

84. **Commemorative Medal of Meyer Prinstein, USA, Winning the Long Jump.** Silvered copper, 24mm, by Nisiotis. Winged Nike (featured on winners medals since 2004). Rev. Meyer Prinstein jumping, surrounded by Greek legend “Winner of Simple Jump American Myer Prinstein” (transl.) *Meyer Prinstein won a total of four gold and one silver medal in long jump and triple jump in Paris 1900, St. Louis 1904, and Athens 1906.* With loop and ring. Abt. EF. (\$220)
85. **Commemorative Medal for Martin Joseph Sheridan, USA, Winner in Shot Put.** Silvered bronze, 24mm, by Nisiotis. Winged Nike, Goddess of Victory. Rev. Sheridan’s shot put. *Sheridan also won Discus Throw, and second place in Standing High Jump, Standing Long Jump and Stone Throw.* Abt. EF. (\$180)
86. **Commemorative Medal for Marathon Winner William John Sherring from Canada.** Bronze, 24mm, by Nisiotis. Winged Nike, Goddess of Victory. Rev. Sherring running to the right surrounded by legend. Toned EF. (\$180)
87. **(Brochure) Ordre Des Concours Et Des Fêtes, 1906.** Order of the Competitions and Festivities in Athens, 1906. Translated from French. 23 pages, 15x23cm (5.9”x9.1”), in Greek and French. List of all competitions plus Archeological visits on 3 days in Athens. Browning, cover taped, last page lose, vertical crease, VF. (\$600)
88. **Program of the International Olympic Games in Athens, April 22 – May 2, 1906.** Athens, 1905. 7 pages, 14.6x21cm (5.8”x8.3”), in French. All sports described without dates, plus General Rules by S. P. Lambros, according to the President of the Committee, the Prince Royal. Crease at lower right, abt. EF. (\$600)
89. **Pair of Postcards of Greek Athletes of the 1906 Athens Intermediate Olympic Games.** Postcard 14x9.2cm (5.5”x3.6”) with 57 photos of athletes including the King, address on back. Plus 8.7x13.7cm (3.4”x5.4”): **Postcard featuring 8 Olympic Winners including the Aliprantis Brothers.** Writing on back. VF+ and VF. (2 pcs.) (\$160)

90. **(Swedish Report) Balck, V.G. Sweden’s Participation in the Olympic Games in Athens 1906.** Stockholm, 1906. 82pp., profusely illustrated throughout, 24.5x34cm (9.7”x13.4”), in Swedish. Extensive report on the Olympic Games, highlighting also the Swedish team. Bound in marble boards and linen, corners scuffed, lower part of spine missing, contents EF. (\$200)

91. **Gold Donor’s Medal Housed in its Red Leather Presentation Case.** Goldplated bronze, 51mm, by Bertram MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Housed in red leather case with gold legend on top, abt. EF. Medal VF-EF. (\$1,000)
92. **Silver Judge’s Participation Medal.** Silvered bronze, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Housed in blue case with gold legend, medal toned EF. (\$900)

94. **Participation Medal.** White metal, 50mm, by B. MacKenna. Winged Fame standing on globe holding palm branch and horn. Rev. Winner in quadriga dashing left. Light wear on high points, abt. EF. (\$600)
95. **Committee Badge.** Silvered, rose-shaped, 57mm. Helmeted head left of Britannia facing laurel sprig, in circle of blue inscribed enamel. Elbel S-8. EF. (\$1,000)
96. **Participant's Badge of the First Olympic Winter Games in London.** Silvered, 30mm. Helmeted head l. of Athena facing laurel sprig, surrounded by legend on blue enamel. "WG" (for Winter Games) and number on back. Elbel S-10. *The first Olympic winter sport events were held in London 1908: Gentlemen's and Ladies Figure Skating won by U. Salchow, Sweden and Mrs. Syers, United Kingdom; Pair Skating, won by Hübler/Burger, Germany, and Special Figures, won by N. Panin, Russia.* According to the London 1908 official report 26 skaters participated. Toned EF. Very rare. (\$900)
97. **Jury Badge of the Franco-British Exhibition in London, 1908.** Silvered, 35x37mm, made by Spencer, London. "Jury" in center surrounded by exhibition information. *The 1908 Olympic Games were part of the Franco-British Exhibition.* Toned abt. EF. (\$150)
98. **Official Report of the Fourth Olympiad London 1908.** 795pp., 60 photographic plates. Program, all events, all results, rules, and regulations for all events, and list of all participants with countries and sports participated in. Red linen covers, corners and spine scuffed, VF+, contents EF. (\$200)
99. **"Nordic Games in Stockholm 1909" Silver Plate.** Silvered copper, 18cm (7.1"), made by J.G. Hallberg. Inscription of Nordic Games around plate with fluted decorated border. Abt. EF. (\$100)
100. **Pittsburg YMCA Olympic Meet Medal, 1911, in the Style of the Athens 1906 Winners Medal.** Bronze, 31mm, by Dieges & Clust. Head of Zeus holding statue of Nike. Rev. View of Acropolis, legend above. Toned EF. (\$150)

101. **Silver Participation Medal.** Silver, 51mm, by Erik Lindberg/MacKenna. Zeus seated on Ionian column holding figure of Victory, Stockholm in background. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing l. *The silver medal was presented to members of the Swedish Olympic Committee and the IOC.* Uneven toning, VF-EF. (\$1,200)
102. **Participation Medal Housed in its Presentation Case.** White metal, 50mm, by Erik Lindberg/Bertram MacKenna. Zeus seated on Ionian column holding figure of Nike, Stockholm in background. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing left. Housed in its rare presentation case lined in velvet and silk, VF-EF. Medal EF. (\$600)

103. **Participation Medal.** Pewter, 51mm, by Erik Lindberg/MacKennial. Zeus seated on Ionian column holding figure of Nike, Stockholm in back. Rev. Quadriga with triumphant winner dashing l. EF. Plus **Stockholm Olympic Society Medal.** Bronze, 45mm, by Erik Lindberg. Nude female blowing horn. Rev. Legend. EF/abt. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$400)
104. **Official Visitor's Pin.** Hallmarked silver, 22x26mm. Nude flagbearers with flags of participating nations, legend below. EF. (\$180)
105. **Gold First Prize Plaque Awarded to G.B. Dukes for Long Jump on July 23, 1912 During a Visit of the American Team to Park Pomery, France.** Goldplated silver, 70x44mm, by André Mery. Athlete overlooking stadium, plaque "Réception Team Américain 23 Juillet 1912" on left. Rev. City view and inscription "Saut à la Perche/1<sup>st</sup>/G.B. Dukes" (Long jump/1<sup>st</sup>/G.B. Dukes). *Park Pomery was inaugurated as seat of the IOC on July 23.* EF. (\$260)
106. **Great Britain Athletic Association Field Day, Olympic Trial Medal, June 1<sup>st</sup> 1912.** Bronze, 38mm. Flag wavers, similar to Stockholm 1912 design. Rev. 4-line legend. Looped, VF-EF. (\$100)
107. **British Olympic Games Trial Races Badge, 1912.** Multicolor, 32mm, made by Aughtons Ltd., Birmingham. Triple "A" in center surrounded by red and blue circles. Scarce. EF. (\$300)
108. **Commemorative Olympic Stadium in Stockholm Porcelain Plate.** Blue and white, 23.3cm (9.2"), made by Roerstrand. Aerial view of stadium decorated with flags, surrounded by laurel wreath, Olympic legend on scroll at bottom. EF. (\$200)
109. **Pair of Stockholm 1912 Brass Candle Holders.** Brass, 22cm (8.7") high. Pleasing candlesticks with attached bronze participant badges, initials "AW" at lower parts. Toned abt. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$260)
110. **Commemorative Porcelain Dish with Discus Thrower Design.** 10x13.5cm (3.9"x5.3"). Discus thrower, and greetings from the Stockholm Olympic Games legend. EF. (\$140)

111. **Commemorative Dish with Olympic Stadium.** Silvered bronze, 11cm (4.3") wide, 3cm high. Stockholm Olympic Stadium in center encircled by 8 trees, divided by 3 Swedish crowns. Nice souvenir! Toned VF-EF. (\$160)
112. **Commemorative Cup Featuring the IOC Badge.** Silvered pewter, 9cm (3.5") high. Large badge on cup. Toned EF. (\$140)
113. **Stadium Equestrian Ticket, July 16, 1912, "B", Loge Nr. 48, Price 20 kronor.** Blue, 12x6.5cm (4.7"x2.6"). Jean Carion, France, won Jumping Individual. Part of paper glue stain on back, front of ticket EF. (\$200)

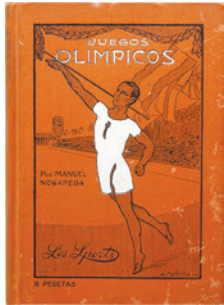

116. **Silver Winner's Medal in the German Olympic Trials for the Berlin 1916 Olympic Games, Presented by the German Committee for Olympic Games.** Silver, 50mm. Military bust r. of Emperor Wilhelm II. Rev. "To the Winner in the Olympic Trials" (translated) over olive sprig surrounded by German Olympic Committee legend. Very rare in silver. EF. **(\$650)**
117. **(Book) Nogareda, Manuel. Juegos Olimpicos. Olympic Games, in Spanish.** Barcelona (1914). Story of the Olympic Games from 1892 to the Cancellation of the 1916 Berlin Games. With 1896-1912 list of many Olympic events, naming winners. Pictorial linen, VF+, contents EF. **(\$100)**
118. **The Second Far East Olympic Games in Shanghai, 1915. Pair of Japanese Silver Badges.** 27mm and 35mm. "Japan Second Olympic Games" (translated), name of the newspaper that sponsored the Japanese team. *After the Games, the IOC asked Japan to stop using the term "Olympic", and the Games were renamed "Second Far East Champion Games in Shanghai".* Both EF. (2 pcs.) **(\$1,200)**

119. **Inter-Allied Games 1919. U.S. Pilot's Badge.** Bronze, 53x51mm. Eagle at top of panel with inscription, between laurel and oak branches. With long red-white-blue ribbon and attached U.S. and gold propeller badge. EF. **(\$260)**
120. **Inter-Allied Games 1919. Technical Section Badge.** Bronze, 53x51mm. Eagle at top of panel with inscription between laurel and oak branches. With red ribbon inscribed "Technical/Section". EF. Plus **Dedication Day Brochure, June 22, 1919.** 8 sections, each 18.5x25cm (7.3"x9.8"), in English and French. Opening Day program, plus Tentative Program June 22 – July 6, 1919.
