



307. **Mexico 50 Pesos 1947 Pure Gold Coin in Bezel with Chain.** 37.5 grams. Victory over mountains, "1821-1947" Rev. Eagle. VF-EF. In decorative bezel, with 18 Karat gold chain. Total gold weight about 56.25 grams. **(\$3,000)**
308. **Mexican Olympic Equestrian Participant Riding his Horse.** Multicolor, 23.5cm (9.3") high. Rider to the left, can be moved to show riding movement. EF. **(\$100)**
309. **Mexican Performing Olympic Gymnast.** White plastic, 6.5x22cm (2.6"x8.7"). Gymnast shows off his skills at top when the bottom of plastic is squeezed. Scarce. EF. **(\$100)**
310. **Mexican Olympic Fencer Figurine.** Multicolor ceramic, 16cm (6.3") high, base 9x6cm (3.5"x2.4"). Olympic fencer charging, on orange and white base with fencing logo and "Mexico 68" around sides. EF. **(\$120)**

The bowl and the tube display the Sapporo Olympic emblem. Lt. wear to bowl, tube discolored from flame. VF-EF. **(\$28,000)**
315. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm, by S. Fukuda. Sapporo Olympic emblem. Rev. Two large arrows attached to stylized athlete. EF, in original clear plastic case. **(\$240)**
316. **Training Suit of Gold Medal Winner Ivan Bjakow, Russia, in Biathlon Men's Relay.** Size 48, blue polyamid and cotton, made by Odlos of Norway. Jacket shows large Soviet team patch, large "CCCP" in white attached on back. With 9x18cm (3.5"x7.1") color photo of Bjakow wearing the training suit. EF. **(\$300)**

MUNICH, 20th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1972

- 318. **Official Torch of the Munich 1972 Olympic Games.** Steel, 73cm (28.8”), made by Krupp. The fire was lit in Olympia, Greece on July 28 and carried 5,532km in 29 days to Munich by 5976 runners. Dark color around top from burning torch, otherwise EF. **(\$2,000)**
- 319. **Miss-struck Bronze Winners Medal.** Bronze, 74mm, struck by the Bavarian Mint. Seated Victory, “Olympiade München 1972” at right over Coliseum. Rev. The patrons of competitive sport and friendship: Castor and Pollux. Fine. **(\$600)**
- 320. **Participation Medal.** Steel, 49mm, by F. König. Munich Olympic emblem over German legend in two lines. Rev. Olympic rings over two hands, one holding stylized olive branch. EF, in acrylic presentation case. **(\$260)**
- 321. **Commemorative Medal of Pietri Dorando, London 1908 Marathon Runner, 1972.** Bronze, 45mm, by G. Merighi. Bust of Dorando. Rev. Dorando being helped in the end of the Marathon. *Dorando was helped in the end to the finish line. He was disqualified for that reason, and Johnny Hayes was declared the winner of the 1908 Marathon.* EF. **(\$70)**
- 322. **Lasse Viren, Finnish Double Gold Medalist in Munich 1972 and Montreal 1976, Commemorative Medal.** Sterling silver, 72 grams, 50mm, by Tillander. Viren running, his profile on right. Rev. Stadium tracks with Munich 1972 and Montreal 1976 legend of his victories. *Viren won 5000m and 10000m in Munich 1972 and again in Montreal 1976. He fell in Munich during the run, but he got up and, even after being 50m behind the first runner, won the event.* EF. **(\$100)**

- 323. **XXth Olympiad in Munich 1972 Silver Bar.** Sterling silver, 45x22mm, 60.1 grams (abt. 2 oz), by Intercoins. Quadriga between ancient Greek temple and Munich skyline, Olympic rings below. Proof, FDC. **(\$50)**
- 324. **Official Medal on Chain Worn by the IOC.** Goldplated, 51mm. Raised Olympic rings over olive and laurel branches, name of IOC around outer edge. Rev. Olympic motto “Citus-Altius-Fortius” above olive and laurel branches. Only members of the IOC wore this medal. With golden braided chain. EF. **(\$260)**
- 325. **Musical Munich 1972 Olympic Beer Stein.** Multicolor ceramic, 25cm (9.8”), with Swiss musical movement playing “The Blue Danube” waltz. View of Olympic city with Olympic rings, sides “Happy with beer - that’s what we love” (translated). Pewter top. EF. **(\$150)**
- 326. **Attractive Munich 1972 Olympic City Porcelain Beer Stein.** Multicolor, 16cm (6.3”), Kaiser porcelain. View of Frauenkirche over Olympic rings and “Olympiastadt München”, and city view with Theatiner Church and City Hall. With pewter lid. EF. **(\$150)**

327. **Pair of Commemorative Munich 1972 Beer Steins.** Gray ceramic with blue logo, "München 1972" and Olympic rings on top. 16.5cm (6.5"). EF. And Blue Ceramic, 12.5cm (4.9"). Munich child over Olympic rings and "Olympiade 1972 München", Hofbräuhaus and Franeu Church towers on sides. Tiny chip on top, o.w. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$100)
328. **Colorful Munich Landmarks Ceramic Plate.** 25.1cm (9.9"), by Merz. Munich child between rings and "Olympiade München 1972", surrounded by 4 views of Munich landmarks. EF. (\$120)
329. **Munich 1972 Small Size Torch Made as a Lighter.** Steel, 31cm (12.2"), made by Krupp. EF. (\$140)

331. **Japanese Report on the Munich 1972 Olympic Games.** Tokyo, 1972. 204pp. profusely illustrated with color plates, 21.5x27.6cm (8.5"x10.9"), in Japanese. All events, program, venues, photographs, review of all Games since 1896, all posters since 1912 etc. Disk in back. Hardbound, EF. (\$100)

INNSBRUCK, 12th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1976

332. **Participation Medal.** Silvered AE, 50mm, by W. Pichl. Innsbruck Olympic emblem on ice crystals within German legend. Rev. Bergisel ski jump, panorama of Innsbruck and Austrian Alps in background. Toned EF, corrosion on rev. as usual. (\$200)

- MONTREAL, 21st OLYMPIC GAMES, 1976**
334. **Official Torch of the Montreal 1976 Olympic Games.** Aluminum, 66cm (30") tall, designed by George Huel and Michael Dall. Red, with Montreal logo, top painted black. *The flame was carried from Olympia, Greece to Athens from where it was transferred by satellite to Ottawa; 245 runners carried it to Montreal.* EF. (\$3,500)
335. **Team Official's Badge.** Cupro-nickel, 29x57mm. Elbel S-17. **ORTO Radio Badge.** Silvered, 29x50mm. Toned EF. (2 pcs.) (\$140)
336. **Official Ceremonial Olympic Games Sword of Honor.** Steel, 113cm (44.5") long, handcrafted by Wilkinson Sword, England. Steel blade decorated with ornate scroll inscribed "XXIst OLYMPIAD MONTREAL MCMLXXVI". Goldplated cross-guard with enameled Montreal city shield, rosewood handle, and goldplated maple leaf-shape top with engraved Olympic rings. *For presentation to high dignitaries.* EF. Beautiful and outstanding workmanship. (\$800)
337. **Light Blue and White Commemorative Wedgwood Plate of the Montreal 1976 Olympic Games.** 20.5cm (8.1"). Montreal coat of arms surrounded by legend and 9 different sports depictions, in wreath of maple leaves. EF. (\$100)
338. **Large Plush Mascot Amik of the Montreal 1976 Olympic Games.** Black, 47cm (18.5") long. Amik is wearing a red sash with the logo of the Montreal Games. Rare. EF. (\$500)
