## GARMISCH-PARTENKIRCHEN, 5th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1940 (Cancelled)

Original Steel Hub for the Participant's Badge of the Garmisch-Partenkirchen 1940 Olympic Winter Games. 58x55mm, Badge design 35mm. Mountain above sled, Olympic rings below. Circular legend "V. Olympic Winter Games 1940 – Garmisch-Partenkirchen" (translated from German). The 1940 badge is very rare. Later copies exist with variations. Light corrosion around outside hub, but top with badge is in excellent condition. See Official Report color plate after page 34. EF. (\$300)

239a. Official Report. Preparations for the V Olympic Winter Games 1940 Garmisch-Partenkirchen, by the Organizing Committee. Munich (1940). 130pp. illustrated, 4 color plates, 23.6x31cm (9.3"x12.2"), in German (only language published). Official poster, winner's diploma, winner's medal, participant's badge shown in color. Extensive report on the preparations for the Games which were given to Garmisch only at the IOC Session in London in June 1939, after having been taken from St. Moritz, Switzerland. On Nov. 20, 1939, the Games were canceled due to ongoing World War II. Blue linen, goldstamped after legend, lt. foxing on cover and end papers, o.w. EF. (\$700)

#### **TOKYO, 12th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1940 (Cancelled)**

- 240. Cased Badge of the Amateur Athletic Federation of Japan. Silvered, white and blue enamel, 26mm, with purple rosette, 60mm. Mount Fuji with color Olympic rings and legend "XII Olympiad/Tokyo 1940". Housed in wooden box with "Amateur Athletic Federation Japan" legend, VF. Badge EF. (\$1,500)
- 240a. Track & Field Badge of the International Games 1940 Held in Tokyo Instead of the Cancelled Olympic Games. Silvered and blue enamel, 40x51mm. Row of athletes, 4 yellow rings above. With Japanese inscribed ribbon. EF. (\$400)
- 241. Commemorative Long Jump 1940 Tea Cup. White porcelain, blue, black and brown design, 5cm high, 6.3cm wide. Two long jumpers in Olympic rings, divided by blue "1940" and Japanese legend. EF. (\$150)

- (Bid Book Tokyo 1940 in English). Tokyo Sports Center of the Orient. Tokyo Municipal Office, 1934. 15pp. text, 44 pages of photos intertwined with explanations, 27.5x20cm (10.8"x7.9") oblong, upper edges gilt. Invitation to IOC by Tokyo Mayor to hold the 1940 XIIth Olympic Games in Tokyo. Tokyo was awarded the 1940 Games at the Berlin IOC Session in July 1936. Stiff paper covers, gold embossed title, in original brown-red cardboard slipcase, Itly. scuffed, bid book EF. Very rare. (\$1,200)
- (Report) The 12th Olympic Games Tokyo Municipal Office. 243. Tokyo 1940. Green linen, embossed rings on cover, 19.8x26.4cm (7.8"x10.4"). Many b&w photos of the Organizing Committee, large number of plans of venues, posters etc., in Japanese. Rare. EF. (\$900)

#### HELSINKI, 12th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1940 (Cancelled)

- Color Enamelled XII Olympiad 1940 Logo Plaque. White and red, 40x75mm. Radiant flame below Olympic rings, "XII Olympia 1940" below. EF. (\$180)
- Color Enamelled Logo Pin. Silver, 13x23mm, made by Y. Salmela, Turku. With disk on back. EF. (\$160)

- (Brochure) Official Program and Prices of Tickets. 15pp., 14.1x21.3cm (5.6"x8.4"), in Finnish. Complete program by day and hour, plus detailed list of ticket prices. Crease, abt. EF. (\$140)
- Handpainted Silver Cauldron with Olympic Games from Athens 1896 to Berlin and Helsinki 1940. 10x14.5cm (3.9"x5.7") pasted on stiff paper. Plus development of a trial brown cauldron with Olympiads and Olympic rings at top in gold. The brown background made the text less visible than the chosen example on silver background with black legend. Pencil text on back that the design was commissioned by the Reichs Print Office in Berlin for the cover of a color Olympia catalog. (\$240)
- (Magazine) Switzerland, Nr. 6, June 1944. Olympic Jubilee, Lausanne, 1944. 40pp. illus. 24.5x33.6cm (9.6"x13.2"), in French and German. Included are articles about Coubertin, the Restoration of the Olympic Games in 1894, celebration in Lausanne etc. Abt. EF. (\$80)

- 250. Participation Medal in Presentation Box. Bronze, 40mm, by Wiederkehr. Olympic rings over French legend in five lines. Rev. Symbolic figure of Victory, mountain range in back. Toned EF, in dark red case with gold Olympic rings. (\$750)
- Special Slalom Full Ticket, Suvretta, Thursday, February 6, **1948,** Morning. Tribune, Price Fr. 10.-. 12.5x4cm (4.9"x1.6"). With stamp "Muster" ("Trial", translated). EF. (\$150)
- Pair of Tickets. 10000 Meters Speedskating, Tuesday, February 3, 1948, Morning, Ice Stadium, Tribune, Price Fr. 4.-. 9x5.2cm. Small tear, EF. Plus Daily Ticket, Friday, February 6, 1948. Standing Room, Price Fr. 10.-, 7x4cm, Abt. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$200)



#### LONDON, 14th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1948

- **Official Torch.** Aluminum alloy, 47cm (18.5"), designed by Ralph Lavers, made by E. Mil. Factories Ltd. and Collaborators. Cut-out Olympic rings over "XIVth Olympiad 1948. Olympia to London. With Thanks to the Bearer". EF. (\$6,000)
- **Organizing Committee Badge.** Silvered, rings in color, 32x48mm. Suspended from green "XIV O.C." bar, short ribbon in Olympic colors and dark green ribbon. See Elbel S-26. One of 50 badges. Rubbing, EF. (\$1,100)
- 254a. Participation Medal Housed in Red Box. Bronze, 50mm, by J. Pinches/B. MacKennal. City view of London over legend in three lines, Olympic rings below. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing left. Housed in red box. EF. (\$240)
- 255. Group of Four Commemorative Pins and One Button. Silvered, 20x30mm, with view of Big Ben over color rings. Plus 3 pins with similar view, and a button, 31mm. All EF, toning on pins. (5 pcs.) (\$80)
- Trio of London Olympic Games Souvenirs: The Olympic Flame Pin from Athens to London and Torquay. Silvered, 6cm, fastened on 4-page cardboard with list of all English cities visited by the torch, and the Olympic Oath. Cardboard VF, pin EF. Plus a Silver and Black Mirror with London view and legend, EF, and an Olympic Beer Coaster, VF. (3 pcs.) (\$100)

- Gold First Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Athletics Long 258. Jump to Willie Steel, USA. 59.5x46.5cm (23.4"x18.3"). Award legend between open laurel wreath, palm branches at sides. A few very light spots, otherwise in perfect condition, in black frame, glazed. (\$450)
- 259. Second Place Gymnastics Winner's Diploma Awarded for Floor Exercise to János Mogyorósi-Klencs, Hungary. 57x42.5cm (22.4"x16.7"). Award legend between open laurel wreath, palm branches at sides. Edges all around diploma bent back, making visible diploma 50x40cm (19.7"x15.8"). VF-EF. (\$350)
- Third Place Gymnastics Winner's Diploma Awarded for Long Horse Vault to János Mogyorósi-Klencs. 57x42.5cm (22.4"x16.7"). Award legend between open laurel wreath, palm branches on either side. Small tear at bottom, otherwise EF. (\$300)

- Celebrated Water Polo Gold Medalist Dezsö Guarmati, Hungary: Group of Six Olympic Identity Cards, 1948-1992. Included are his ID card as Player from London 1948 (silver), Helsinki 1952 (gold) and Melbourne 1956 (Gold); Montreal 1976 as Coach of the gold medal winning team, Moscow 1980 as coach of the bronze medal winning team and Barcelona 1992 as Trainer of the 5th place team. All ID Cards have his photo and signature. Gyarmati was the most decorated water polo player in the history of the sport. He played in the famous blood in the water match between Hungary and the Soviet Union at the 1956 Olympics, which occurred weeks after the Soviet invasion of Hungary. Seldom seen group of ID Cards spanning 5 decades of a very famous water polo player. EF. (6 pcs.) (\$300)
