

- 82. **Judge's Badge.** Silvered bronze, 57mm, by Vaughton. Helmeted head of Athena left facing laurel sprig, surrounded by blue enameled band with legend. Elbel S-11. EF. **(\$1,500)**
- 83. **Participant's Badge.** Silvered, blue enamel, 30mm. Helmeted head left. Numbered on back. Elbel S-9. Toned EF. **(\$500)**
- 84. **Foil Fencing Display International Representative. Silver Presentation Medal** housed in its blue leather case with gold legend on top. Silver, 50mm, by B. McKennal. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Housed in dark blue case with gold legend, lightly scuffed. Medal toned EF. **(\$1,400)**


- 85. **Gold Donor's Medal Housed in its Red Leather Presentation Case.** Goldplated bronze, 51mm, by Bertram MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Housed in red leather case with gold legend on top, abt. EF. Medal VF-EF. **(\$1,200)**
- 86. **Cased Steward's Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 50mm, by B. McKennal. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Housed in dark blue case with gold inscription on top, EF. Medal toned EF. **(\$1,200)**
- 87. **Cased Judge's Silver Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 50mm, by B. McKennal. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Housed in dark blue case with gold legend, spotty, medal toned EF. **(\$1,200)**
- 88. **Cased Starter's Presentation Medal.** Bronze participation medal, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Housed in dark green leatherette case with gold inscription on top, EF. Medal toned EF. **(\$1,200)**
- 89. **Participation Medal Housed in its Presentation Box.** White metal, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Housed in a red cardboard box inscribed on top "Olympic Games/London, 1908". Box made by Vaughton & Sons, Birmingham. Box lt. scuffing, medal EF. **(\$700)**





90. **“Olympic Games London 1908” Large Uniform Patch.** Linen, 12.3x13.7cm (4.8”x5.4”), multicolor embroidery. Crossed flags dividing legend “Olympic Games – London 1908”. Rare. VF-EF. (\$500)
91. **Competitor’s Card of a Gold Medal Winner in Gymnastics.** Cardboard, 11.5x20.5cm (4.5”x8.1”), in English, French and German. *Sven Landberg from Sweden was part of the gold medal winning team in Combined Exercises.* Embossed seal of the British Olympic Council on top, design of the 1908 badges. With stamp of British Olympic and signature of Robert S. de Courcy-Laffan, BOC Secretary and IOC member. Center crease, VF-EF. (\$500)
92. **Programme and General Regulations, in English.** 23 pages, 16.2x24cm (6.4”x9.5”). 4 pages of Regulations, and 17 pages of 23 events including skating. Partially foxing, corner creases or chips, Fine to VF. (\$200)

93. **STOCKHOLM, 5th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1912**
Pierre de Coubertin Introduces Modern Pentathlon to the Olympic Games in Stockholm 1912. Silvered bronze plaque, 8.5x5x10.4cm (3.4”x4.1”), by E. Lindberg. Zeus seated on throne being presented the modern Olympic Pentathlon winner by ancient Greek female holding olive wreath above the winner’s head. Rev. 13-line inscription in French between 5 olive wreaths symbolizing the 5 Olympic rings, and two mermaids holding each other symbolizing the Meeting of the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans on completion of the Panama Canal. “Presented by the Panama-Pacific Exposition San Francisco 1915 to Pierre de Coubertin, Renovator of the Olympic Games, on the Occasion of the creation of Pentathlon Modernue (in) Stockholm 1912, will be presented at each Olympiad to the Winner who will guard it till the following Olympiad”. After 100+ years the IOC is presently considering replacing this event. Extremely rare. **One of only 5 plaques.** EF. (\$5,000)
94. **Bronze Third Place Winner’s Medal.** Bronze, 33mm, by Erik Lindberg and Bertram MacKenna, struck by Sporrang & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. Toned EF. (\$5,000)
95. **Pewter Winner’s Medal for Visitors.** Silvered pewter, 33mm, by Erik Lindbergh and Bertram MacKenna, struck by Sporrang & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. *A small number of winners medals was struck in pewter and was sold to visitors as souvenirs.* VF-EF. (\$700)
96. **Participation Medal Struck in Bronze and Housed in its Presentation Case.** Bronze, 51mm, by Lindberg/MacKenna. Zeus seated on Ionian column holding figure of Victory, Stockholm in background. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing l. *Only 100 medals were struck in bronze for presentation to the Presidents of the Special Commissions and the Chairmen of the International Juries. Athletes received a pewter medal.* Housed in its green presentation case with gold logo. Toned EF. (\$1,500)



97. **Participation Medal Struck in Bronze.** Bronze, 51mm, by Lindberg/MacKennial. Zeus seated on Ionian column holding figure of Victory, Stockholm in background. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing l. *Only 100 medals were struck in bronze for presentation to the Presidents of the Special Commissions and the Chairmen of the International Juries. Athletes received a pewter medal.* Toned EF. **(\$1,200)**

98. **Participation Medal.** White metal, 51mm, by Lindberg/MacKennial. Zeus seated on Ionian column holding figure of Nike, Stockholm in back. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing left. Housed in its green cardboard presentation case, inside lined in velvet and silk, VF. Medal Unc. **(\$350)**

99. **Large Olympic Savings Bank by the Swedish Olympic Committee.** Silverplated brass, 12cm (4.7") wide, 66.8cm (26.3") high. The bottom part is a savings bank decorated with attached discus thrower, rower, runners and soccer players, garland below. Slot above for collecting money. With high flagpole for the Swedish flag. EF. **(\$280)**


100. **Large Framed Stockholm Olympic Stadium Plaque.** Cast bronze, 30x22cm (11.8"x8.7") with wooden frame, designed by H. Tengborn. badge and flags above Stockholm Olympic stadium, wisteria flowers on either side, Olympic legend below. *Very attractive Art Nouveau plaque.* Advertised for in the Olympic 1912 Guide. EF. **(\$350)**

101. **Stockholm Olympic Stadium Porcelain Plate.** Blue and white, 23.3cm (9.2"), made by Roerstrand. Aerial view of the stadium decorated with flags, surrounded by laurel wreath, Olympic legend on scroll at bottom. Tiny edge chip, o.w. EF. **(\$100)**

102. **Modern Pentathlon Merit Diploma for J.S.M. Stranne, Team Sabre, Sweden.** Color lithography with gold and blue decor, 36.9x53.4 (14.5"x21"), designed by Olle Hjertzberg, Professor at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts and designer of the official poster. Printed by Centraltryckeriet, Stockholm. Crowned female holding staff and statue of Victory, Stockholm Olympic stadium in background, panel with 7-line Swedish award legend below. Surrounded by flower and laurel leaf border. Modern Pentathlon was created and introduced in Stockholm by Pierre de Coubertin (see lot 93). **(\$700)**



Crowned female holding staff and statue of Victory, Stockholm Olympic stadium in background, panel with 7-line Swedish award legend below, surrounded by flower and laurel leaf border. *Other recipients of a merit diploma were Jim Thorpe, USA, for Running, High Jump; Avery Brundage, USA, for Pentathlon.* Posted on white board, browning, lower left corner bent, tears. 



- 104. **Pair of Fifth Olympiad 1912 Rules and Regulations Booklets for Athletics.** Blue and red linen covers, gilt legend, 43cm and 46 pages, 7.5x11.5cm (3"x4.5"), in Swedish and German. Detailed instructions. Marbled boards inside. Both EF and very scarce. (2 pcs.) (\$150)
- 105. **Official Postcard #86 of the Interior of the Stadium, with 7/7/12 LBR Stadium Cancel.** 14x9cm (5.5"x3.5"). 100m and 800m Finals were held on July 7. EF. (\$600)
- 106. **Pre-Games Publicity Cancel on Envelope, and Olympic Committee Red Wax Seal.** Envelope 15.2x9cm (6"x3.5") cancelled on May 30, 1912 in Allerum with "Jeux Olympiques/Stockholm 1912/Le 29 Juin - 22 Juillet", mailed to Rochester, NY. EF. Plus 44mm red wax seal with "Organisation Kommittet for Stockholm 1912". Abt. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$500)

- 107. **(German Report) Diem, Carl. The Olympic Games 1912.** Berlin 1912. 204pp., 44 plates, many illustrations, 14.4x22cm (5.7"x8.7"), in German. Preparations; the German team; report for each event and results; and history of IOC and German Olympic Committee. Stiff covers, abt. VF, contents EF. (\$150)

- 108. **Winner's Medal in German Olympic Trials for Berlin 1916.** Bronze, 50mm. Bust r. of Wilhelm II. Rev. Legend "To the Winner in the Olympic Trials", translated. *Collectors add this medal to their medal collection as no participation medals exist for 1916.* Rainbow toning, EF. (\$140)

- 109. **Set of 10 Vignettes for the Berlin 1916 Olympic Games.** Each green and gold on black background, 43x63mm each. Illustrations of 10 different Olympic sports, "Olympic Games Berlin 1916" legend designed by Franz von Stuck. *Modern athletes are shown for the first time.* Almost all gummed. EF. (10 pcs.) (\$300)

- 110. **Honorary Award Cup Presented to Crown Prince Gustaf Adolf of Sweden in the 1917 Nordic Games.** Unmarked silver (?), inside goldplated, 30cm (11.8") high. Crowned monogram of the Prince between palm branches and many small crowns, inscribed below "H.K.H. Kronprinsens Hederpris" vid Nordiska Spelen 1917" in 5 lines. The top is in form of a crown with olive branches. *The Nordic Winter Games were held by Sweden, Norway and Denmark from 1901 to 1926 when they were interpreted into the Olympic Winter Games. They were organized by the Swedish Central Association for the Promotion of Athletics presided by Victor Balck, and they also included cultural events. Housed in its case by Royal Court Jeweller K. Anderson. Beautiful cup.* EF. (\$2,600)
