- 280. Participation Medal. Cast bronze, 55mm, by Emilio Greco. Nude female torchbearer 1. superimposed over Olympic rings. Rev. Flight of eagles soaring over stadium in Rome. EF. (\$260)
- Unique Rome Triple Gold Medal Winner Wilma Rudolph Plaster Model Made by a Porcelain Designer of the Famous German Rosenthal Porcelain Manufactory, in 1961. Head 30cm (11.8") high, light yellow-brown color, on wooden display, 16x16x6.5cm (6.3"x6.3"x2.6"). Wilma Rudolph sat as model for this sculpture in 1961 in Stuttgart. This plaster model was a preliminary work for a porcelain bust or bronze cast, but these were never made. Wilma, named also "The Black Gazelle", won 3rd place in 4x100m relay in Melbourne at the age of 16. In Rome she won gold in 100m, 200m and 4x100m relay. Unique bust of a famous female Olympian. Light handling, about EF. (\$2,000)
- 282. Italian Olympic Committee Presentation Sculpture of the Rome **She-Wolf.** Bronze atop a marble base, 11x6cm (4.3"x2.4"). Total height with she-wolf 14cm (5.5"), 13cm (5.1") wide. She-wolf with twins Romulus and Remus, founders of Rome. Plaque with "C.O.N.I." - Italian Olympic Committee. EF. (\$200)

- Rising Sun of the national flag is surrounded on three sides by the five Olympic colors, Olympic rings dividing "TOKYO-1964". A blank gold bar represents the Imperial Family's badge. With long white moiree ribbon. Elbel S-2. Housed in its case. In case. Badge EF. (\$30,000)
- 288. Fencing Official's Badge. Goldplated, 37x60mm "Official" on blue bar, with purple ribbon. Elbel S-76. EF. (\$300)
- Fencing Team Official's Badge. Gilt, 37x60mm. "Team Official" 289. on lilac bar, and dark purple ribbon. Elbel S-97. EF. (\$220)
- International Pentathlon Sports Federation Badge. Gilt, 37x60mm. "I.S.F. Jury" on yellow bar. With brown ribbon and 4 white stripes. Elbel S-38. Housed in its presentation case. EF. (\$2,200)
