

ATHENS, INTERMEDIATE OLYMPIC GAMES, 1906

- Gold Participation Medal. Goldplated bronze, 50mm, by N. Lytras. Seated Nike holding laurel wreath, phoenix rising out of flames, Acropolis in background. Rev. 5-line Greek legend in laurel wreath. Light wear on high points, abt. EF. (\$900)
- Zappeion NOC Committee Badge. Celluloid, 31mm. Laureated head left of Zeus, "Olympic Games/1906/The Reception Committee" (translated from Greek). The Hellenic Committee organized a reception for the foreign athletes at the Zappeion. Rare. EF. (\$400)
- 91. **Commemorative Winner's Plaque.** Bronze, 50x70mm, by P. Vannier. Winner over crowded Athens Olympic stadium, Acropolis at l. Rev. Fame flying over laurel tree, Greek temple at right EF. **(\$240)**
- 92. Theodore Andrea Cook. The Cruise of the Branwen. Being a Short History of the Modern Revival of the Olympic Games, Together with an Account of the Adventures of the English Fencing Team in Athens in MCMVI. Privately published May 7, 1908. Dedicated to the British Olympic Council. XVIII, 166pp., 34 photographic tipped-in plates: Opening Ceremony, English team, English fencing team, fencing competitions, Sheering winning marathon, etc. With gilt titles, partially faded cover, inside EF. St. George slaying the dragon, representing Great Britain, Victory at left holding palm branch. Edge inscribed "Second Prize Feather-Weight Boxing C. Morris". Housed in dark blue box inscribed in gold on top, VF. Medal toned EF. (\$6,500)
- 95. **Time Keeper's Badge.** Silvered, rose-shaped, dark blue enamel, 57mm. Helmeted head left of Britannia facing laurel sprig, in circle of blue inscribed enamel. Elbel S-19. Toned EF. **(\$1,400)**
- 95a. **Steward's Badge.** Silvered, dark blue enamel, 57mm. Helmeted head l. of Britannia facing laurel branch, surrounded by legend. Elbel S-18. Toned EF. (\$1,300)
- Score-Keeper's Badge. Silvered, dark blue enamel, 57mm.
 Helmeted head left of Britannia facing laurel branch, surrounded by legend. Elbel S-16. Toned EF. (\$1,200)

- 98. Cased Honor Committee Medal. Silver, 50mm, by B. MacKennal. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. 19 countries' delegates made up the "Comité d' Honneur", Official report p. 14. Housed in blue leatherette case, gold inscribed, spotty. Medal EF. Rare. (\$1,400)
- 99. **Franco-British Exposition Official Award Medal, 1908.** Goldplated bronze, 63mm, by F. Bowcher. Winged female with olive branch behind French Marianne and Britannia. Rev. Draped female standing behind seated personification of France and England, exposition in background, "A. Darras-Jury" on panel below. *The Exposition included the 1908 London Olympic Games.* EF. **(\$200)**
- 100. Silver Participation Medal. Silver, 50mm, by B. MacKennal. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Presented to dignitaries and high officials. Small rim nicks, polished, abt. EF. (\$750)

- 101. Participation Medal. White metal, 50mm, by B. MacKennal. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Light wear on high points, abt. EF. (\$600)
- 102. First Olympic Winter Games in London, 1908. Participant's Badge. Bronze, 30mm, made by Vaughton. Helmeted head left of Britannia facing laurel sprig, circular legend on border. "WG 263" on reverse (WG = Winter Games participant #263). Elbel S-10. The first winter sport events in Olympic Games were held in London, October 28 and 29, 1908; Gentlemen's and Ladies Figure Skating won by U. Salchow, Sweden and Mrs. Syers, United Kingdom; Pair Skating, won by Hübler/Burger, Germany, and Special Figures, won by N. Panin, Russia. According to the London 1908 official report 26 skaters participated. Toned EF. Very rare. (\$900)
- 104. Competitor's Card of Wrestling Gold Medalist Stanley Bacon, United Kingdom. Cardboard, 11.5x20.5cm (4.5"x8.1"), in English, French and German. Center crease, lt. foxing spots, VF-EF. (\$350)
- 105. (Brochure) Olympische Spiele von London, 1908. Olympic Games in London, 1908. Program and General Regulations, in German. 23 pages, 16.5x24.5cm (6.5"x9.7"). Four pages of Regulations and 17 pages the complete program, including skating with medals to be awarded. Stiff covers partially darkened, "Felix Graf" name at top, vertical fold throughout, contents abt. EF. (\$260)

- Henley-on-Thames Olympic Regatta 1908. Welcome Committee Banquet Invitation to Felix Graf in Honor of the Competing Oarsmen, July 31, 1907, 7pm. 17.5x13.2cm (6.9"x5.2"). Banquet at the Lawn's Club Marquee on the Bucks shore of the Regatta course. About EF. (\$150)
- Baily's Magazine of Sports and Pastimes, September 1908. 87 pages illustrated plus advertisements, 13.8x23cm (5.4"x9.1"). - Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 33mm, by Erik Lindberg and Bertram MacKennal, struck by Sporrong & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. Lt. rubbing on high points, EF. (\$6,000)
- 115. Cased Bronze Winner's Medal. Bronze, 33mm, by Erik Lindberg and Bertram Mackennal, struck by Sporrong & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. Housed in green leather presentation case. Medal toned EF. (\$5,500)
- Pewter Winner's Medal. Pewter, 33mm, by Erik Lindbergh and Bertram MacKennal, struck by Sporrong & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. A small number of winners medals were struck in pewter and was sold to visitors as souvenirs. EF. (\$800)
- Swedish Choir Badge for the Stockholm Olympic Games. 117. Gilt brass, 26x30mm. Harp over laurel wreath, with yellow-blue Swedish color ribbon and bar "12-14 Juli 1912". Elbel page 23. Small frayed spot on ribbon, o.w. EF. (\$180)



- 118. **Visitor's Pin.** Hallmarked silver, 22x26mm. Nude flagbearers with flags of participating nations, same design as the official poster. EF. (\$150)
- 119. Olympic Sports - Athletics, Soccer and Tennis - Depicted on Art Nouveau Large Vase. Colored and gilded etched bronze, 48cm (18.9") high, 24cm (9.5") wide, designed by C.H. Norrström in 1912. Three figures of Nike, goddess of Victory, holding a laurel wreath in each hand dividing three panels of sports illustrations. In the first panel a group of four runners is trying to catch Nike's winner's wreath. The second panel shows five young men playing soccer, a discus thrower and a javelin thrower in upper right in background. The third panel depicts four tennis players in a game of Doubles, three tennis players waiting their turn in background. There is a gold border of olive branches around the top, the bottom half is decorated with numerous green olive wreaths and gold flowers. The vase stands on four small balls. Signed on bottom gold border "C.H. Norrström 1912". C.H. Norrström (1853-1923) studied at the Royal Academy in Stockholm, also at the Ecole des Arts Decoratifs in Paris from 1877 to 1880. On his return to Sweden he lived in Eskilstuna, later in Storängen. He was a sculptor, a painter and celebrated
- for his bronze etched artworks. He received a gold medal at the Paris 1900 World Exposition, and his works are displayed at the Stockholm National Museum. This is the first time Olympic events are depicted on a work of art: a beautiful museum piece. Small bumps, abt. EF. Unique. (\$9,000)
- 120. Commemorative Porcelain Dish with Discus Thrower Design. 10x13.5cm (3.9"x5.3"). Discus thrower and greetings from the Stockholm Olympic Games legend. EF. (\$150)
- 121. Equestrian Ticket: July 16, 1912 Jumping, Individual and 3-Day Equestrian Event, Stadium. Blue, 12.2x6.6cm (4.8"x2.6"), Price 5 Kronor. EF. (\$220)
