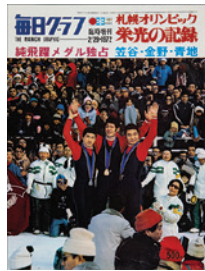

365. **Guide and Book to the Sapporo Winter Games.** Published by the Organizing Committee. 38pp. of mostly color plates, plus actual postcards, and 12 album pages for photos, 29.3x30.5cm (4.5"x12"), in Japanese. Large fold-out with detailed program, eight attached postcards on two pages, 1 full Ice Hockey ticket, 6 different stamp sheets etc. Stiff blue linen covers with large brass logo. In original carton with logo. EF. (\$120)

365a. **(Magazine) The Manichi Graphic, February 29, 1972. The Sapporo Olympic Games Issue.** 115 pages illustrated in color and b&w, 25.5x34cm (10"x13.4"), in Japanese. Opening and closing, and events, all lavishly illustrated. EF. (\$100)

**MUNICH, 20th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1972**

366. **Official Torch.** Steel, 73cm (28.8"), made by Krupp. *The fire was lit in Olympia, Greece on July 28 and carried 5539km in 29 days to Munich by 5976 runners.* Carried in the torch relay, blackened from flame at top. Abt. EF. (\$1,500)

367. **Munich 1972 Pair of Silver and Bronze Winners Pins, Plus Silver Winners Pin from Barcelona 1992.** 13x15mm each pin. All housed in their black wallets. EF. (3 pcs.) (\$150)

368. **Pierre de Coubertin White Porcelain Medal, 1896-1972.** 79mm, made by KPM (Royal Porcelain Factory) Berlin. Head left of Coubertin over Olympic rings. Rev. "Athens 1896 - München 1972." In original box, spotty on outside. Medal EF. (\$80)

368a. **Commemorative Medal of Pierre de Coubertin, Restorer of the Olympic Games.** White metal, 78mm uniface. Bust of Coubertin, Olympic rings above, flags on sides leading into stadium. Looped, toned EF. (\$100)

369. **International Olympic Committee Medal of Office.** Goldplated, 51mm. Raised Olympic rings over olive and laurel branches, name of IOC around outer edge. Rev. Olympic motto "Citius-Altius-Fortius" above olive and laurel branches. *The medal was presented to IOC members only.* With golden braid chain. EF. (\$300)

370. **Steel Hub for the Official Munich 1972 Logo Pin.** Hub is 50x45mm, the raised pin on the hub is 15x34mm. Munich spirale dividing Olympic rings and "München". Light rust around hub, pin design EF. (\$100)

371. **Blue and White Porcelain Ashtray with Olympic Rings.** 13cm (5.1") wide, 6cm high. Large Olympic rings in center, outside is surrounded by skyline views of Munich. Porcelain mark on bottom. Unusual ashtray. EF. (\$100)

372. **A Diver Entering the Pool - Art Poster by David Hockney.** Color lithography, 64x102cm (25.2"x40.2"). Olympic diver reaching water. *Hockney was asked to design a poster for the Munich Olympic Games, and in 1970 finished the Diver poster. After moving to Los Angeles from Northern England in the mid 60's, his most known paintings include the swimming pool paintings prompted by the brilliant light he found in California. Poster with facsimile signature "David Hockney (19)70".* EF. (\$260)

373. **Yachting Events in Kiel Beer Stein.** Multicolor, 13.6cm (5.4"), Kaiser porcelain manufactory. Cauldron with flame over Olympic rings flanked by Kiel city view and yachts with Laboe monument. EF. Rare. (\$150)





374. **Beer Stein with Official Spiral Logo.** 16cm (6.3") high. "Munich 1972" and Olympic Rings on side. EF. Plus **"Olympiade 1972 München" Blue Ceramic Beer Stein.** 13cm (5.1") high. Munich Child over Olympic rings and "Olympiade 1972 München", flanked by Edelweiss flowers. Tiny chip on top, o.w. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$100)
375. **Pair of Munich 1972 Beer Steins.** Multicolor, 13cm (5.1") high. "Paulaner München" with view of Munich, logo of Munich Games on sides. Plus Münchner Kindl (Munich Child, patron of the City) with Olympic rings. Both EF. (2 pcs.) (\$120)
376. **Czech Olympic Gold Medal Winner with Flags Figurine.** Porcelain, 11.5cm (4.5") high, by H&C Porcelain Company. Gold medal winner on podium inscribed "1972 XX Olympic Games" (translated from Czech), holding Czech Olympic logo, amid 4-color flags. EF. (\$100)
377. **Olympic Tower Lighter.** 5.5cm, 14.5cm (5.7") high. Silver tower in lucite, "München 1972 XX." and Olympic rings around top. Boxed. EF. (\$120)
378. **Group of 5 Athletics Programs, August 31, September 1-3, and September 9, 1972.** Green and blue, 21x20cm (8.3"x7.9") illustrated, in German, English and French. 100m won by V. Borzov, Sov./Ukri.; 800m by D. Wottle, USA; 10000m. by Lasse Viren, Finland; 400m Hurdles by J. Akii-Bua, Uganda; 20000m Walk by P. Frenkel, East Germany. Two pages with partial scores. EF. (5 pcs.) 383. **Bulgarian Delegation Presentation Plaque.** Silvered copper, 5.5x15.5cm (2.2"x6.1"). Bulgarian lion above legend, Innsbruck Olympic logo below. Boxed. EF. (\$100)
- INNSBRUCK, 12th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1976**
384. **Official Mascot Snowman ("Schneemandel") as Ice Hockey Player.** 11cm (4.3") tall. White felt-covered hard body wearing red hockey puck on his head, holding hockey stick. EF, in pictorial box. (\$200)
385. **Official Poster of the Snowman (Schneemandel) Mascot.** Multicolor poster, affixed on wooden board, 59x83cm (23.2"x32.7"). Smiling and waving mascot, "Official Olympia Mascot/Innsbruck 1976" and logo below. Many small chips, VF. (\$100)
- MONTREAL, 21st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1976**
386. **Official Torch.** Aluminum, 66cm (30") tall. Red, with Montreal logo, top painted black. Designed by George Huel and Michael Dall. *The flame was carried from Olympia, Greece to Athens from where it was transferred by satellite to Ottawa; 245 runners carried it to Montreal.* EF. (\$5,000)

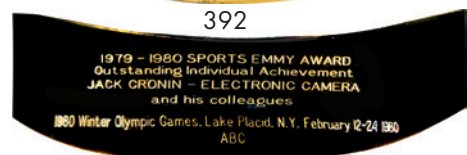

- 387. **Gold Medal Winner's Pin Awarded by the IOC.** Goldplated, 13x15mm. Unc. Numbered, in black plastic wallet. **(\$100)**
- 387a. **Pair of Silver and Bronze IOC Official Winners Pins.** Rings gilt, each 13x15mm. Both EF. (2 pcs.) **(\$100)**
- 388. **Pair of Official Silver and Bronze Commemorative Medals.** Both 50mm, made by Huguenin. View of the stadium. Rev. Logo above City of Montreal. Both Unc., cased. (2 pcs.) **(\$120)**
- 389. **Soviet Team Medal and Pin Set.** Medal bronze, 60mm. Red flag over hammer and sickle. Rev. Montreal logo. Plus Team Badge, 40x25mm, and 25 different sports participation pins. All EF, in official cardboard box. **(\$100)**

- 390. **Bronze Sample Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 80mm, made by Tiffany & Co. Hand holding flaming torch, Whiteface Mountain in background. Rev. Logo over legend, large conifer branch at r. Edge stamped "Bronze" and "Sample" Toned EF. **(\$1,200)**
- 391. **Soviet Team Medal and Pin Set in Presentation Case.** Bronze medal 55mm. Soviet flag over hammer and sickle. Rev. Lake Placid logo. Plus large team badge, and 8 team pins of sports including ice hockey. Housed in blue leatherette case, red velvet inside. EF. **(\$100)**

- 392. **Sports Emmy Award Presented to Jack Cronin, ABC, for Outstanding Individual Achievement in Electronic Camera: Coverage of the Lake Placid Games, Especially, the Miracle on Ice.** Gold color, 38.5cm (15.2") tall, base about 18cm (7.1") wide. The goddess of television, her wings in the form of lightning, upholds the satellite of the world in the highest award of broadcasting. Standing on top of globe encircled by "The National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences". A 6-line engraved award legend on a black band below, awarded for "Electronic Camera", "1980 Winter Olympic Games, Lake Placid New York, February 12-24, 1980". Small spots, VF-EF. **(\$4,000)**
- 393. **Alpine Skier Pewter Sculpture for the Lake Placid Olympic Winter Games.** 13cm (5.1"), 14.5cm (5.7") high, by Philip Kraszowski. Logo and inscription plaque on bottom, made by Colonial Mint. EF. **(\$120)**
- 394. **Beer Stein Celebrating the Opening Day - February 13, 1980.** Cream colored ceramic with gold decor, 16cm (6.3") high. Color logo, Olympic Games legend on back. #478 of 1980 made. EF. **(\$80)**
- 395. **Invitation to Participate in the 1980 Lake Placid Olympic Winter Games.** 4 pages, inside 2 pages text, 21.5x28cm (8.5"x11"). EF. **(\$50)**
- 396. **Official Results.** Bound in white leatherette, approximately 240 unnumbered pages for each sport and each participant, in English, French and German. 21.5x28.5cm (8.5"x11.2"). EF. **(\$80)**
- 397. **Final Official Report.** 223pp. illustrated in English and French. Bound in white linen, gold stamped. EF. **(\$80)**





- MOSCOW, 22nd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1980**
398. **Official Torch.** Aluminum alloy, gray and gold, Moscow logo and legend in red, 56cm (22.5”), designed by Boris Tuchin. *Runners carried the torch during the 30-day torch relay from Olympia, Greece through Bulgaria and Romania to Moscow, a distance of 4976 km.* EF. **(\$3,000)**
- 398a. **Model Torch Designed for Moscow 1980 Olympic Torch Relay.** Gray and gold aluminum, 53cm (20.9”). Decorated in red with Olympic rings over Olympic legend in Cyrillic. EF. Rare. **(\$2,000)**
399. **Bulgarian Torchbearer Medal, 1980.** Silver, 40mm. Flaming torch passing hands. Rev. Shields of cities touched by relay June 26 to July 1. Plus Greek and Russian Torchbearers Pins. All EF. (3 pcs.) **(\$100)**
400. **Large Porcelain Mascot Misha the Bear.** 28cm (11”) Smiling Misha, head tilted to the right. Scarce size. EF. **(\$100)**
401. **Pair of Moscow 1980 Olympic Games Souvenirs: Alarm Clock with Key** on inscribed black base. 16x5.3cm, height of clock 6cm (2.4”). Plus **Compass** in black case, Moscow logo on top. Both EF. (2 pcs.) **(\$100)**

402. **Group of 14 Soviet Identity Cards.** All with photos. 63x86mm: Control Organizing Committee, Co-II and III; B, D, E – Es and Ee; F etc. Plus award card, and a worker’s ID. Almost all EF. (16 pcs.) **(\$260)**
403. **Gold Medal for the Press at the 11th Olympic Congress in Baden-Baden, Germany, 1981.** Goldplated silvered metal, 54mm. Olympic rings and Congress legend. Rev. Square with “Presse” within circle. Housed in Lucite, 10x10cm (3.9”x3.9”). EF. **(\$80)**
- SARAJEVO, 14th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1984**
404. **Official Torch.** Stainless steel cylinder, bowl gold colored with “Sarajevo 84” legend. Length 57.5cm (22.6”), weight 680 grams. Manufactured by Nippon K. under the supervision of Mizuno Corp. Steel cylinder darkened from flame, torch holder EF. **(\$4,500)**
405. **Group of Five Official 11th Olympic Congress and 84th IOC Session Registered Envelopes, 1981.** 3 stamps with cancellations on each envelope. All EF. (5 pcs.) **(\$70)**
406. **IOC Badge.** Silvered, 30x30mm. Logo above “Sarajevo 84”. With white ribbon. Plus **Press Badge** with orange ribbon, both EF but ribbons partially soiled. Elbel unlisted and 182. Plus Badge with Replacement tricolored ribbon. (3 pcs.) **(\$180)**
407. **Official Poster.** 68.5x98.2cm (27”x38.7”), designed by C. Kastovic, printed by Borba, Belgrade. Large logo. EF. **(\$300)**
