- 233. Large Bronze Award Plaque Presented by the Norwegian Olympic Committee to Johan Johnson. Bronze, 26x49cm (10.2x19.3"), by T. Dammen. Viking and modern athlete facing left, large Olympic rings over 2-line legend "Johan Johnson/Fra Norges Olympia Komite 1939". In the upper right is attached a smaller size plaque of the same design in aluminum which was sold in 1939 to help fund the Norwegian team for the Helsinki 1940 Olympic Games. The large bronze plaque might be unique. EF. Very impressive. (\$4,000)
- 234. 1944 Olympic Games in Woldenberg, Poland, Concentration Camp, Poland. Ticket and Souvenir Sheet. Ticket 14x4.5cm (5.5"x1.8"). Flaming torch in olive wreath, dates July 23 – August 13, 1944, Olympic rings and "Olympic NOC" and legend in Polish at right. Plus Souvenir Sheet with "10" Olympic stamp, 11.1x7.1cm. Both EF. (2 pcs.) (\$350)
- 235. 40th IOC Session in Stockholm 1947. IOC Member Pin. Goldplated, enamelled, 21mm. Circular legend "Comité International Olympique Stockholm 1947", Olympic rings in center. Only 28 IOC members attended the session, soon after the end of World War II. Oslo was selected to hold the 1952 Olympic Winter Games. VF, enamel cracks. (\$150)

ST. MORITZ, 5th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1948

- Gold Official's Badge. Goldplated, multicolor enamel, 32mm. St. Moritz sun surrounded by legend on red, color rings affixed in center. Elbel W-4. EF. (\$600)
- Participant's Badge. Silvered bronze, multicolor enamel, 32mm. St. Moritz sun surrounded by legend on blue, color rings affixed in center. Elbel W-5. Toned EF. (\$500)
- Identity Card #961 of Arthur Meier, Liechtenstein, Cross Country, 4x10km Participant. 2 pages, 8.2x12.5cm (3.2"x4.9"). Photo and signature on back, also signature and stamp of his NOC President. EF. (\$150)
- 239. (Brochure) Règlement Général. General Rules and Regulations and Program, in French. 32pp., 13.6x20.9cm (5.4"x8.4"). Includes 3 plans of venues, plus program for London 1948. Lt. browning, EF. (\$100)

- 240. **Official Torch.** Aluminum alloy, 47cm (18.5"), designed by Ralph Lavers, made by E. Mil. Factories Ltd. and Collaborators. Cut-out Olympic rings over "XIVth Olympiad 1948. Olympia to London. With Thanks to the Bearer". EF. (\$7,500)
- Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 50mm, by G. Cassioli. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Light wear on high points, VF-EF. (\$5,000)
- Participation Medal. Bronze, 50mm, by J. Pinches/B. MacKennal. City view of London over legend in three lines, Olympic rings below. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing left. Cleaned EF. (\$150)

- 244. Canoeing Official's Badge. Silvered, 32x48mm. With light green ribbon, legend faded. Elbel S-48. One of 50 badges. EF. (\$260)
- Gymnastics Official's Badge. Silvered, 32x48mm. With pink ribbon, color and legend faded, VF. Elbel S-53. One of 80 badges. Badge EF. (\$260)
- Gymnastics Participant's Badge. Bronze, 32x48mm. With pink 246. ribbon, legend faded. Elbel S-71. EF. (\$200)
- Swimming Official's Badge. Silvered, 32x48mm. With orange ribbon inscribed "Swimming". Elbel S-58. Ribbon lightly faded on front. EF. (\$260)

British team patch on front "Olympic Games 1948". Stains, VF. The cap is made of khaki cloth size 57, made by Büsi-Sport. "Olympiade London / 1948" stamped inside top, with leather band. The photo shows British 1948 bobsledders wearing a similar cap. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$350)
- Opening Ceremony Program, July 29, 1948, Empire Stadium Wembley. 26pp., 21.3x27.3cm (8.4"x10.8"). Details of the opening ceremony, the route of the torch relay, awards of the Art Competition, the venues, history of the Olympic Games etc. Abt. EF. (\$100)




- (11.7"x16.5"), designed by Knut Yran (also designer of participation medal), printed by Kirstes Printing, Oslo. Embossed Oslo logo dividing signature of President Ditlev-Simonsen Jr. and General Secretary Peterson. Browning, taped on edge in 2 places, a few tears not affecting design, VF. (\$150)
- National Ski Association of Japan. Ski Year Book 1952 -**1953.** 292pp. illustrated plus 56 pages, 14.5x20.9cm (5.7"x8.2"), in Japanese. About 150pp. plus 12 pages of photos contain the report on the Oslo Olympic Games, illustrated with photos from the Opening Ceremony and many events. Housed in slipcover. Browning, abt. EF. (**\$100**)
- Olympia Posten. Daily Official Olympic Newspaper, February **14-24, 1952.** Complete set of 10 issues, illustrated, 28.7x43.5 (11.3"x17.1"), in Norwegian. Daily coverage of the Winter Games with many photos. Bound in half linen and gilt boards. EF. (\$100)

HELSINKI, 15th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1952

- Modern Pentathlon Technician's Badge. Bronze, partially enameled, 33x48mm. With violet ribbon, inscribed. Elbel S-212. EF. (\$200)
- 258. Shooting Official's Badge. Bronze, 33x48mm. With olive brown ribbon, inscribed. Elbel S-162. EF. (\$200)
- Pair of Badges: Basketball Technician's Badge with green inscribed ribbon, and Radio Badge with yellow-blue ribbon. Both bronze, partially enamelled, 33x48mm. Elbel S-203 and 63. Both EF. (2 pcs.) (\$350)
- **Second Class Olympic Order.** Gilt, white enamel, 42x50mm. Superimposed Olympic rings and Finnish lion. Rev. "1952" in center, Finnish lion attached below. With white-striped blue ribbon.
- Gold Medal and Bronze Medal Winners Pins. Each 13x15mm. Bronze pin housed in its black wallet. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$120)
- Pair of the First Soviet Team Pins. Gilt, red enamel, 37x26mm and 23x17mm. First participation of the Soviet Union in summer Olympic Games. 1912 marked the last participation of Imperial Russia. Abt. EF and EF. (2 pcs.) (\$100)
- Paavo Nurmi Presentation Tankard by the Finnish Torch Relay Commission. Carved wood 23cm (9.1") high, made by Kalevala Koru (KK). Two silver panels are attached on front and back, both engraved with writing in Finnish: "Helsinki XV Olympic Games / The Lighter of the Olympic Fire / Paavo Nurmi" (translated), and Olympic rings. The back panel reads "Torch Relay Committee/19.7.1952". Paavo Nurmi, "The Flying Finn", was a dominant runner in the 1920's winning 3 gold medals and 1 silver medal in Antwerp 1920; 5 gold medals in Paris 1924 and 1 gold and 2 silver medals in Amsterdam 1928. He was honored to light the Helsinki 1952 cauldron at the opening ceremony. Silver panels toned, EF. (\$1,500)



CORTINA d'AMPEZZO. 7th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1956

- Official Torch. Aluminum, 47cm (18.5") long. "VII° GIOCHI OLIMPICI INVERNALI CORTINA 1956" legend, cut-out Olympic rings at top. For the second Winter Olympic Torch Relay, the flame was lit at the Temple of Jupiter in Rome on January 22, 1956, and flown to Venice. The torch relay from there went to Cortina where the fire was lit in the stadium at the opening ceremony on January 26 by Guido Caroli. Cortina will again host Olympic Winter Games in 2026. Very scarce. With original burning unit and 2 copies of photos of the torch relay. Abt. EF. (\$22,000)
- 268. Pair of Silver and Bronze Small-Size Participation Medals. Hallmarked silver and bronze, each 40mm, by C. Affer. Female head facing, crowned by Olympic rings, flame in lower r. Rev. Snowflake superimposed on Mount Pomagagnon. Both EF. (\$900)
