GARMISCH-PARTENKIRCHEN, 4th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1936

- 175. Silver Participation Medal. Silvered bronze, 60mm, by M. Joerres. Alpine summit over Olympic rings within German legend. Rev. Olympic motto over fir branches. Presentation Medal for Officials and special guests. Scarce. Lightly toned, EF. (\$1,200)
- Participation Medal. Bronze, 60mm, by M. Joerres. Alpine summit over Olympic rings within German legend. Rev. Olympic motto over fir branches. Dark toning, EF. (\$700)
- Garmisch Kreuzeck Mountain Olympic Pin. Silvered, 32mm, enamelled in color. Wreath of fir encircling view of Kreuzeck mountain and shield, Olympic rings above. EF. (\$100)
  - Original Oil Painting of the Opening Ceremony of the Fourth Olympic Winter Games in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, 1936. Multicolor original painting, 120x160cm (47.2"x63"), in gilt wooden frame, by Ernst Vollbehr. The painting shows the Olympic Stadium on Opening Day, decorated with Olympic flags, the large official IOC flag on the judge's tower at left, and the flags of the participating nations; in front large red flags with swastikas. People are waiting to get into the stadium. In the foreground at right is the Eibsee-Zugspitze cog-wheel railway. In the background the impressive alpine mountain range with the Alpspitze, the official emblem of the 4th Winter Games, and the Zugspitze. Behind the stadium are the Riessersee Hills where speed skating and bobsled events took place. The painting is signed in the lower right "Ernst Vollbehr 36". Vollbehr was born on March 25, 1876, in Kiel, Germany. In 1909/10 he was a painter in the German colonies. In 1914 he was drafted as a war painter. During the war he met A. Hitler and became one of his admirers. Hitler personally commissioned him to paint this Garmisch-Partenkirchen Olympic Winter Games Painting. EF. (\$2,400)
- First Place Winner's Diploma Awarded for Men's Single Curling on February 10, 1936. 40x32cm (15.7"x12.6"). Artful writing, large eagle with Olympic rings in background. Signatures of Organizing Committee President von Halt and German Olympic Committee President von Tschammer. The event was won by Iguaz Reiterer, Austria. Tape around edges on back. Lt. browning, EF.
- Identity Card of Czech Ski Jumper Oldrich Budarek. 4 pages, 9x14cm (3.5"x5.5"). With photo. VF-EF. (\$150)
- Generalkarte for Tribune Standing Room for All Garmisch 181. 1936 Events: Ice Stadium, Bob and Ski Stadium. Light blue, 14.5x8.5cm (5.7"x3.4"), in dark blue leather wallet with gold Garmisch logo on front. EF. (\$200)
- Women's Compulsory Skating Ticket, February 11 and 12, 1936. 10.8x6.2cm (4.3"x2.4"). Sonja Henie won Compulsory Skating, and went on to win Women's Skating on February 15, 1936. VF-EF.
- Official Telegram with Cancelations of the Closing Day, **February 16, 1936.** 29.5x30cm (12.3"x11.8"). With 3 stamps, 12+6, 25+15 and 6+4, all with cancellations. EF. (\$100)
- Steel Die for an Olympic Souvenir Badge. The die is 60mm wide, 45mm high, design 30mm. It shows an Edelweiss flower over Olympic rings, "Talismann Garmisch-Partenkirchen" legend, surrounded by wreath of leaves. VF-EF. (\$140)









- Color Postcard of the IV Olympic Winter Games in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, 1936 with Autograph of Skating Gold Medal Winner Karl Schäfer, Austria. 10x14.7cm. With 6+4 Stamp and cancelation on February 6, 1936. Karl Schäfer won gold in Figure Skating on February 14. EF. (\$100)
- 185a. Autographed Postcard of the United States Olympic Speed **Skating Team.** 14x8.7cm (5.5"x3.4"). Each skater with signature in ink. 15 Pf. stamp cancelled on February 14, 1936, sent to St. Louis, Missouri, USA. EF. (\$100)

## **BERLIN, 11th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1936**

- Magnificent Large Soccer Crystal Trophy Awarded to Italy, the Winner of the Berlin 1936 Olympic Soccer Competition. Superbly hand-cut clear crystal, 27.5x13.5cm (10.8"x5.3"), on silver colored base, 15cm (5.9") wide. The trophy is expertly engraved "Olympia 1936 - Berlin / Italien Olympiasieger in Fussball". Translation: Olympia 1936 - Berlin / Italy Olympic Champion in Soccer / Berlin / Italien. An oval on the back side shows two soccer players' headball surrounded by "Ehren Preis - Italien 2:1 Ősterreich" Honorary Prize – Italy 2:1 Austria, translated. Below are the coat of arms of Italy, Austria (2nd), Norway (3rd) and Poland (4th), the first through fourth place winners. The final match on August 15 was Italy – Austria at 4pm in the Olympia Stadium. The game ended 1:1, but Italy, after 2 minutes in overtime, shot the 2nd goal and won 2:1. The trophy is in perfect condition. Unique. (\$5,000)
- Art Deco Sèvres Porcelain Vase Illustrating Olympic Athletic Events. 26.5cm (10.4"), made by famous Sèvres Manufacture Nationale, France, in 1935 for the Berlin 1936 Olympiad. Handpainted brown illustrations of Athletic events: running, pole vault, javelin etc., encircled by gold lines. "P.G. d'ap(rès) Goor" and Sèvres manufacture information at bottom. The factory had been founded in Vincennes in 1740, and moved in 1756 to Sèvres becoming the leading porcelain manufactory in Europe until the French Revolution. In 1800 Alexander Bromgniart, the new administrator, introduced successfully the Neoclassical style. The Art Noveau and Art Deco Period followed from the 1890's on. Very rare. EF. (\$8,000)

- **Official Torch.** Steel, 27cm high (10.5"), made by Krupp Factory, designed by Carl Diem. Route of torch run from Olympia to Berlin on shaft, legend on top. Carried during the first Olympic torch relay from Olympia, Greece to Berlin, a distance of 3,307 km in 12 days. EF. (\$5,000)
- XI Olympiade Berlin 1936 Porcelain Plaque in its Presentation Case. 19.5x16.5cm (7.7"x6.5"), made by Jeweler Erich Kromat, Berlin. Torchbearer with Flaming torch over large Olympic Bell, Brandenburg Gate in background, legend below: "Olympic Games - 1936" (translated). Housed in its presentation case lined in blue velvet and silk. Present for a high official. Rare. EF. (\$400)
- 190. First Olympic Torch Relay to Berlin 1936 Plaque. High relief, bronze, 18cm (7.1"), signed "K.K.". Runner to left in Greek landscape holding flaming torch. VF-EF. (\$200)
