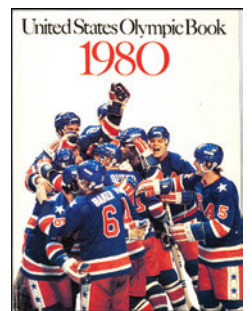

339. **Participation Medal.** Nickel-silver, 76mm, by M. Jovine. Modern relief views of nine winter sports. Rev. Lake Placid Olympic emblem surrounded by the words of the Olympic oath in four concentric circles. EF. (\$220)
340. **Medallic Art Gold Calendar Medal, 1980.** Goldplated, 75mm, by Marcel Jovine. View of 8 winter sports with center Lake Placid 1980 Olympic logo. Rev. 1980 calendar. Unc., in original case with illustrated brochure. **Winner's Medal of the 1979 Lake Placid World Double Luge Test.** Gilt, 50mm. Lake Placid logo. Rev. 2-line legend. With tricolor ribbon. Both EF. (2 pcs.) (\$120)
341. **Mascot Roni the Racoon.** Multicolor plush, 28.5cm (14.6"). EF. (\$100)

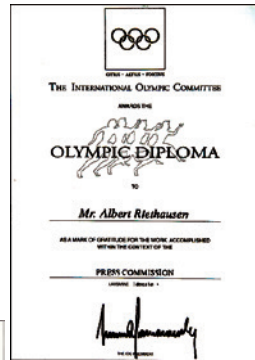

348. **First Soccer Gold Cup Championship Medal with all Previously Winning World Cup Teams, 1980.** Gold, 21.9 grams, 18 karat, 34mm. Logo of Winner's Cup with soccer ball at top. Rev. Football. Gold Cup played in Montevideo, Uruguay with previous winners from Germany, Argentina, Brazil, Holland, Italy and Uruguay (1930). Proof, Unc. (\$800)
349. **Official Torch of the Moscow 1980 Olympic Games.** Aluminum alloy, gray and gold, Moscow logo and legend in red, 56cm (22.5"), designed by Boris Tuchin. *Runners carried the torch during the 30-day torch relay from Olympia, Greece through Bulgaria and Romania to Moscow, a distance of 4976 km.* EF. (\$2,000)

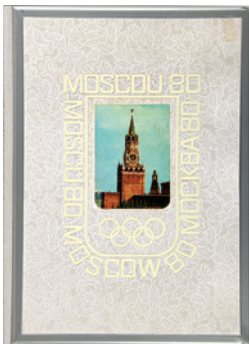

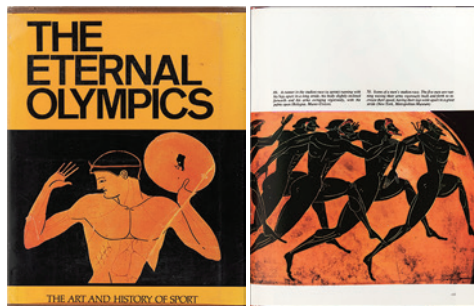

350. **United States Olympic Team for Moscow 1980 Commemorative Medal.** Goldplated bronze, 75mm, by Tiffany & Co. Flaming torch between rings and “1980”, United States Olympic Team” above. Rev. Five doves flying towards “Games of the XXII Olympiad”. With fob and tricolor ribbon in American colors. *This medal, styled like a winner’s medal, was presented to American 1980 Moscow team members by the United States Olympic Committee after President Carter decided to boycott the Moscow Olympic Games in protest of the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan.* Housed in its blue leatherette case lined in dark blue velvet, wear on top. Medal EF. Rarely seen. **(\$900)**
351. **Group of 8 Different Misha Sport Figures.** Brown and red rubber, 8cm to 9.5cm (3.1” to 3.7”) each. Nice group. All EF. (8 pcs.) **(\$90)**
352. **Olympic Diploma Awarded to a Member of the IOC Press Commission, 1982.** 21x29.7cm (8.3”x11.7”). Gold Olympic rings at top, Samaranch signature at bottom. Lt. corner creases. Plus his **Identity Card for Lake Placid 1980**, Athletics World Championship in **Helsinki 1983**, and 86th IOC Session in **New Delhi 1983**. All EF. (4 pcs.) **(\$140)**
353. **Group of 4 Opening Ceremony Tickets from Barcelona 1992, Athens 2004, Beijing 2008 and London 2012, Plus Closing Ceremony Tickets from Moscow 1980 and Barcelona 1992.** From 17.5cm to 22cm (6.9”x8.7”). All EF. (6 pcs.) **(\$160)**

354. **Bid Book Moscow 1980.** Moscow Answers IOC Questionnaire. 140 pages with numerous color photo pages, 25x34.5cm (8.9”x13.6”), in French, English, Spanish and Cyrillic. EF. **(\$150)**

357. **Bronze Winner’s Medal in Presentation Case and Paper Box.** Bronze, 65x71mm, struck by Majdanpek/Zin Mint. Laureated athlete’s head r. Rev. Logo encircled by Croatia legend. With orange ribbon, housed in blue leather case lined in velvet and silk, and blue cardboard box (very rare). EF. **(\$5,500)**

- 358. **Official Torch of the Sarajevo 1984 Olympic Winter Games.** Stainless steel cylinder, bowl gold colored with "Sarajevo 84" legend. Length 57.5cm (22.6"), weight 680 grams. Manufactured by Nippon K. under the supervision of Mizuno Corp. Steel cylinder darkened from flame, torch holder EF. **(\$4,000)**
- 359. **Very Large Presentation Participation Medal.** Golden bronze, 9.5x9.5x10.5cm (3.7"x4.1"), designed by Nebojsa Mitric, made by Majdanpek/Zin, Yugoslavia. Stylized Sarajevo 84 legend, small Sarajevo logo below. Only presented to a very small number of very high dignitaries. Housed in its large leather case. EF. **(\$1,900)**

LOS ANGELES, 23rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1984

- 360. **Gold Winner's Medal Presented to an IOC Member.** Goldplated silver, 60mm, designed by Dugald Stermer, made by Jostens. Victory holding palm branch and wreath, Colosseum stadium in background. Rev. Victorious athlete being carried by jubilant team members. With tricolor ribbon. *The design was an adaptation of the original design by Guiseppa Cassioli.* EF. **(\$7,000)**

- 361. **Official Torch of the Los Angeles 1984 Olympic Games.** Brass-finished aluminum with tan leather handle, 56.5cm (22.4"). Bowl portrays Olympic rings, motto and L.A. Memorial Coliseum Stadium. *The flame was lit in Olympia, Greece on May 7, 1984, and it arrived in New York the following day. It took 82 days to carry the flame through 33 states, 9,375 miles, to Los Angeles.* EF, in original black leather pouch. **(\$2,400)**
- 362. **Model of the Los Angeles 1984 Torch, Made in 1983.** Polished steel with brown leather handle, 50cm (19.7") tall, made by Turner Ind., Inc., Irwindale, California. Design and writing in color. Attached to a square clear plastic base, 18.5x18.5cm (7.3"x7.3"), 5.5cm (2.2") high. Possibly unique. Abt. EF. **(\$2,000)**
- 363. **Participation Medal in Presentation Case.** Bronze, 60mm, by D. Sterner. Olympic torch head within legend. Rev. Los Angeles Olympic emblem over Olympic rings and laurel branches. Housed in blue velvet case with cardboard box. EF. **(\$220)**
- 364. **Gold Medal Winner's Pin Awarded by the IOC.** Silvered, rings goldplated, 13x15mm. Numbered, in black plastic wallet. EF. **(\$100)**
- 365. **Official Torch Bearer Medal.** Bronze, 76mm. Flaming Los Angeles torch in high relief. Rev. Torch runner to right. Toned EF. **(\$140)**
- 366. **Trio of 88th IOC Session in Los Angeles 1984 Badges: NOC (green), Press (yellow), and Media (yellow with center black stripe).** All EF. (3 pcs.) **(\$100)**

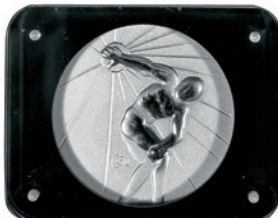

367. **Cased LA 84 Appreciation Medal, and 39 Olympic Pins.** Pins include 13 NOC pins from Kenya, Stars in Motion and various Sam the Eagle pins. All EF. (40 pcs.) **(\$100)**
368. **The Salvador Dali Olympic Collection of 11 Large Sport Silver Medals on the Occasion of the XXIII Olympiad Los Angeles 1984.** Silver "999", 45mm, 46.2 grams each. Archer, soccer player, discus thrower, boxers, equestrian, gymnast, etc. Rev. Official emblem of the U.S Olympic Committee. EF, lt. cabinet friction. Each medal in clear plastic holder, housed in black leather case, 40x30cm (15.8"x11.8"). Rare set. **(\$900)**

369. **Commemorative 1984 U.S. Olympic Eagle Sculpture Spreading His Wings.** Bronze, 21cm (8.3") high, 29cm (11.4") wide. Eagle with spread wings ready to fly and start the Olympic Games, standing on rock inscribed with the U.S. Olympic seal. EF. Rare. **(\$300)**
370. **Group of Four British Colorful Los Angeles 1984 Porcelain Plates.** All 25.5cm (10"), made by Royal Tudor in England. Featured are Equestrian, Gymnastics, Track & Field and Winners Ceremony. British shield and 4 flaming cauldrons around the edges. Seldom seen group. All EF. (4 pcs.) **(\$200)**
372. **Ancient Greek-Style Amphora Featuring Olympic Athletes.** Black and orange ceramic, 18.5 (7.3") high. Depiction of 8 ancient Greece Olympic sports; awarded by Allstate Life Olympics. EF. **(\$120)**
