## SALT LAKE CITY, 19th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2002

- 424. **Official Torch.** Silver colored metal and glass, 83.8cm (33") long. Shaped like a fiery icicle in motion, the polished silver colored bottom bears the motto "Light the fire within"; center metal and glass top section in "frozen flame" texture with logo on metal part. Used in the torch relay, glass blackened at top (may be wiped clean). EF. (\$2,800)
- 425. **Participation Medal Housed in its Wooden Case.** Bronze, 49x89mm, by O.T. Tanner. "Light the Fire Within" motto and Salt Lake City 2002 logo on Utah's famous arch, mountain view in back. Rev. Three athletes dashing out of mountain between legend and Olympic rings. In wooden case, EF. (\$400)
- 426. Uschi Diesel Training Suit, Gold Medal Winner in Biathlon Relay, and Silver in Biathlon Sprint, Won by Germany. With photo showing a beaming Diesel in Salt Lake City. Photo 8.9x13cm (3.5"x5.1"). Diesel won 2 gold, 4 silver and 3 bronze medals between 1992 and 2006. All EF. (3 pcs.) (\$600)

428. 14th Asian Games in Busan, Korea, 2002. Official Torch. Aluminum, 60cm (23.6"), made by EOS Design. The shape of the torch is designed after an earthen vessel of the Korean "Kaya" dynasty (AC 300). EF. (\$950)

- 429. Official Torch. Silver colored metal and olive wood, 68cm (26.8") long. The torch resembles an olive leaf, and the design wants to express "Pan Metron Ariston" (All things in moderation, translated from Greek). A simple and beautiful design. EF. (\$2,800)
- 430. Paralympic Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 60mm. View of Acropolis in Athens. Rev. Paralympic logo above Braille legend. With multicolor ribbon. EF. (\$2,600)
- 431. 116th IOC Session in Athens, 2004. Service Badge. Gilt, 32x50mm. With purple-black-purple ribbon. EF. (\$100)
- 432. Plush Teddy Bear by the Japanese Olympic Committee. 35cm (13.8"), a Hermann Original Teddy Bear. Ribbons in Olympic colors around neck, "70/2004" and Japanese NOC logo on soles. It's a growler! In original packaging. EF. (\$170)
- 433. Opening Ceremony Program, August 13, 2004. 87 (unnumbered) pages, illustrated in color, 21.1x33.7cm (8.3"x13.3"). EF. (\$90)

#### TORINO, 20th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2006

Official Torch. Blue techno-polymer-coated aluminum, 77cm (30.3") long, made by Pininfarina. The fire was lit in Olympia on November 27, 2005 and arrived in Rome on December 8. Until February 10 the torch traveled over 11,300 km across Italy, also France, Switzerland and Slovenia. Used in the torch relay, light darkening around upper part (may be wiped off). EF. (\$1,800)

- Official Paralympic Torch. Blue technopolymer coated aluminum, 435. 77cm (30.3") long, made by Pininfarina, with Paralympic logo. Housed in carrying case. Lt. wear at top, VF-EF. (\$2,800)
- 436. Pair of Mascots Neve and Glitz. Red/white and blue/light blue plush, each 15cm (5.9") tall. With their official cardboard packaging. EF. (\$100)
- 437. Participation Certificate for Viktoria Volchkova, a Russian Figure Skating Coach. Multicolor, 22x30cm (8.7"x11.8"). In colorful portfolio. EF. (\$100)
- Opening Ceremony Program, February 10, 2006. 62 unnumbered pages, illustrated in color and b&w, 27.7x27.4cm (10.9"x10.8"), in Italian, English and French. EF. (\$90)

- 443. Paralympic Participant's Certificate. Yellow and orange, 20.4x28.3cm (8"x11.1"). Paralympic logo and legend in English and Chinese. EF. (\$50)
- Singapore 2009 Asian Youth Games Torch. Light gray and red metal, 58.5cm (23"). Color logo and name of the Youth Games above group of red stars. Lt. wear in gray paint, o.w. EF. (\$1,100)

#### **VANCOUVER, 21st OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2010**

- 445. Official Torch. Stainless steel, aluminum and sheet molding compound, 94.5cm (37.1"), made by Bombardier. The lines of the torch reflect the lines made by snow and ice winter sports. It shows the engraved motto "With Glowing Hearts / Des plus brilliants exploits" and the logo. The torch relay ended after its 45000km journey through Canada with the lighting of the Olympic flame cauldron at the opening ceremony on February 12, 2010. EF, in its protective bag. (\$1,800)
- Paralympic Torch. Stainless steel, aluminum and sheet molding compound, 94.5cm (37.1"), made by Bombardier. The lines of the torch reflect the lines made by snow and ice winter sports. It shows on both sides the Paralympic logo and name. Used in the torch relay, darkened at top, o.w. EF. In its protective bag. Scarce. (\$2,600)
- Opening Ceremony Program, February 12, 2010. 44pp. illustrated in silver and b&w. 27.7x27.6cm (10.9"x10.9"), EF. (\$80)
- Closing Ceremony Program, February 28, 2010. 82pp. in color, in English and French, and 27.5x27.5cm (10.8"x10.8"). EF. (\$80)

449. 16th Asian Games in Guangzhou, China, 2010. Official Torch. Red "flame" and silver, 73.5cm (28.9"). 45 nations participated with 9,704 participants in 42 sports. Abt. EF. (\$1,200)

First Winter Youth Olympic Games, Innsbruck 2012. Official Torch. Multi-colored aluminum, 60cm (23.6"). Logo at top. Unused, with instruction booklet, housed in pictorial box. EF. (\$2,000)

## LONDON, 30th OLYMPIC GAMES, 2012

- **Official Torch.** Gold-colored aluminum alloy, 80cm (31.5"), designed by Edward Barber and Jay Osgerby, made by The Premier Group, Coventry. Triangular form made out of an inner and outer sheet with 8000 holes representing the 8000 torch bearers in Great Britain. EF. (\$5,000)
- 451a. London 2012 Torch Relay Lamp. Brass and glass, 23cm (9.1") high, made by Protective Lamp & Lighting Co. Ltd. The front has an oval plaque with the London 2012 logo, "Olympic Torch Relay" below. On the back is the maker's name. The lamps guarded the original flame from Olympia throughout the torch relay, especially at night, and were ready to relight the flame if it was needed during the day. EF. Very rare. (\$8,000)

- 456. U.S. Team Wool Sweater Worn in the Sochi Closing Ceremony by Silver Medalist Mark Grimmette, Silver Doubles Luge with Brian Martfin. Blue, red and white wool, large size, made by Polo-Ralph Lauren. EF. (\$150)
- 457. Participation Certificate. 20.9x29.6cm (8.2"x11.7"). Blue and white, with facsimile signatures of IOC President Bach, OC President Chernyshenko, and envelope. EF. (\$100)
- 458. Second Olympic Youth Games in Nanjing, 2014. Official Torch Known as "Gate of Happiness". 75cm (30"), made by Vatti Corp. The top part resembles a city gate, the stripe pattern on the handle resembles the waves of Changjiang River. EF. (\$1,800)
- 459. XVII Pan American Games in Toronto, Canada, 2015. Official Torch. 66cm (26"). 41 countries from North to South America completed with 6,132 athletes in 36 sports. Used in the torch relay, partial light discoloration around top, o.w. EF. (\$1,000)
- 460. Slogg Official Mascot of the Lillehammer 2016 Youth Olympic Games. Brown velvet with blue and green clothes, 30cm (11.8") tall. The clothes reflect the look of Games, and "Sjogg" means snow in the Lillehammer region. EF. (\$100)

# SOCHI, 22nd OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2014

454. **Official Torch.** Aluminum and polymer, partially red, 95cm (37.4") high, 14.5cm (5.7") wide, designed by Vladimir Pirozhkov and Andrei Vodyanik. The design of the torch reminds of the feather of the Firebird, a magical bird in Russian folklore. The fire was lit on September 29, 2013 in Olympia; the torch relay started in Russia on October 7, reached the North Pole on October 20, was flown into space by a Soyuz rocket, reached Europe's highest mountain (Mount Elbrus) and the world's deepest lake (Lake Baikal). It ended at the opening ceremony on February 7, 2014, in Sochi. EF. (\$2,600)

#### RIO de JANEIRO, 31st OLYMPIC GAMES, 2016

- 461. **Official Torch.** Recycled aluminum and resin, 69 cm (27") high. The colorful layers reflect the Ground (like the Copacabana Promenade), the Sea (blue ocean ripples), the Mountains (green natural beauty surrounding Rio), and the Sky at the top with the yellow sun (the flame). Used in the torch relay, light discoloration inside the top, torch EF. In original tube. A beautiful torch reflecting the beautiful location of Rio. (\$3,500)
- 462. 129th IOC Session in Rio de Janeiro, 2016. IOC Guest Badge. Silvered, 30x48mm. With white-blue-white ribbon. EF. (\$100)
