

- 22. Innsbruck 1964 Winter. Gold Winner's Medal Awarded for Ice Hockey to the Soviet Union. Goldplated silver, by M. Coufal. Alpine Mountain, "Eishockey" below. Rev. Large logo surrounded by legend. Small metal part at top missing to hold replacement ribbon. Housed in its red leather presentation case with gold logo on top, lt. scuffing. Medal EF. (\$12,000)
- 23. Grenoble 1968 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Ski Jump/Large Hill Individual. Goldplated silver, 60mm, by Roger Excoffon. Logo within French legend. Rev. Depiction of a skier, "Saut" (Ski Jump, translated) below. With ribbon in Olympic colors. Housed in black leather case with gold logo on top, lined in blue velvet and silk. Medal EF. (\$15,000)

24. Innsbruck 1976 Winter. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Speed Skating and Housed in Red Presentation Case. Goldplated silver, 70mm, by M. Coufal. "Eisschnellauf" (Speed Skating) over Bergisel ski jump, Olympic flame at r. Rev. Official logo and legend. With ribbon in Austrian colors. Housed in red leather presentation case with gold-stamped logo on top. EF. (\$14,000)

- 25. Lake Placid 1980 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Speedskating 1.500m Women on February 14 to East Germany. Bronze, 80mm (3.2"), made by Tiffany & Co., designed by Medallic Art. Hand holding flaming torch, Whiteface Mountain in background. Rev. Logo over legend, large conifer branch at right, "Speedskating/1.500m Women" and name engraved at left. Housed in its Tiffany blue leatherette case lined in blue velvet and silk, plus Tiffany cardboard box. EF. (\$9,500)
- 26. Presentation Set of Three Winner's Medals of the Second Olympic Winter Games for the Disabled (Handicapped), Geilo, Norway 1980. Gold, Silver and Bronze colored, 55mm. Flaming torch with 3-wheel logo, looped. Fastened on Games diploma awarded to A. Schjott for his help with the Games. Award letter of the Committee attached on the back of the frame. 18 countries took part in these Games. Rare. EF. (\$4,000)

- 27. Moscow 1980. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Athletics. Goldplated silver, 60mm, by Ilya Postol. Victory seated with laurel and palm branch, Colosseum stadium in Rome in background. Rev. Olympic flame over stadium, Moscow logo in upper right. With multi-color ribbon, housed in red plastic case with gold logo, hairline crack on top. Medal EF. (\$9,000)
- 28. Sarajevo 1984 Winter. Bronze Winner's Medal in Presentation Case and Paper Box. Bronze, 65x71mm, struck by Majdanpek/Zin Mint. Laureated athlete's head r. Rev. Logo encircled by Croation
- legend. With orange ribbon, housed in blue leather case lined in velvet and silk, and blue cardboard box (very rare). EF. (\$6,000)
- 29. Sarajevo 1984 Winter. Largest Size Participation Medal Housed in its Presentation Case. Golden bronze, 9.5x9.5x10.5cm (3.7"x4.1"), designed by Nebojsa Mitric, made by Majdanpek/ Zin, Yugoslavia. Stylized Sarajevo 84 legend, small Sarajevo logo below. Only presented to a very small number of very high dignitaries. Housed in its large leather case. EF. (\$2,000)



- 30. Los Angeles 1984. Gold First Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Gymnastics Team Women. Goldplated silver, 60mm, by Dugald Stermer. Victory seated above stadium. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. Edge inscribed with event, won by the Romanian team. With tricolor ribbon. Toning around edge, EF. (\$12,000)
- 31. Calgary 1988 Winter. Silver Winner's Medal. Silver, 69mm, made by Jostens, Toronto. Joint Indian heads left, headdress consisting of winter sports equipment: skis, bobsled, luge, hockey stick etc. Rev. Calgary logo surrounded by Games legend in French and English. With long ribbon, housed in blue velvet presentation case, gray velvet inside. EF. (\$14,000)
