



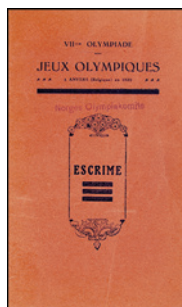

111. **Group of 9 Postcards of Far East Championship Games.** About 14.2x9.1cm (5.6"x3.6") each. Third Far East Championship Games in Tokyo 1917: 2 postcards; one stamped and written; 2 postcards and a 5 color postcard set in envelope from the 6th Far-East Championship Games in Osaka 1923; plus one postcard from the cancelled 11th Far Eastern Games in Osaka 1938, VF-EF to EF. (9 pcs.) (\$240)

ANTWERP, 7th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1920

112. **Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 60mm, by Josue Dupon. Nude victorious athlete with palm branch and laurel wreath, fame blowing horn. Rev. Brabo Fountain, view of port of Antwerp and Cathedral in background. Toned EF. (\$5,500)
113. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by P. Theunis. Nike standing before tripod crowning victorious athletes. Rev. Flying Victory crowning charioteer in biga. EF. (\$450)
114. **Group of 12 Diapositive Photographic Glass Plates of the Antwerp 1920 Olympic Games.** Each plate 10.6x4.4cm (4.2"x1.7") with description between two of the same images. Entrance to the stadium (2), Opening Ceremony (4), Diving (2), Equestrian (2), and one each of Relay, Pole Vault Winner, and Swimming. Glass plate of Olympic Monument in Antwerp partially broken off on right side. Housed in 2 original cardboard boxes. Eleven glass plates EF. (12 pcs.) (\$120)

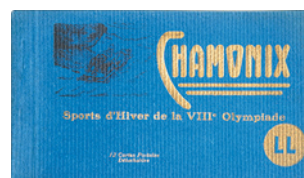
115. **Fencing Program, Rules and Regulations and Members of Committees.** Red-brown covers, 28pp. 4 plates, 12.2x20.3cm (4.8"x8"), in French. Lt. vertical crease. Abt. EF. (\$140)
116. **Large 1920 American Olympic Trap-Shooting Team Label.** Red, white and blue, 15.5x22cm (6.1"x8.7"). Chipped, Fine. (\$60)
117. **(Spalding's Report) VIIth Olympic Games Antwerp 1920.** New York, 1921. 219pp., about 100 photographic plates, mostly of Olympic events in Antwerp, 12.8x17.2cm (5"x6.8"). Complete records of Antwerp Olympic events, plus program for Paris 1924, IAAF Olympic athletic rules, Minutes of Lausanne 1921 Olympic Congress, Constitution of American Olympic Association, Olympic and World's Records, etc. Color covers VF, opening ceremony on back cover, contents EF. (\$300)
118. **Report of the American Olympic Committee. Seventh Olympic Games, Antwerp, Belgium, 1920.** 451pp., illustrated, 15.2x23cm (6"x9.1"). Olympic Trials, reports for each event of the American team, summary of all events, teams and winners. *Very rare report as no official report was published for the public by the Organizing Committee.* Paper covers with photographic prints. EF. (\$200)
119. **Winner's Badge of the Second Latvian Olympic Games in Riga, 1921.** Silvered, 30mm, by F. Mueller, Riga. Victorious athlete with olive wreath, city of Riga in back, 4-line legend and city coat of arms below. EF. (\$100)

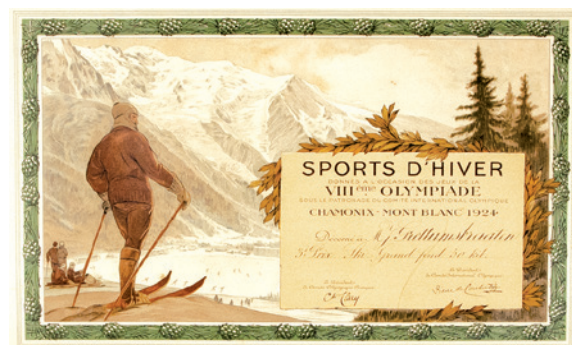

123. **Bronze Third Place Winner's Diploma Awarded to Johan Grøttumsbråten, Norway, for Nordic Skiing 50 Kilometers.** Brown and green design, 74x54cm (29.1"x21.3"), designed by Plumereau, printed by Imprimerie Debar, Reims-Paris. Skier overlooking skating rink in Chamonix, Alps in background, panel with award legend at right: "Awarded to M.J. Grøttumsbråten/3rd Prize Ski Grand Fond 50km" (translated from French). Signed by French Olympic Committee President Clary and IOC President Pierre de Coubertin. Green border of pine cones. *M.J. Grøttumsbråten was one of the most successful Olympic skiers. He also won 3rd place in Nordic Combined, and 2nd place in 15 Kilometers (Classical). Furthermore, he won gold in St. Moritz 1928 and Lake Placid 1932 in Nordic Combined, and gold in 1928 in Cross-Country 18km.* The design is set in the center of a large stiff paper; very often the large surrounding area was cut off leaving only the center design. This diploma is one of the rare original size diplomas. Lt. browning, tears around the borders, upper corners creased, traces of mounting on three sides on the back. The actual diploma design is in excellent condition. A rare diploma of a Norwegian Olympic Great. (\$7,500)

121. **50th Anniversary Medal of the First Winter Olympic Games, 1974.** Bronze, 67mm. Chamonix within high relief Alps with Mont Blanc. Rev. Skiing trails on wooded mountainside. Housed in its original box. Unc. (\$100)
122. **Chamonix – Sports d' Hiver de la VIIIe Olympiade. Postcard Booklet of Winter Sports of the VIIIth Olympiad.** 12 detachable French legend postcards, 15.2x8.7cm (6"x3.4"), of Chamonix winter sports and Alpine scenery. EF. (\$260)

PARIS, 8th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1924

124. **30th Anniversary Medal of the Founding of the Modern Olympic Games in Paris, 1924.** Bronze, 50mm. Oak and laurel branches with ribbon "23 Juin 1924". Rev. "The assembled nations celebrate the thirtieth anniversary of the Renewed Olympism" (translated from French), laurel and oak branch at side. Housed in its presentation case, lt. scuffing. Medal toned EF. (\$1,200)
125. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by R. Bénard. City view over French legend in three lines. Rev. Victory with laurel wreaths crowning victorious athletes. Toned EF. (\$300)
126. **Participant's Badge.** Bronze and red enamel, 34x42mm, numbered on back, with screw back and disk. Toned EF. (\$260)

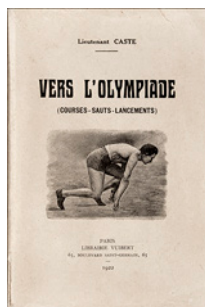

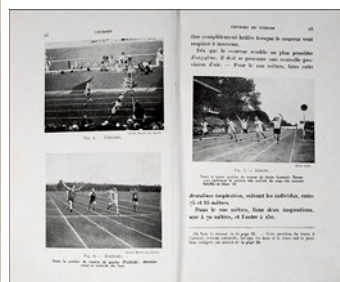

127. **Broad Jump and Running Pair of Medals Entered Successfully in the Olympic Art Exposition in Paris.** Bronze, 50mm each, by Mascaux. Grasshopper and Running Hare. Rev. Roses around edge. *Mascaux entered his sport medal series in the Olympic Art Exposition, and he won a Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.* Official report p. 612 with illustrations of the medals. Both EF. (2 pcs.) (\$150)
128. **Statue of a Rugby Player Made by Fernand Coffin for the Paris 1924 Olympic Games.** Multicolor painted plaster, 27cm (10.6") high, on 9.5x9.5cm (3.7"x3.7") base with 4.5cm brass plaque "VIIIme Olympiade Paris 1924/LE RUGBY par Coffin". Coffin's name is also engraved on the base. *Part of a series of sculptures of sport figures by Coffin for the Paris Olympic Games.* Scarce. VF-EF. (\$750)
129. **Statue of a Runner Made by Fernand Coffin for the Paris 1924 Olympic Games.** Multicolor painted plaster, 27cm (10.6") high, on 9.5x9.5cm (3.7"x3.7") base, name of Coffin engraved, with 4.5cm brass plaque inscribed "VIIIme Olympiade Paris 1924/La Course à Pied/par Coffin". Runner resolved to win! *Part of a series of sculptures of sports figures by Coffin for the Paris Olympic Games.* Scarce. Abt. EF. (\$750)

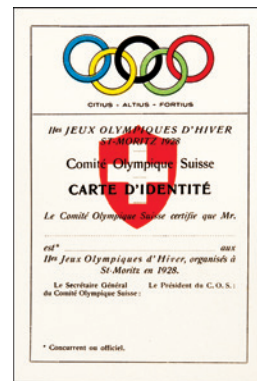
130. **Commemorative Olympic Games 1924 Box.** Brass, 6.2cm, 3.4cm high, inside gilt. Tennis rackets, boxing gloves, weights and various sticks are embossed on top with Paris Olympic Games legend and date. Toned EF. (\$140)
131. **Equestrian Events Official Program, July 27, 1924.** 8pp., 22x27cm (6.7"x10.6"), in French. Equestrian program from July 21 through 27, 1924, all participating nations by event with name of each participant, list of 47 participants on July 27, and complete winner's list of all Paris 1924 events by country (first 6 places). Lt. crease, red pencil notes on cover, abt. EF. (\$220)
132. **Rowing Official Program July 14, 1924.** 8pp., 22x27cm (8.5"x10.8"), in French. Includes program for July 14 and 15, list of winners in all of Paris Olympic events through July 13 (Rugby, Football, Shooting, Polo and Winter Games), and list of all rowing participants. Includes also Antwerp 1920 rowing winners including Jack Kelly. Red pencil notes on cover, abt. EF. (\$220)
133. **(Athletic Book) Lieutenant Caste. Vers L'Olympiade. Towards the Olympic Games (Running-Jumping-Throwing).** Paris, 1922. 200pp. illus., 12x18.6x1.2cm (4.8"x7.3"x.5"). Guide for French athletes to prepare for the 1924 track and field events. Explanation of events, previous Olympic results, and guide for practicing correctly. Stiff paper cover scuffed, tears, contents EF. (\$90)
134. **(Book) Tegner, Torsten. Paris Antwerpen Chamonix-Olympiska Glimtars.** Stockholm, 1924. 127 pages illustrated, 16x23.7cm (6.3"x9.3"), in Swedish. Olympic notes about the 3 Olympic Games visited with his travels. Softbound, lt. foxing, contents EF. (\$80)
135. **8th IOC Congress in Prague, 1925. Official Medal.** Bronze, 45mm. View of Charles Bridge and Hradscin Castle. Rev. Oak branch with rings and scroll with Olympic motto. EF. (\$150)
136. **8th IOC Congress in Prague, 1925. Complete Set of Five 50 Haleru Postcards.** 14x9cm (5.5"x3.5"). Congress legend printed in Olympic colors: blue, black, red, yellow and green, each card a different Olympic color. EF. (5 pcs.) (\$100)

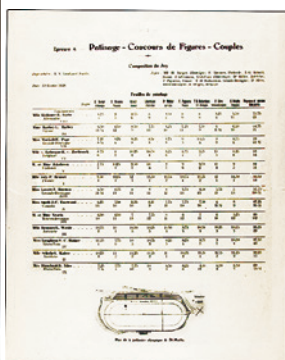

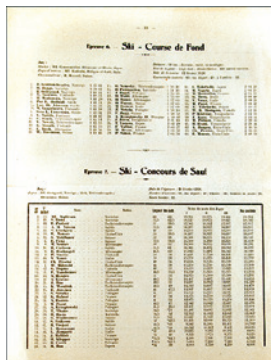

ST. MORITZ, 2nd OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1928

137. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 35mm, by M. Martin. Victory with laurel branch in horse-drawn sled to left, Olympic rings in exergue. Rev. French legend in six lines over laurel branch. EF. (\$600)
138. **Official Poster.** Lithography in 4 colors, 64x102cm (25.2"x40.2"), designed by Hugo Laubi. Swiss and Olympic flags over Alpine mountains, 3-line legend below. Olympism Through Posters pp. 36 and 37. Covered in plastic for protection. EF. (\$800)
139. **Identity Card.** 8.5x12.6cm (3.4"x5"). Unissued. EF. (\$100)
140. **Winner's Diploma.** Brown and gold, 40x34.5cm (15.8"x13.6"). Laurel branch over legend, Olympic rings below. Signed in ink by Swiss NOC President W. Hirschy. Unissued. EF. (\$500)
141. **(Brochure) Swiss Olympic Committee. Results of the Competitions of the 22nd Olympic Winter Games Organized in St. Moritz. 1928.** 24pp. illustrated, 24.5x32cm (9.7"x12.6"), in French. Detailed results for each participant in each event in St. Moritz. Included are sketches of the skating rink, the course of 50km skiing event, the ski jump, the Skeleton Cresta Run, the bobsleigh run, and the military ski patrol. Furthermore, the hockey finals on closing day and the closing ceremony in the stadium, the participation and winner's medal etc. Tear on right side of centerfold, corner creases, lt. browning. Abt. VF. Extremely rare. (\$4,500)

AMSTERDAM, 9th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1928

142. **Gold Participation Medal.** Goldplated, 55mm, by J.C. Wienecke. Nude male and female athlete on podium holding torch over Olympic flame. Rev. Nike over Marathon Tower, shield of Amsterdam between two hemispheres. Very rare. Abt. EF/VF+. (\$2,600)
143. **Judge's Badge with Green Rosette.** Silvered, partially enamelled, 31x37mm. With faded green rosette. Elbel S-8. Badge EF. Rare. (\$1,200)
144. **Official's Badge.** Silvered, 31x37mm, partially enamelled in color. Elbel S-8. Lightly toned EF. (\$220)
145. **Participant's Badge.** Bronze, 31x37mm, partially enamelled in color. Ex: Ingrid O'Neil Auction 1, lot 176 (1990)! Toned EF (\$200)
146. **Olympic Stadium Armband No. 147.** Orange linen with black design, 29x11.2cm (11.3"x4.4"), Olympic Stadium tower with ribbon inscribed "Stadion", and "147" below. A few spots, VF-EF. Rare. (\$200)
