- 150. **Pair of Light and Dark Yellow Glass Vases.** Each 12cm (4.7") high, made by Leerdam Glass Fabriek, designed by C. Kannegieter. Olympic 1928 Games legend and Amsterdam shield between ornate design. Both EF. (2 pcs.) (\$260)
