibility in the Olympic Village.* S-52. Very rare. EF. (\$3,500)
23. **St. Moritz 1948 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by Huguenin. Hand holding torch in raised design, Olympic rings and snowflakes in background. Rev. 4-line French legend between ice crystals. Toned EF. (\$8,500)

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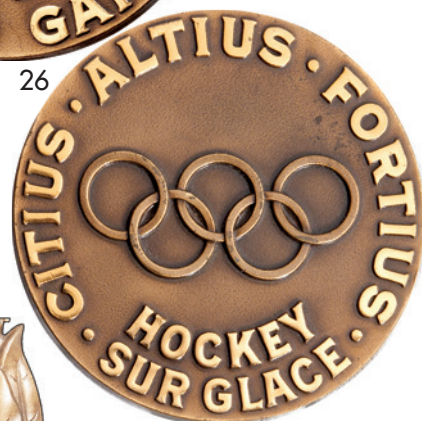
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24. **London 1948. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 50mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Housed in its blue leatherette case, VF. Medal EF. (\$7,000)
25. **London 1948. IOC Badge.** Gold colored, 32x48mm. With "IOC" bar and white (discolored) ribbon. Elbel S-1. VF-EF. (\$1,500)
26. **Squaw Valley 1960 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Awarded to a Member of the Soviet Ice Hockey Team.** Bronze, 55mm, made by the Herff Jones Co. Joint heads left of male and female athletes. Rev. Large Olympic rings encircled by legend, name of winning event, "Hockey Sur Glace" (Ice Hockey) below. *The Soviet team had won gold in Cortina 1956, the first time the Soviet Union participated in Winter Olympic Games. Between 1964 and 1992 the team placed first with winning gold, losing it only in Lake Placid 1980 to the "Miracle on Ice" American Team. The Squaw Valley 1960 medal is their only bronze medal.* EF. (\$12,000)

27. **Rome 1960. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Rowing.** Bronze, 68mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above Colosseum in Rome. Rev. Victorious athlete carried by jubilant teammates, "Canottaggio" (Rowing, translated) on wreath below. With chain of 15 bronze olive leaves. EF. (\$6,000)

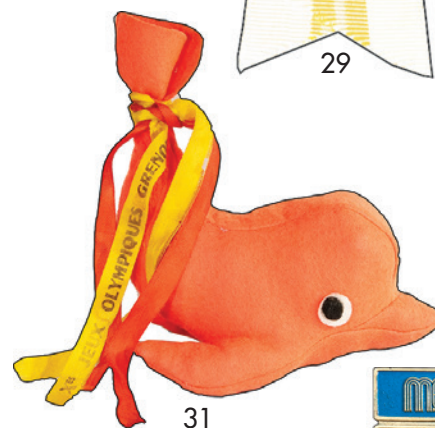
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28. **Innsbruck 1964 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Giant Slalom.** Bronze, 70mm, by M. Coufal. Alpine Mountain, event below. Rev. Large logo. With ribbon. *The famous skier won also gold in Slalom.* EF. (\$9,500)
29. **Tokyo 1964. Prime Minister's Badge.** Goldplated, 50x67mm, surrounded by Olympic colors. With blue enameled bar and white ribbon with two gold stripes. Elbel S-3. Extremely rare. EF. (\$50,000)
30. **Grenoble 1968 Winter. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Cross Country Skiing, Housed in Presentation Case.** Silver, 60mm, by Roger Excoffon. Logo within French legend. Rev. Depiction of a skier, "FOND" (Cross Country, translated) below. *Winners medals show, for the first time, the sport on the reverse.* With ribbon in Olympic colors. Housed in black leather case with gold logo on top, lined in blue velvet and silk. EF. (\$11,000)

31. **Grenoble 1968 Winter. Le Dauphin - The Dolphin. First Proposed Official Mascot of the 1968 Olympic Winter Games.** Red cloth, 13x14cm (5.1"x5.5"). Dolphin's head facing up, with felt eyes and red ribbon, and yellow ribbon inscribed "Xes Jeux Olympiques Grenoble 1968". The dolphin representing the former Dauphiné province with its capital Grenoble, was not selected. Shuss became the official mascot. Extremely rare. Color lightly faded, abt. EF. (\$350)
32. **Mexico City 1968. IOC Badge.** Goldplated, blue enamel, 37x63mm. With plastic ribbon in Olympic colors. Elbel S-1. EF. (\$1,500)

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33. **Sapporo 1972 Winter. Badge of the Emperor of Japan and the Imperial Family.** Silverplated, 37x69mm. Olympic colors on top, a snowflake from the coat of arms that belonged to an ancient Japanese family, and the Olympic rings and "Sapporo '72" below. A blank silver bar represents the badge for the Emperor and the Imperial Family with a white moiré ribbon. *The badge is shown in a magazine on the inside back cover together with all of the Sapporo badges. The magazine is included in this lot, as well as a photo of the then crown prince Hironomiya. The Imperial Family is very small in contrast to other countries' royal families. The badge is mentioned but not numbered by Elbel. Unc, in presentation case. Of utmost rarity. (\$95,000)*

34. **Seoul 1988. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Field Hockey.** Silver, 60mm, by Korea Security Printing and Minting Corporation. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Dove of Peace flying left carrying laurel branch, Seoul logo above. Edge engraved "HOCKEY MEN". Name of winner will be disclosed to buyer. With loop and ribbon. Toned EF. (\$8,000)

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35. **Albertville 1992 Winter. Official Torch.** Steel, 42cm (16.5"), up to 8cm (3.2") wide, designed by famous French designer Philippe Starck. The torch, when turned over, has the shape of a flame. The flame was lit in Olympia on November 27, 1991, when the relay through Greece started. It left Greece on December 8 on the Concorde to visit about 70 countries and islands worldwide, to arrive in Paris on December 14. 5,500 torchbearers carried the flame 5,536 km (3,440 miles) around France to Albertville where the cauldron was lit at the opening ceremony on February 8, 1992, by Michel Platini and Francoise-Cyrille Grange, a Savoyard girl. One of only 130 torches. Numbered. EF. Rare. **(\$65,000)**
36. **Lillehammer 1994 Winter. Official Torch.** Birchwood handle, 153cm (60") long, designed by A. Marandon and P.J. Kahrs. The upper part is cast aluminum with 5 wicks for lighting the torch with paraffin. This torch was used in the torch relay. One of only 300 torches, and the largest of all torches. Cleaned at top. VF-EF. **(\$32,500)**
37. **Sydney 2000. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Women's Volleyball.** Goldplated pure silver, 68mm, by Wojciech Pietranik. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Olympic rings over Sydney opera house and Sydney torch. Last time the obverse design since 1928 Amsterdam was on a winner medal. A new design was introduced in Athens 2004 featuring the Athens Panathinaikon stadium, not the Coliseum in Rome. With blue ribbon embroidered in silver "SYDNEY 2000". Housed in round silver colored box with blue translucent top. EF. **(\$20,000)**
38. **Salt Lake City 2002 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Biathlon.** Goldplated silver, 78mm, irregular shape, made by O. C. Tanner. Nike holding leaf, luge event in background. Rev. Athlete holding up torch walking out of flames, Olympic rings below. With purple-blue ribbon, in fitted large wooden case, gold Olympic rings affixed on top. EF. **(\$50,000)**

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39. **London 2012. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Artistic Gymnastics – Men's Floor, Housed in its Presentation Case.** Bronze, 85mm (3.4"), by Elena Votsi and Kostas Kazakos (obv.), and David Watkins (rev.) Winged Nike over Panathinaikon Stadium in Athens. Rev. Large London 2012 logo. Edge inscribed. With purple ribbon inscribed in white. Housed In its presentation case. **Buyer will receive name and event of winner.** EF. (\$20,000)

40. **Bronze Winner's Medal.** Copper, 41mm, by Barre. Bust r. of King George. Rev. "Olympia in Athens 1870" surrounded by "Consecrator of Games Evangelis Zappas" (translated from Greek) and open olive wreath. Toned Unc, in round presentation case. (\$1,400)



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41. **Third National Greek Olympic Games, Athens 1875 Bronze Winner's Medal.** Copper, 41mm, by Barre. Head r. of King George. Rev. "Olympia in Athens 1875" surrounded by "Consecrator of Games Evangelis Zappas" (translated from Greek) and open olive wreath. Toned Unc, in round presentation case. (\$1,400)

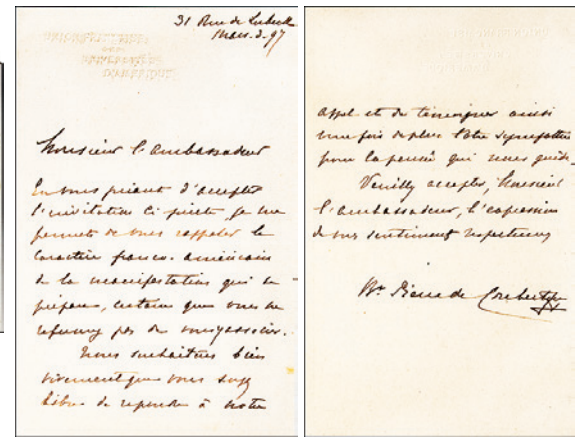
42. **Participation Medal in Presentation Case.** Bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath, phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Greek legend in laurel wreath. EF. (\$1,000)
43. **The Olympic Games Started in 776 BC, Restored in Athens 1896 Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 28mm, by Houtopoulos, struck by Pittner, Vienna who also made the participation medals. View of 1896 Olympic stadium. Rev. Laurel wreath over "776 x 1896". Looped. The medal was to be worn and is the first collector's pin. EF. (\$260)



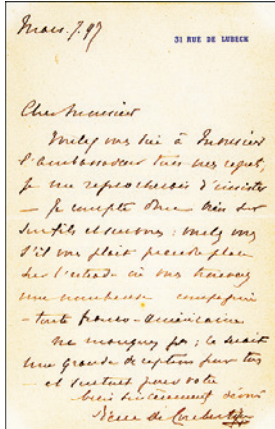
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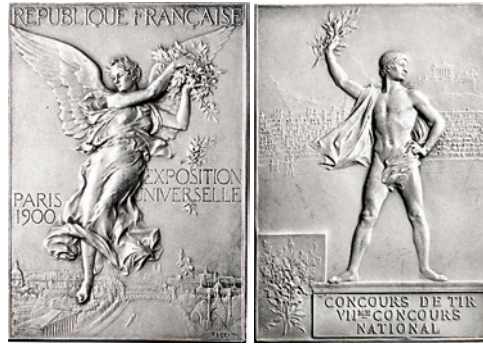
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44. **Restoration of the Ancient Olympic Games in Athens, 1896.** Silvered bronze, 31mm. Athena standing, holding wreath over phoenix rising from flames, owl of Athens at right, Acropolis in background. Rev. Dates of first Olympic Games in 776 BC and restoration in 1896, in open olive wreath. Looped, with ring. VF-EF. (\$200)

45. **Photo of the German Team on the Acropolis Taken by German Photographer Albert Meyer.** Sepia, 16.5x10.7cm (6.5"x4.2"). Group of 13 participants, and team leader Dr. Gebhardt in the center of the second row wearing a top hat. Faint view of columns behind. Photo has not been known previously. Handwritten caption in German on back. Top right corner missing, VF. (\$350)

46. **Handwritten Two-Page Letter by Pierre de Coubertin on March 3, 1897 to the American Ambassador in Paris.** 4pp., 11.3x17.8cm (4.5"x7"), with embossed letterhead of the "Union Française Des Universités Amériques". Coubertin enclosed an invitation (not included here) to a Franco-Américan Manifestation which Coubertin is preparing for the meeting, and he is hoping that the ambassador will agree with it. Signed with his full name "Pierre de Coubertin". The American Ambassador at the time was James B. Eustis. On March 19, 1897 a new ambassador was appointed, Horace Porter. Possibly J.B. Eustis received Coubertin's invitation at the time he heard about his replacement. See the letter in the following lot. Lt. browning, abt. EF. (\$650)

47. **Handwritten One-Page Letter by Pierre de Coubertin on March 7, 1897, on Letterhead with his address at 31, Rue de Lubeck in Paris.** 4 pages (letter only on first page), 11.4x17.7cm (4.5"x7"). The recipient is not known but Coubertin asks the recipient to convey to the American ambassador that he is sorry to insist on his attendance (at his manifest, see previous letter to the ambassador) Coubertin asks the letter's recipient (possibly the secretary of the ambassador) to attend instead and take a seat on the platform where he will find a large group of Franco-American attendees. The letter is hastily written as his writing shows in comparison to the previous letter to the American ambassador. Since J.B. Eustis just heard about his replacement as ambassador by H. Porter he was upset about Coubertin's insistence to attend his manifest meeting, something Coubertin had not known previously. Browning, VF-EF. (\$350)

PARIS, 2nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1900

The 1900 Paris Olympic Games were held in conjunction with the World's Exposition. They played only a minor role. There were athletes who didn't know that the events they participated in were Olympic Games events. Few items relate directly to the Games. For this reason we are also offering items commemorating the World Exposition.

48. **Silver Shooting Winner's Plaque.** Silvered bronze, 41x59mm, by F. Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed "CONCOURS DE TIR/VII CONCOURS/NATIONAL". Toned EF. (\$650)
49. **Pair of Paris 1900 Framed Award Medals.** Bronze, 61 mm, by Chaplain. Male with torch carried by flying female. And Head of French Republic to the right. EF. (\$150)

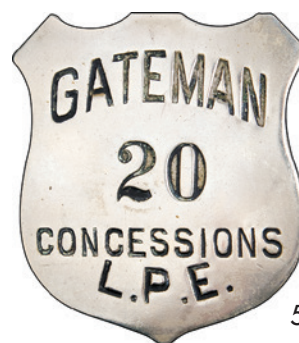
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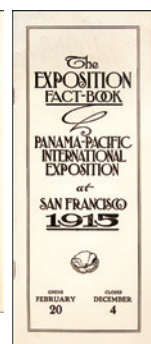
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ST. LOUIS, 3rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1904

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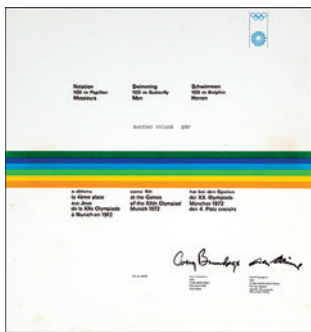
