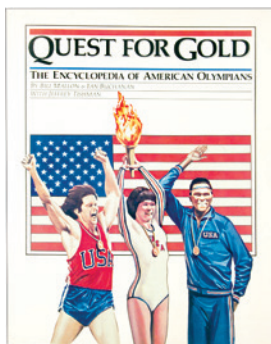




373. **Commemorative Colorful Events Beer Stein with Pewter Top.** Gray and dark blue ceramic, 16.4cm (6.5") high, designed by Craig Calsbeek, made by Thewalt, W. Germany. Four colorful images of athletics, water sports, gymnastics and ball games (soccer, basketball, baseball, etc.) Numbered. EF. (\$100)
374. **Colorful Figure of a Golf Player.** Red and blue painted bronze, 30.5cm (12") high, base black. Player ready to start playing with his golf club. Color missing in a few spots, VF+. (\$200)
375. **Discus Thrower Bob Mathias Olympic Commemorative Sculpture.** Bonded pewter, base 15.5x13.5cm (6.1"x5.3"), 22cm (8.7") high, by Marcel Jovine. "Olympian (Bob Mathias) at the end of his throw, straining to unwind and release the discus" (from a sculpture brochure). EF. (\$120)
376. **Equestrian Clearing the Jump Olympic Commemorative Sculpture.** Bonded bronze, 22.5cm (8.9") high, base 15.5x13.5cm (6.1"x5.3"), by Marcel Jovine. "Horse and rider work as one to clear the jump". (Sculptures brochure). EF. (\$120)
377. **Gymnast on Balance Beam Olympic Commemorative Sculpture.** Bonded pewter, 27cm (10.6") high, 13.5x15.5cm (5.3"x6.1"), by Marcel Jovine. "Woman gymnast is the essence of grace and concentration as she performs on the balance beam" (Sculptures Brochure). EF. (\$120)
378. **Runner Olympic Commemorative Sculpture Breaking the Tape at the Finish Line.** Bonded pewter, 27cm (10.6") tall, by Marcel Jovine. Victorious runner is breaking the tape at the finish line. EF. (\$120)

379. **Pair of Torch Carriers Olympic Commemorative Sculpture.** Bonded bronze, 25.4cm (10") high, by Marcel Jovine. "Figures of a man and woman running in tandem, carrying the enduring symbol of the Games, the Olympic Flame" (Sculptures brochure). In original box. EF. (\$120)
380. **Yachting Olympic Commemorative Sculpture.** Bonded bronze, 17cm (6.7") high, base 13.5x15.5cm (5.3"x6.1"), by Marcel Jovine. Sailor "hikes out" over the edge of his boat as he streaks to the finish line. (Sculptures brochure). EF. (\$120)
381. **Pair of Famous Hungarian Fencing Coach Rudolf Karpati Identity Cards from Los Angeles 1984.** Both 8.5x13cm (3.4"x5.1"), both with photo. Karpati won six gold medals in sabre in 4 Olympiads 1948-1960. Plus Albertville 1992 ID card for IOC Member Vladimir Cernusak, founding president of the Slovak NOC 1992-1999. All 3 IDs are 8.5x13cm (3.4"x5.1"), all with photo. All EF. (3 pcs.) (\$200)
382. **Autograph Booklet with 40 Track & Field Star Signatures Including Some Olympians.** Black booklet, 7x10.5cm (2.8"x4.1") with 21 pages. EF. (\$100)

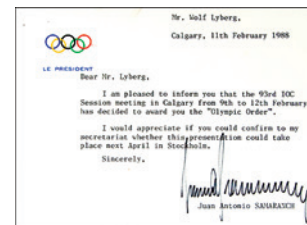

384. (Autographs) Mallon, Bill and Buchanan, Jan. **Quest for Gold. The Encyclopedia of American Olympians.** New York, 1984. 496pp., illustrated, 21.5x28cm (8.5"x11"). Biographies of all American Olympians. 59 autographs throughout the book of which 44 are of medal winners. Paperback, covers creased, contents EF. (\$120)

385. **Pair of Two Bound Volumes of Monthly IOC Olympic Review from Number 219, January 1986 through No. 242, December 1987.** 19.5x26cm (7.7"x10.2"). Very interesting articles! Bound in blue linen, abt. EF. (2 volumes) (\$150)

**CALGARY, 15th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1988**

386. **Official Torch of the Calgary 1988 Winter Olympic Games.** 60cm (23.6"). Maplewood handle with pictograms of 10 Olympic winter sports, steel torch bowl at top resembling the Calgary Tower, with Calgary Olympic legend in English and French. *The flame was flown from Athens, Greece, to St. John, Newfoundland. In 88 days, it was carried about 18,000 km across Canada by 6,520 torchbearers sharing torches. Only about 100 torches were made.* EF. (\$22,000)

386a. **The Olympic Order in Silver Presented by President Samaranch at the 93rd IOC Session in Calgary, February 9 to 12, 1988.** Silver, 22.5x32.8cm (8.9"x12.9"), designed by Otl Aicher. Five rings in the center are flanked by olive leaves leading into a chain. Since 1975, the Olympic Order represents the highest award of the IOC. Included with the Order, housed in its red leather and red velvet case (scuffed on top), is the Samaranch signed notification card of the award which was presented in April 1988 in Stockholm; a note from Sports Calgary on Feb. 7 that the IOC Board agreed to award the Olympic Order to S. Lyberg, Secretary General of the Swedish Olympic Committee, Lyberg's Thank you Draft for the acceptance, and the Menu of the Award Dinner at the Grand Hotel in Stockholm. All EF. (5 pcs.) (\$4,500)

387. **(Bid Book) Calgary Canada Bidding for the 1988 Winter Games.** 136pp., illustrated in color, text in English and French. **Calgary won the 1988 Winter Games.** Padded leatherette covers, EF. (\$100)

**SEOUL, 24th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1988**

388. **Official Torch of the Seoul 1988 Olympic Games.** Brass, 50cm (20"), with tan leather handle, designed by Lee Woo-Sing. Bowl depicts dragons, Seoul Olympic logo enameled in color below. EF. (\$4,000)

389. **Large Bronze Bell in Elaborate Wooden Display "In Commemoration of Games of the XXIVth Olympiad Seoul 1988.** The wooden display is 32x26.5cm (12.6"x10.4"), and 36cm (14.2") high. The bell has a beautiful sound when touched by a bronze piece hung from the top. The bell shows the Stadium flanked by the Seoul logo and mascot Hodori, on the reverse is a view of the Korean island with dancers in front of a temple. Text of Seoul Olympiad around top, athletes illustrating Olympic events around bottom. Very unusual and beautiful souvenir of the Seoul 1988 Olympic Games. (\$600)

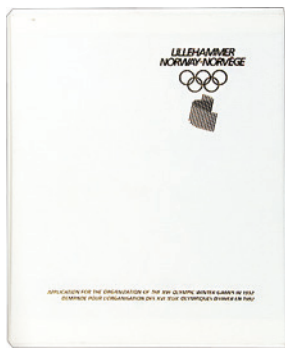

390. **Large Display of Olympic Replica Summer Participation Medals from London 1908 to Seoul 1988.** Housed in a large display case with glass on top, 66x50.5cm (26"x20"). Medals are 40mm each. A gilt plaque in the center has the title "Official Silver Medal Oly Games 1908-1988". No 1988 Medal is included as the display was made before the Games. EF. (\$500)
- 390a. **1988 Olympic Summer Games Limited Edition Beer Stein with Pewter Lid.** Multicolor ceramic, 19.5cm (7.7") high, made by Gerz for Anheuser-Busch. Colorful scenes of all sports competitions in Seoul, flags of participating nations around bottom, Seoul logo on lid at top. Numbered, boxed. EF. (\$100)
391. **Pair of Two Bound Volumes of the Monthly IOC Olympic Review from Nr. 243-244, January 1988 Through Nr. 266, December 1989.** 19.5x26cm (7.7"x10.2"). Very interesting articles. Blue linen, first volume broken spines, second volume EF. (2 pcs.) (\$150)
392. **95th IOC Session in Puerto Rico, 1989. Large Presentation Medal for a Named IOC Member.** Silverplated bronze, 90mm (3.5"), 10mm thick, weight 532 grams. Raised coat of arms surrounded by IOC session legend. Rev. Olympic rings above French legend, name of member below. Housed in its wooden presentation case, blue spots on top. Medal EF. (\$180)

393. **5th Athletic World Cup Medal in Barcelona, 1989.** Bronze, 65mm. 5 color stripes in center are surrounded by legend. Rev. View of Olympic Stadium on Montjuïc. EF. (\$80)
394. **Asian Games 1990 - Set of 30 Sports Pins and Plaque.** Case is 23.5x14.5cm (9.3"x5.7"). Pins are 18mm. All 30 sports are represented. Housed in green fabric covered case. EF. (\$100)

- ALBERTVILLE, 16th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1992**
395. **Official Torch of the Albertville 1992 Winter Olympic Games in France.** Steel, 42cm (16.5"), up to 8cm (3.2") wide, designed by famous French designer Philippe Starck. The torch, when turned over, has the shape of a flame. *The flame was lit in Olympia on November 27, 1991, when the relay through Greece started. It left Greece on December 8 on the Concorde to visit about 70 countries and islands worldwide, to arrive in Paris on December 14. 5,500 torchbearers carried the flame 5,536 km (3,440 miles) around France to Albertville where the cauldron was lit at the opening ceremony on February 8, 1992, by Michel Platini and Francoise-Cyrille Grange, a Savoyard girl. One of only 130 torches. Numbered. EF. (\$65,000)*
396. **Large Masonic Commemorative Medal.** Bronze, 11.3cm (4.5"), 557 grams. Standing French Republic in high relief. Rev. Symbol over mountains, Winter Olympic Games legend and "5992" date on edge. EF. (\$150)

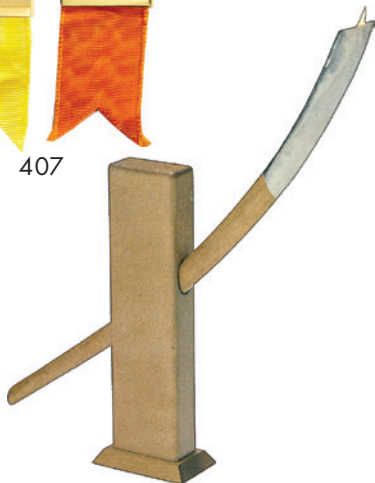

397. **Bid Book Lillehammer 1992 – Candidate to Host the 1992 Olympic Winter Games.** Presented to the IOC in 1986. Three volumes in white leatherette, illustrated throughout, text in English and French. EF. (\$150)

**BARCELONA, 25th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1992**

398. **Official Torch of the Barcelona 1992 Olympic Games.** Chrome-plated aluminum, 65cm (23.6”), designed by André Rich. “XXV Olympiad Barcelona 1992” legend and goldplated Barcelona emblem. Only light rubbing on leather, EF. (\$3,750)

399. **Silver Medal, Part of the Barcelona 1992 Silver Winner’s Medal.** 55mm uniface. Seated Victory at left, XXVth Olympic Games legend and Olympic rings at right. This medal would be attached on the obverse of the primary medal. Trial strike by the Madrid Mint. Ex: Madrid Mint Auction, December 2017 Prooflike Unc. (\$300)

400. **Participation Medal.** Burnished copper, 70mm, by X. Corbero. Spanish legend in four lines over Barcelona Olympic emblem, a stylized jumping athlete. Rev. Spiral and elongated bolt of lightning. Trial strike by the Madrid Mint. Ex: Madrid Mint Auction, December 2017. EF, in original pouch. (\$100)

401. **Paralympic Participation Medal.** Silvered copper, 70mm, by Xavier Corbero. Paralympic logo. Rev. “Paralympics Barcelona ‘92” and the same in Braille. Trial strike by the Madrid Mint. Ex: Madrid Mint Auction, December 2017. Holed at top for ribbon. EF. (\$100)

402. **Gold 20000 Pesetas, 1992, Montjuic Stadium, Barcelona Olympics.** 6.75 grams, .999 gold, 23mm, reeded edge, medal alignment. King Juan Carlos (1975-2014). Rev. Montjuic Stadium. In wooden box. Proof, Unc. (\$400)

404. **Barcelona 1992 – Set of All 23 Explanatory Sport Booklets.** Each 10.5x21cm (4.1”x8.3”), in French and English. Information about each sport. All EF. (23 pcs.) (\$100)
