

- Albertville 1992 Winter. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Biathlon. Silver and Lalique crystal, 92mm, 9mm thick. The crystal shows large Olympic rings over Alpine mountains, set in a silver border which is engraved with logo and olive branch, Albertville 92 legend at bottom. No sport was engraved on the Albertville 1992 medals although an IOC direction asked for it. With silver ribbon, Olympic color stripes in center. The medals were entirely handmade by Lalique in 35 different processes. Buyer will receive the name of the winner. Housed in gray leatherette case lined in gray velvet, logo on top, a few spots on box. Medal Unc. A beautiful and very rare medal. (\$24,000)
- 40. Albertville 1992 V Paralympic Winter Games. Gold First Place Paralympic Winner's Medal Awarded for Cross Country (Nordic) Skiing. Goldplated, 63mm. Bird with broken wings and tail over Alpine mountains. Rev. Two Paralympic skiers between Braille legend and "Tignes-Albertville 1992/Ski de Fond". With blue ribbon and center gold stripe. EF. (\$5,000)
- 41. Lillehammer 1994 VI Paralympic Winter Games. Third Place Paralympic Winner's Medal Awarded for Skiing. Bronze outer ring, 68mm, with 31mm gold medal attached in center. Legend, center displaying logo. Rev. Braille legend, center shows Lillehammer Para Games logo. Bar showing 5 Para winter sports with tricolor ribbon. Housed in its wooden box. EF. (\$4,500)



- 42. Atlanta 1996. Paralympic Gold First Place Winner's Medal Housed in its Presentation Box. Goldplated, 82mm (3.2"). Paralympic Atlanta 1996 logo and legend. Rev. Braille legend over Paralympic logo. Looped, with blue ribbon. In green cardboard presentation box lined with green velvet. EF. (\$3,500)
- 43. Atlanta 1996. Paralympic Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 82mm (3.2"). Paralympic Atlanta 1996 logo and legend. Rev. Braille legend over Paralympic logo. Looped, with purple ribbon, housed in its presentation box. EF. (\$3,000)
- 45. Salt Lake City 2002 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Luge, Women's Singles, Housed in its Wooden Case. Bronze, 78mm irregular shape, made by O. C. Tanner. Athlete holding up torch walking out of flames, Olympic rings below. Rev. Nike holding leaf, luge event in background. With purple-blue ribbon, in fitted large wooden case, bronze Olympic rings affixed on top. In leather pouch with stamped 2002 logo. EF. Beautiful design. (\$35,000)
- 46. Salt Lake City 2002 Winter. "Passion for the Gold" Salt Lake City 2002 Official Olympic Sculpture by Jonathan Bronson.

 Bronze, goldplated bronze and white marble, 23x26.5cm (9.1"x10.4"), 26.4cm (10.4") high. A downhill skier attached to large gold SLC logo affixed on marble base between gold Olympic rings. Silver plaque on front of marble "Passion for the Gold" by Jonathan Bronson, #44 of 350", Salt Lake 2002 logo at left.

- 47. **Rio 2016. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 8.5cm (3.3"), weight about 500 grams (about 16 ounces), obverse by Elena Votsi and Kostas Kazakos. Winged Nike, Goddess of Victory, over the Panathinaiko Stadium in Athens, the Acropolis in background. Rev. The Rio 2016 Olympic logo. With green and multicolor ribbon. Unawarded. EF. **(\$22,000)**
- 48. **Tokyo 2020/2021. Official Torch.** Cherry blossom pink colored aluminum, 71cm (28") long, designed by Tokujin Yoshioka Inc. The design on the top is in the form of a 5-petal cherry blossom that each holds a flame that comes together as one flame in the center. It has been made from a single sheet of aluminum, 30% of it made from recycled aluminum from temporary prefabricated housing construction after the 2011 earthquake, as a symbol of peace. The torch relay had originally been planned to last over 121 days but worldwide Covid-19 ended these plans. A beautiful torch, rarely seen, whose color might change over time from cherry blossom pink to gold. Housed in its pink container. EF. Unc. (\$12,000)


- 49. **Tokyo 2020/2021. Paralympic Torch.** Cherry blossom pink colored aluminum, 71cm (28") long, designed by Tokujin Yoshioka Inc. The design on the top is in the form of a 5-petal cherry blossom that each holds a flame that comes together as one flame in the center. It has been made from a single sheet of aluminum, 30% of it made from recycled aluminum from temporary prefabricated housing construction after the 2011 earthquake, as a symbol of peace. A beautiful torch, rarely seen, whose color might change over time from cherry blossom pink to gold. Used, darkened inside top. EF. (\$9.500)
- 50. **Beijing 2022 Winter. Official Torch.** Red and silver (fire and ice), 82cm (32.3"), designed by a Lenovo Team. The torch is named "Flying", and the spiral design makes it look like a ribbon fluttering in the wind. The red and silver colors stand for fire and ice, and the red line represents the Great Wall and the skiing courses. The torch is fueled by emission-free hydrogen. Because of the Corona virus the relay was held only for 3 days with about 1,200 torch runners, in and around Beijing and in Zhangjiakou, Hebei Province. A beautiful torch. Unused, housed in its container, Unc. (\$12,000)

51. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Class B'. Silver, 37mm, by Barre. Head r. of King George. Rev. Greek legend in open wreath (translated): "Olympia/in Athens/1870/Class B'", above "Consecrator of Games Evangelis Zappas". Since 1859 Greece tried to revive the ancient Olympic Games. Rare in silver. A few small rim nicks, small scs. on reverse, VF. (\$2,400)

THIRD NATIONAL GREEK OLYMPIC GAMES, ATHENS 1875

52. **Bronze Winner's Medal.** Copper, 41mm, by Barre. Head r. of King George. Rev. "Olympia in Athens 1875" surrounded by "Consecrator of Games Evangelis Zappas" (translated from Greek) and open olive wreath. Toned Unc, in round presentation case. (\$1,300)

- 53. **Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated copper, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath, phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Greek legend in laurel wreath. Toned VF-EF. (\$1,100)
- 54. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath, phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Greek legend in laurel wreath. Toned EF. **(\$900)**
